

'3500 auto-rickshaws imported defying ban'

Some 3500 autorickshaws have been imported through a nationalised commercial bank defying a ban imposed to prevent air pollution by their toxic exhausts, says a donor agency official, reports UNB.

The vehicles were imported through the World Bank suggested pulling out all the threewheelers from the city streets within next four years time," Prof Feroz I Faruqui, a consultant for the World Bank, told a roundtable discussion in the city yesterday.


Giving a cue for the handicaps in the present system, the BRTC boss lamented: "I have to invite tenders even for salvaging a troubled vehicle from the road."

"Rickshaws must ply the artery roads, inner roads and lanes and in no way main roads after initiating adequate numbers of buses," he recommended. He further suggested intro-

ducing sufficient single and double-decker buses in the public and private sectors to ease traffic hassles.

Top alliance leaders meet Jamaat chief

Top leaders of the BNP-led opposition alliance met the Jamaat Ameer yesterday and agreed to take up effective programmes to dislodge the Awami League government from power within quickest possible time.

Secretaries general of BNP, Jatiya Party, Jamaat-e-Islami and Islamic Oikya Jote and their liaison committee representatives held 80-minute exclusive meeting from 11:15 am with Golam Azam and discussed ways to intensify oust-

government movement. Earlier, they met with BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia on Oct 8, JP Chairman HM Ershad on Oct 19. They will meet IOJ chief Azizul Haq on Friday at 9 am.

Briefing newsmen after the meeting held at Jamaat central office, Jamaat publicity secretary Abdul Quader Mollah said the opposition parties are determined to topple the AL government from power as soon as possible through mass move-

He said the top leaders of the four parties discussed the future course of action and reiterated its commitment not to participate in any election under the AL government.

"Now our main demand is to hold parliament election before all other polls. We have also decided to resist the polls if the government tries to hold them without opposition participation," Mollah added.

The Jamaat leader said the opposition parties had wanted to allow the AL government to complete its full term, but the anti-state and anti-people activities and subservient policy have forced the parties to launch this oust-government movement before the tenure.

Replying to a question, Quader Mollah said the date for holding the proposed summit meeting of the four party chiefs is yet to be finalised.

Shikdar confesses killing Munir, Khalid

KHULNA, Oct 20: Ershad Shikdar has confessed that he had masterminded the murder of Awami League leader and businessman Syed Munir Hossain but not Jubo League leader Khalid Hossain.

The murder of Khalid Hossain was an accident and I did not want him to die," he was quoted to have told interrogators on Tuesday night.

A KMP source quoting Shikdar said that he had called Syed Munir in the ice factory at Skid Ghat and nobody else on the plea of discussing business and lease of Jailkhana fer-

It was my plan to kill Munir and dump his dead body into the river as I did in other cases." Ershad said.

He became furious seeing Munir accompanied by his younger brother Chayan. Chhatra League leaders Ashit and Ali Akbar Tipu and Jubo League leader Khalid Hossain, he was reported to have said.

His armed cadres put off electric lights of the ice factory and started beating Munir, Chayan and Khalid with iron rods and butts of sown-off ri fles, Shikdar told police. Meanwhile, CL leaders Ashit

and Tipu managed to escape from there and informed Khulna thana police of the incident Police rushed there and res-

cued Munir. Chayan and Khalid with severe multiple injuries. Later at midnight Khalid Hossain died at Khulna Sadar hospital. "It was beyond my imagina-

tion that Khalid will die. Rather my plan was to 'finish' Syed Munir at any cost as he was my business rival," Ershad said to interrogators. Narrating how he had con-
