'Exchange of views'

AL, LDF meet EC, Gano Forum fails to turn up

Leaders of the ruling Awami League (AL) and the Left Democratic Front (LDF) met the Election Commission separately yesterday but Gano Forum did not turn up.

The three parties had been invited by Commission as part of the EC's 'exchange of views' programme on the elections of city corporations and upazila parishads.

The AL delegation led by the party's president member Abdul Jalil told the EC that election of the local bodies should be held before the month of Ramadan. (Ramadan begins in the second week of December). They also assured the EC of 'all out co-operation' in conducting the polls.

The AL delegation included Advocate Rahmat Ali MP and Shudhangshu Shekhar Hader. Rashed Khan Menon led the 11 member LDF delegation at the meeting with EC.

The LDF leaders told the Commission that they were for holding the elections on time as regular polls are essential for strengthening of the democratic process and institutions.

The LDF leaders, expressing their views, however, said that a congenial atmosphere for a free and fair election does not exist in the country at the moment. Holding the government and the EC mainly responsible for this, the left leaders told the meeting that 'participation of all democratic parties were essential for an effective elections'.

The LDF delegation included, among others, Morshed Ali, Monjurul Ahsan Khan and Siddikur Rahman.

EC Commissioners, Abidur Rahman and Mostaque Ahmed Chowdhury, met with the political parties. Chief Election Commissioner Abu Hena did not attend the programme due to illness.

The EC had earlier invited BNP, Jatiya Party led by H M Ershad, Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Oikya Jote, JP led by Anwar Hossain Monju and Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal to meet the Commission on Monday.

The JSD and the Monju led faction of the JP met the Commission, while others demanding reconstitution of the Commission did not.

Democracy Festival Oct 22-24

Democracy Watch, a voluntary organisation, is holding its second Democracy Festival October 22-24 in Mymensingh with the objective of making the people more conscious of their democratic rights, reports UNB.

The festival is intended to make the younger generation conscious of their rights, said Taley Rahman, executive director of Democracy Watch, at a press conference yesterday.

Seminar, debate, art competition, film show, exhibition and cultural function will feature the 3-day festival.

"We believe in decentralisation in all aspects", Taley Rahman said when asked why the festival has been organised away from the capital. Festival coordinator Alana Hunter who was present nodded her head.

About a dozen MPs including Saifur Rahman, Suranjit Sen Gupta, Hafizuddin Ahmed, Ziaur Rahman Khan, Shamsul Haq, Moslemuddin, Nazmul Huda, Begum Rawshan Ershad, Mohammad Ali, AKM Mosharraf Hossain, Dr. Mohammad Ali, Begum Jahana Khan are scheduled to take part in a 'hard question session' on Friday afternoon.

Aided by the British Council, the festival will be inaugurated by acting British High Commissioner Stephen Turner.

We have no option but to oust the govt: JCD

Leaders of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) yesterday warned that they would not tolerate the repressive measures of the ruling party on the JCD activists.

The JCD leaders sounded the warning from a rally held in front of the BNP central office in the city to drum up support for Thursday's countrywide shutdown, sponsored by the opposition alliance.

"We have no option but to oust this anti-people and subservient government as it has become a terrorist and is unleashing various repressive measures on the JCD," said JCD president Habib-un-Nabi Sohel. Sohel alleged that the government has begun resorting to repression on the opposition to destroy them gradually. "But she will be able to achieve this as long as JCD man is active," he said.

"The people of the country are now suffering untold miseries due to the misrule of the ruling party," Sohel said.

He urged the JCD activists to strengthen the organisational activities throughout the country to force Hasina to resign as she had lost her moral right to stay in power.

JCD general secretary Nasiruddin Pintu and leaders Mozaffar Hossain Zakir, Tariqul Islam Bari, Helen Jerin Khan, SM Nuruzzaman, Rafiq Sikder, Mozammel Haq, ABM Mosharraf Hossain, Bazul Basit Anjum and Mostafizul Islam Mamun addressed the rally.

JCD also brought out a procession in front of BNP central office, parading through different city streets in support of the hartal.

Genetic engineering will help agri, medical sectors prosper

Scientists at a seminar has said that without genetic engineering Bangladesh can make no headway in the application of biotechnology in medicine or agriculture.

"Bangladesh should devote effort for the development of recombinant Deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) by using transgenic plants," said Prof Ahmed Abdullah Azad, a research scientist of CSIRO Division of Melbourne, Australia at a seminar yesterday while presenting his key note speech.

Prof Azad said, "Bangladesh could prosper greatly if genetic engineering was applied in the field of agriculture and medicine. The country lives with constant problems like malnutrition, infectious diseases and low birth weight."

In the context of development of crop and nutrition, he said, "Conventional methods of agriculture are not adequate any more as the population is growing at a faster rate in order

Retrenchment of UNB journalist condemned

Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) yesterday condemned the retrenchment of Sagar Sagor, an Assistant Editor of UNB news agency's Bangla service, reports BSS.

In a statement BFUJ president Abul Kalam Azad and secretary general Akhtar Ahmed Khan and DUJ president Altaf Mahmud and general secretary Abdul Jalil Bhuiyan also criticised the UNB authorities for firing the journalist without paying his outstanding dues.

They demanded immediate payment of all his dues.

Rural physicians urged to ensure health for all

Minister for Health and Family Welfare Salahuddin Yousuf yesterday called upon the rural physicians (Palli Chikitsak) to contribute their best towards ensuring health and treatment for all along with vaccination for the children, family planning and birth control as well as checking diarrhoeal diseases by the year 2005, reports BSS.

Addressing as the chief guest a discussion on the role of Palli Chikitsak in birth control at the Ministry yesterday, he said the rural physicians were now making their sincere efforts in the primary healthcare to the vast rural people in Bangladesh.

"There is no scope to underestimate their role in this regard," he adding that the government had undertaken a training programme for these physicians to raise the standard of health care and treatment of diseases in the country. The total number of trained Palli Chikitsak in Bangladesh is 26,876, an official handout said here today.

The discussion was also participated by the president of Bangladesh Palli Chikitsak Samity Dr Sabuj Ali, Assistant General Secretary Dr Mainuddin and senior member Dr Osman Ali. Samity members and officials of the ministry were also present.

Danish envoy calls on Khasru

Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru has said democratic institutions, especially the office of Ombudsman and Human Rights Commission, are vital for the protection and promotion of Human Rights in the country, reports UNB.

He sought technological and logistic support from the Danish government to establish the office of the Ombudsman.

The Law Minister was talking to Danish Ambassador Finn Thilsted when he called on him at his office yesterday.

Khasru said the government has already approved the organogram of office of Ombudsman and is looking forward to appoint a person as the first Ombudsman of the country who will be acceptable to all.

He said the government is committed and constitutionally obliged to set up the office of Ombudsman in the country as per Article 77 of the Constitution.

The Law Minister said the government wants the office of the Ombudsman to be an effective, service oriented and functional one, which will be able to serve the cause of the common man and meet grievances of the people against public offices.

Bangladeshi documentary wins US award

A Bangladeshi documentary video 'Seen Heard and Respected: The Street Children of CSKS' received silver medal in Children's category at the Worldfest-Houston International Film and Video Festival 1999 in United States, reports BSS.

A press release of CSKS (Chinnamul Shishu Kishore Sangstha) said yesterday the twenty-five minute video secured the award out of 50 other contesting documentaries.

Debbie Ingram, an American living in Bangladesh, has directed the documentary while Peggy Herring, a Canadian citizen, wrote the script. Local videomaker Syed Aowlad videographed and edited the production.

The video was screened on Sunday evening at the Muktiuddha Museum in celebration of receiving the award.

Egarosindhu Express Train changes route from Nov 1

The Egarosindhu Express train running between Dhaka and Kishoreganj will ply between Dhaka and Mymensingh through Bhairab Bazar and Kishoreganj from November 1, a Bangladesh Railway press release said yesterday, reports UNB.

Departing from Mymensingh at 4.50 am the train will reach Dhaka at 10.15 am through Gouripur and Kishoreganj. On its return journey, it will leave Dhaka at 5.20 pm and arrive at Mymensingh at 11.05pm.
