PM leaves for Australia

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina left Dhaka lastnight for Australia on a four-day official

Hasina is the first head of government of Bangladesh to undertake a bilateral trip to the Pacific nation at the invitation of Australian Prime Minister John Howard. Trade and investment issues are likely to dominate her official talks with the Australian prime min-

Her 52-member entourage includes State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury and a 22-member business delegation.

The Prime Minister is due to arrive in Sydney this evening where she will address an Investors Forum tomorrow.

A memorandum of understanding (MOU) on the utilisation of Australian aid in Bangladesh would be signed during the Prime Minister's

The Australian National University will confer an honorary doctorate on the Bangladesh leader when she visits the university to deliver a lecture there.

The government has already made an inquiry with the Australian Agriculture Ministry whether vetch is a food for human consumption or a fodder and whether it contains toxic substance.

"Fax messages have also been sent to Egypt and India to know about toxicity in vetch," Kader said.

India, Egypt, Saudi Arabia and some other Middle East countries banned import of vetch in 1992, according to research work done by Doza Chowdhury, a former scientist of BARI, now working in Australia. Tangail-8 bypolls 35 submit nomination papers

By Staff Correspondent Thirty-five candidates yesterday submitted nomination papers for by-elections in Tangail-8 constituency, scheduled for November 15.

The candidates include for mer Awami League leader Abdul Kader Siddiqui, Bir Uttam and Shawkat Monem Shajahan of the AL, two candidates from Jatiya Party led by H M Ershad and one from Anwar Hossain Monju led JP.

The rest are independent candidates, while none from the main opposition BNP sought nomination.

Of the 35 candidate, 17 including Kader Siddiqui submitted nomination papers to the assistant returning officer and TNO of the Shakhipur Thana, 13 to another assistant returning officer and TNO of the Basail Thana, while eight candidates submitted their papers to the Deputy Commissioner of Tangail who is the returning See Page 11 Col 8

By Staff Correspondent Four guest houses in the city's posh residential areas have been sealed by police for alleged alcohol trading and anti-social activities in those. Of the guest houses, two are at Gulshan and two at Banani,

police sources said. During a police raid at a guest house in Gulshan on Saturday, a top leader of Jatiya Party and a TV artiste were arrested for alleged involvement in anti-social activities.

They were produced in the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court yesterday. The court granted them bail.

The JP leader, also accused of possessing alcohol illegally, was however sent to Dhaka Central Jail.

The guest houses numbering more than 50 in posh areas of the city are being raided by police as directed by a special committee formed by the home ministry to curb abuse of drug and alcohol. So far 25 guest houses have been raided.

The committee, headed by Director General of the Department of Narcotics Control (DNC), has recommended stern action also against owners of the residential houses rented out for such businesses, offi cials said.



Killing at Udichi function

Stop conspiracy, find out real culprits: BNP

BNP has reiterated its demand for judicial inquiry into the Udichi killing incident to find out the 'real culprits' and strongly protested the government's 'conspiracy' to implicate the party's senior leader Tariqui Islam in the case.

In the name of trial, the government is trying to protect those directly involved in the incident and those behind the scene and a judicial probe is needed to trace them, BNP leaders said at a public meeting at Paltan Maidan yesterday. City unit of the party organised the meeting to protest the conspiracy'.

They alleged that the government was forcing the arrested persons to give confessional statements against Tariqul Islam to tarnish the image of BNP and the leader.

4 burnt alive in Sitakunda ship breaking yard

From Staff Correspondent CHITTAGONG, Oct 17: At least four labourers were burnt alive in two separate incidents of fire at Sitakunda ship breaking yard within a span of 16 hours, police said.

Of them, Guda Meah, 50, was killed in the first incident that took place at Kabir ship breaking yard at 7:30 pm last night while three others, identified as Mujib, 30, Kamal, 32, and Didar, 35, were roasted alive in the second incident of fire that took place at Nasim ship breaking yard at 11 am today, police

Besides, three other labourers suffered burn injuries.



Our people were never emancipated from the yoke of despo-
