ONE of the most important figures in twentieth-century Indian art Swaminathan said, 'The face of art is somewhat like that of the sun. It does not communicate but gives'.

Anyone visiting the exhibition being held at DD Gallery

featuring recent works by Syed Jahangir would see how Swaminathan's realisation about art works.

Jahangir's recent canvas is a happy marriage between gold and ultramarine blue.


The visual experience that one gets out of Jahangir's work is quintessentially poetic.

The present show is a testimony to how the esoteric can-

vas of Jahangir of the past has gone through a sort of metamorphosis. From mysterious aura that marked his canvas for quite sometime, Jahangir suddenly appears to the world of sunshine and colour. It seems that in his 60s he has begun to rediscover the hidden beauty of nature. As Tony Morrison has once said 'creativity is a personal thing for public consump-

tion,' so does Jahangir's work an intimate discovery of nature for public consumption.

Jahangir is an amazing artist who moves virtually freely between abstraction and representative art. 'I don't draw a line between abstraction and representative art. I paint what my impulses suggest,' said Jahangir in a contemplative mood.


His recent works with their bright gold and cobalt blue create a serene silence, a silence Jibanananda Das wrote about in his poem Evening.

## Here Comes TEN

New Channel Total Entertainment Network (TEN) begins its entertainment odyssey Nov 1

THE mood of the carnival was on the air as the stars of the tinsel town taking their seats, the launching programme of the new satellite channel TEN (Total Entertainment Network) gathered glitz and glamour to announce its presence in the entertainment circuit.

If the decades of the 80's and 90's are described as the computer age, then the next millennium would surely be termed as the age of satellite TV. As technology more and more stretching the leisure period for the human being, entertainment taking more and more space to add colour in our otherwise dull and drab life.

On Saturday evening, Oct 23, at Sonargaon ball room the TEN people spelled their commitment to healthy entertainment and the dream to promote and generate Bengali culture world wide as the channel will be aired across four continents, 140 countries to be precise.

Light faded out on the stroke of 8, spotlight slanted on the dais to be taken up by the presenter Mukles who began by telling a story which many had found heavy for an occasion like this. But the best part of the launching was an orchestra composed and conducted by Emon Shah, son of the illustrious music composer Satya Shah. The highlight of the music was the way Emon did his fusion. He blended folk,

modern Bengali song and western beat as smoothing as a knife cuts a butter.

After the synchronized musical spell the silver screen placed just behind the podium facing the audience lit up with clippings from the programme and title music created for TEN. The brief clipping managed to convey the message that TEN means business and it had taken entertainment seriously.

The projection ended with a flash announcing that TEN begins its entertainment extravaganza on November 1.

For the next 40 minutes or so

it was up to the stars of Dhaka's cultural firmament including stars of the celluloid world to come one by one and speak about their expectation from TEN and how they feel about the channel that is coming in a big way to entertainment industry which has just beginning to bloom.

Afzal was the first to come since the organisers had decided to call the stars on stage in alphabetical order. 'Since TEN is going to beam our culture across the continents onus is on TEN to promote our culture to the world.' And Afzal in an

emotional voice said, 'Through satellite channel we want to prove that we love our country.'

'We talk about,' Ilias Kanchan said next, 'opening windows to let fresh air and light to come in. But we have to be very cautious about it because small might also get in.'

Emdadul Haq Milon came next to talk about his expectation: 'I hope TEN would portray the true picture of the country and our culture.'

Mamunur Rashid spoke in his usual flair saying, 'If total entertainment means total en-

tertainment ignoring the other side of life that consists of pain and struggle then persons like us will not be with the effort of TEN. I feel life's struggle would be there in TEN's depiction of life and culture in Bangladesh.'

The long queue of expectations and wishes from the celebrities rounded off with TEN's one of the directors Shilpi Ali inviting criticism about TEN's performance which would lend opportunity for correction and inspiration for making the TEN's entertainment journey a success.


