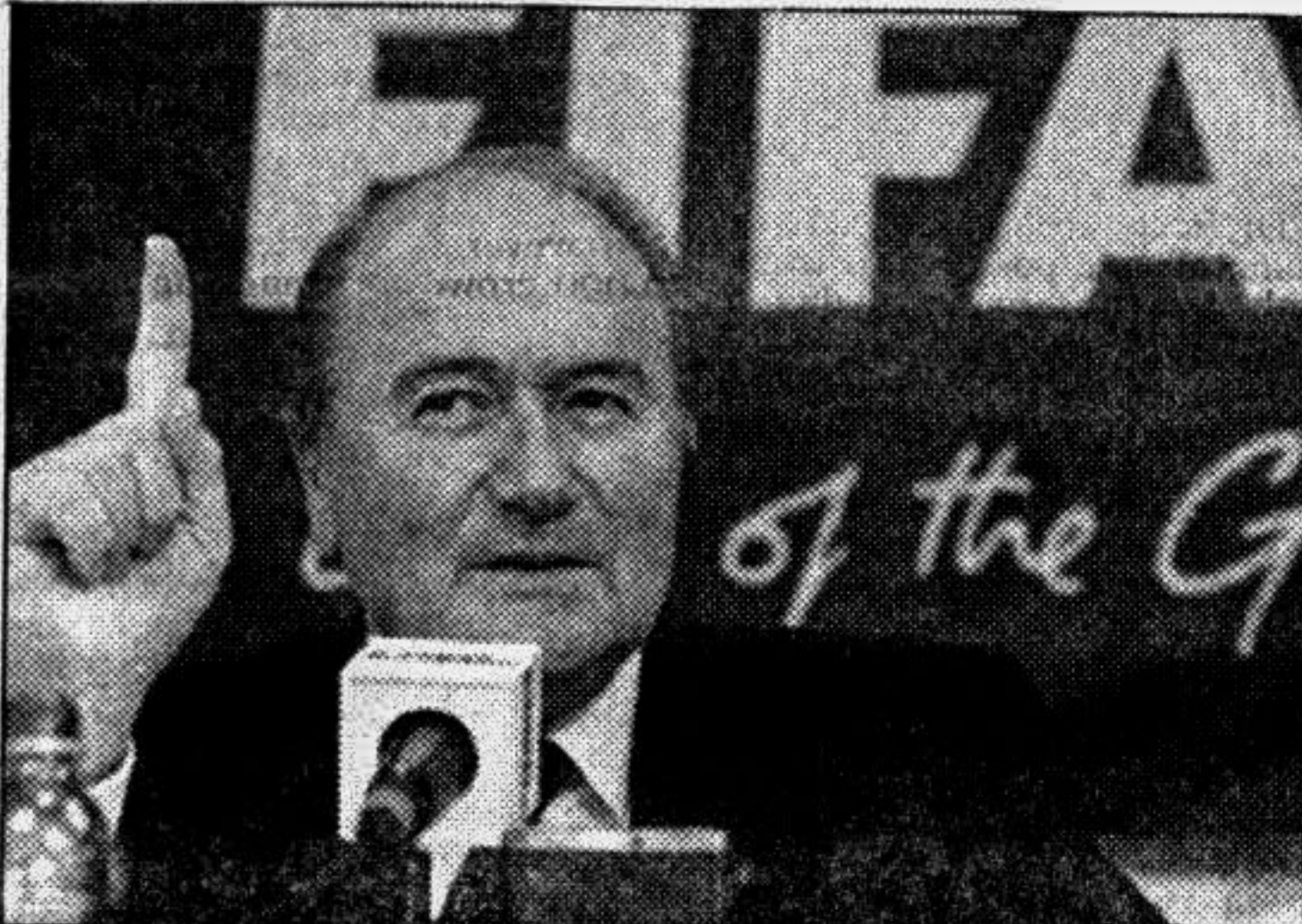

Death of Flo-Jo Griffith sues son-in-law

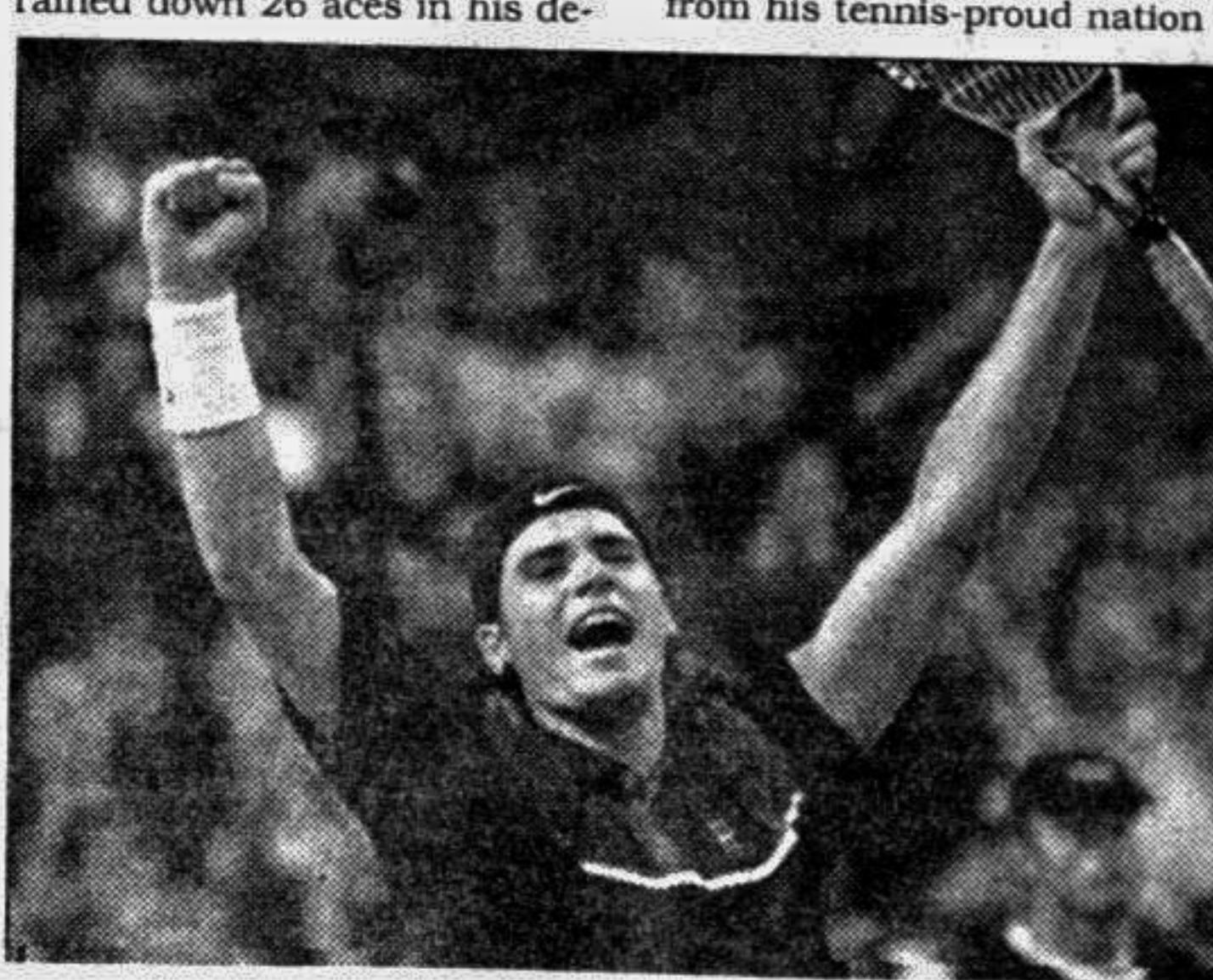
