ROK edge China

SEOUL, Oct 3: South Korea beat China 1-0 in an Asia Group B qualifying soccer match for the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games in Seoul Sunday, reports

The goal came 18 minutes into the second half when a header from Sin Byung-Ho fell on the goal line after hitting the upper post. Malaysian referee Abdullah

Mohamed Nazri declared the goal valid. But some angry Chinese fans staged noisy protests at the end of the match, hurling plastic bottles and garbage.
For the last 10 minutes

South Korean midfielder Nam Ki-Sung remained on the sidelines with apparently serious leg injuries.

South Korea will play Bahrain on October 17 and China again on October 29 in Shanghai.

CSKA fans fight with police

RAMENSKOYE, Russia, Oct 3: CSKA Moscow supporters clashed with police here Saturday during a league match against local side Saturn which CSKA won 3-2, ITAR-TASS news agency reported, reports

The trouble started during the interval when several hundred CSKA fans attacked local police officers. Security forces intervened and detained almost two dozen fans.

Ten people, including one police officer, needed medical treatment after the clash.

Tergat on target

PALERMO, Sicily, Oct 3: Kenya's Paul Tergat won the half-marathon World Championship today despite being obstructed by a race steward 100 metres from the line, reports Reuters.

Tergat, five times world cross-country champion, rounded a tight final bend in first place narrowly ahead of Hendrick Ramaala of South Africa.

The official tried to direct the pair towards the finish line but succeeded only in blocking Tergat, who grabbed him round the neck with both hands and pushed him out of the way.

Ramaala took advantage of the situation to steal the lead and looked poised to claim victory before Tergat produced a burst of speed over the final sprint to win by a stride.

Both finished with the same time of one hour one minute 50 seconds, well outside Tergat's world best of 59 minutes 17 seconds set in Milan last year.

Ethiopia's Tesfaye Jifar was third, just one second off the pace, and another five runners finished the thrilling contest ning time.

Asian crisis averted: Blatter

LAS VEGAS, Nevada, Oct 3: FIFA has made headway on the mammoth task of harmonising the international football calendar, starting with qualifying for the 2002 World Cup, reports

FIFA General Secretary Michel Zen-Ruffinen said Saturday that his meetings with the general secretaries of various regional confederations of football associations had produced a "huge advance" on the chaotic qualifying schedule for the 1998 world Cup in France.

Prior to the 1998 tournament, the jam-packed club and international calendar led to immense difficulties in the release of club players for national duty.

Zen-Ruffinen, speaking at a press conference at the conclusion of a FIFA Executive Committee meeting here, said that FIFA's proposal to take the dates put forward by UEFA, the European governing body, and ask other regions to match them, had so far been greeted positively.

He said he was still awaiting confirmation from Asia and Oceania. Otherwise, "all the confederations have confirmed to FIFA that they will respect the dates fixed.

"It's a huge advance," he said. "Because the national team players must be released five days in advance of a World Cup

qualifying match." Zen-Ruffinen said Europe's plans were chosen as a starting point because of its very crowded schedule.

The integrating of the World Cup qualifying dates around the world is only a step in FIFA's ambitious plan to eventually harmonise the entire global calendar.

"From 2004, we will hopefully have a calendar involving not only the FIFA World Cup. but also the competitions of various confederations," Zen-Ruffinen said.

FIFA president Sepp Blatter

tually the calendar would include a month-long break everywhere in the world, to give players a rest. He admitted that FIFA's new World Cup championship, to be conducted for the first time in Brazil next January, could be seen as a step

in the wrong direction. "We'll

carry it out and see what hap-

pens," Blatter said, adding that the relatively small number of teams involved — eight — made it viable in his opinion. Blatter also declared his musings on the possibility of a World Cup every other two years

temporarily closed.

He said rationalization of the calendar would be needed first, and after that he planned to return to the issue.

"The idea of the World Cup every two years has provoked the discussion on the international calendar," he said. "For the time being, I have

put the idea in the safe, and I have lost the code. I'll take it out again after 2004," Blatter said. "Asian football officials will settle for four berths in the 2002 World Cup and a playoff with

Europe for a chance at another." he added.


Other issues agreed upon at the meeting included the dates of the 2002 World Cup co-hosted by Japan and South Korea, which will be June 1-30.

The qualifying draw will be held December 7 in Tokyo, coinciding with another Executive Committee meeting there.

"Everything is back to normal," Switzerland's Blatter said. 'There has been no change to the World Cup slots, except that Asia is very happy to accept the half slot offered by Europe. "Óceania, as already decided,

has a playoff with CONMEBOL (the South American region)." While Blatter was firm in his conviction that the crisis was over, he admitted that not everyone involved was completely

satisfied with the outcome. "We have peace in the football family," said Blatter, who since July has met with Asian representatives individually to resolve the issue. "Some people may not be entirely satisfied. You cannot have all happy."

Death of Flo-Jo Griffith sues son-in-law

MISSION VIEJO, California, Oct 3: The mother of the late Florence Griffith Joyner is suing her former son-in-law in connection with the death of the former Olympic sprint

champion, reports AFP. Florence Griffith has filed a wrongful death lawsuit against Al Joyner in Orange County Superior Court, claiming "harmful or offensive touching" caused the death of her daughter.

The suit, filed September 21, also claims Joyner did not "exercise reasonable care to avoid foreseeable risk of harm" to his wife.

Griffith Joyner known as "Flo Jo" to fans around the world, died in her home here in September of last year at age 38. A coroner's report said Griffith Joyner suffered an epileptic seizure in her sleep and suffocated. An autopsy found no sings of foul play.

'Queens' rule final day

OSAKA, Japan, Oct 3: Alina Kabaeva and Elena Vitrichenko, new and former queens of the sport, shared four individual apparatus gold medals on the final day of the World Rhythmic Gymnastic Championships on Sunday, reports AFP.

Vitrichenko, 22, from Ukraine who won four individual gold medals in the 1997 Championships, tried to fight back tears at the ceremony Saturday when she finished fifth to lose the all-around title to Kabaeva.

But Vitrichenko, the winner of the ball and ribbon in the European Championships in May, in elegant and immaculate performances, received perfect 10s to win the rope and hoop beating Kabaeva into sec-

Kabaeva, 16, from Russia, scored 9.966 points in the rope and 9.975 in the hoop, while her compatriot Youlia Barsoukova and Eugenia Pavlina of Belarus took the bronzes respectively.

Kabaeva, also winner in the team competition, took the last two individual events in the ball and ribbon for her third and fourth gold of the Championships. After scoring consecutive

10s in the ball, Kabaeva failed to repeat it, but collected the highest 9.966 points to beat fellow Russian Yulia Raskina and Tamara Yerofeeva of Ukraine. Vitrichenko made one big error failing to catch the ball and received only 9.766 points

to settle at the bottom of the eight-women finals. Kabaeva then played her signature acrobatic perfor-mance to mark 10, her sixth perfect score of the week, to win the ribbon, beating Raskina, who had 9.958 points, and

Vitrichenko, 9.933. Greece, who narrowly missed the group exercises all around title to Russia Saturday, posted their first titles in the Championships to emerge as one of the top favourites in the Sydney Olympic Games next

They scored 19.816 points in the clubs and 19.833 points in the rope for their first two gold medals, beating pre-Championship favourites Russia and Belarus, who received one silver and one bronze each.

Greg, Tommy to fight it out




MUNICH, Oct 3: Greg Rusedski earned what promises to be his richest pay-day in tennis with a 6-3,



that's not the motivator. "I don't come for the money." said the world number six. "Most guys here have reasonable bank accounts. It's nice to get the paycheque, but we're out there for the competition. The

money is a bonus." The Briton stood a distant 17th in the invitation order based upon Grand Slam results in 1999. He only got into the 12-man field through injury to Pete Sampras and rebuffs from players like US Open finalist Todd Martin, who declined an

invitation. Haas is the hero of German sport after helping the nation out of the Davis Cup danger zone last weekend with a playoff win against Romania.

He aims to follow in the footsteps of 1992 Munich champion Michael Stich and 1996 winner Boris Becker by lifting the trophy.

"I don't think about Becker and Stich winning here before. I want to win for me," said Haas. "Boris was my idol when I was young, I watched him play Wimbledon (1984) when ! was

seven years old. "Now, he's not so much my idol, he's a friend of mine," he said of the Davis Cup captain. Haas knocked out world

number one Andre Agassi this week, building confidence for a run at the title.

Rusedski said his match with Haas will be a classic serve-and-volleyer against a baseliner. Tommy's a much-

improved player. Rusedski, one of the game's major servers, slammed down

27 aces -- winning the match on his last. World number 34 Medvedev, who lost the French Open final to Andre Agassi, now trails Rusedski 2-4 overall "I'm pleased with how I've played this week," said the win-
