Seventh JS rewrites by-election records

The seventh Jatiya Sangsad has eclipsed all previous records on parliamentary by-elections in the country. In its 39-month life, it has already witnessed 21 by-polls to its vacant seats and is going to see five more including today's one (the 22nd) in Faridpur.

The 23rd by-election is scheduled for November 15 in a Tangail constituency. And the schedules of the rest three by-elections to the vacant seats of parliament in Kishoreganj, Sirajganj and Rajshahi are yet to be announced.

Another by-poll to a Bhola seat has been pending since early days of the present Sangsad due to legal complications.

By-polls were announced for 16 seats, vacated by those who

Security beefed up: Faridpur-4 bypolls today

Security has been beefed up in Sadarpur and Char Bhadrashan thanas of Faridpur district ahead of by-election in Faridpur-4 constituency today, reports BSS.

Army and Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) were deployed while extra police were called in the area as the commission declared all the 76 polling centres of the constituency as "vulnerable".

An Election Commission press release said 30 security personnel would be posted at each polling centre, while 12 striking force and 17 mobile teams comprising BDR and Armed Police Battalion members would be on "intensive patrol duty" under a magistrate for each team.

Young man
stabbed to
death in city

A young man was stabbed to death by unidentified assailants near Munshikola cotton factory in the city's Shaheed area Monday night, police said.

The dead, identified as Shahidul Islam Swapon, 25, son of Emran Hossain, a resident of Alambagh under Shaheed police station.

The victim's mother Khanjan Begum went to the spot and identified the body of his son yesterday morning. She also lodged an FIR with the police accusing Delwar, Mohammed Ali, Kanu, Dulal and Idu of the killing her son.

BNP prepares for 'road march' Sylhet chapter 'desired' change in schedule

Main opposition BNP has taken preparation for its two "road march" programmes aimed at mobilising support for toppling the Awami League government.

Earlier, the BNP planned to lead a two-day road march towards greater Sylhet from October 31 to November 1, but changed the scheduled date to "tremendous pressure" from its Sylhet chapter which asked for making the march at least a three-day affair.

According to the changed schedule, the BNP will now embark upon a one-day road march from Dhaka to Comilla and Brahmanbaria districts on November 1.

However, contradicting some press reports BNP leaders said the two-day road march scheduled towards greater Sylhet from October 31 was not postponed, but shifted and that another one-day march has been taken up.

BNP leader Tariqul Islam said the party chairperson Khaleda Zia will now lead a three-day march towards greater Sylhet probably during November 9-11. He said party leaders of the four districts of greater Sylhet have requested

Monir may have died from diphtheria'

A probe committee report, submitted to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital authorities yesterday, said Monir Hossain, a Dhaka University student, "may have died" at the hospital from diphtheria.

But Monir's father had said earlier that his son was suffering from tonsillitis and accused the doctors of not attending his son. Monir died on Wednesday last.

The ENT department of DMCH formed the probe committee on Sunday to investigate the allegation.

The three-member committee was headed by Dr Sabah U Ahmed. Two other members were Dr Abu Yusuf Fakir and Dr Yusuf Haider.

Shikdar, his men make no confessions under Sec 164

KHULNA, Oct 26: All the senior police officials of the 25-member interrogation team left Khulna tonight for their respective places of work after completing interrogation of Ershad Shikdar and his arrested accomplices.

But they failed either to convince Shikdar and his accomplices make judicial confessions under Section 164 or help the KMP in recovering the arms and ammunition which were under their possession. They compelled Shikdar only to confess to murders under Section 161 and not under 164 KMP sources said.

Confession under Section 164 is important for trial, said a senior lawyer of Khulna Bar Association.

The interrogators will submit a report to the IGP soon, KMP sources said.

Pandemonium in Lok Sabha over Bofors gun deal

NEW DELHI, Oct 26: The main opposition Congress joined by AIADMK today staged an angry walk-out in the Lok Sabha protesting inclusion of the name of late Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in the chargesheet of controversial Bofors gun deal case, report BSS, AP.

The protest was also seen in the upper house — Rajya Sabha.

The confrontation over the charges filed in court last week threatened to delay the government's heavy legislative agenda. The Congress said it won't cooperate in the speedy passage of bill unless Rajiv's name is removed from the chargesheet.

Rajiv Gandhi was accused of trying to block the probe by federal investigators into alleged


kickbacks from a 1.4 billion dollars purchase of artillery guns from Sweden in 1986 during his administration.

Rajiv was assassinated in 1991.

Two foreign businessmen, a Swede and an Italian, and two Indians also were charged in the alleged bribery by the Swedish company AB Bofors.

As soon as the Lok Sabha began its sitting this morning, Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Madhav Rao Scindia took the floor to accuse the government of deliberately bringing in the name of Rajiv Gandhi in the chargesheet of Bofors case which, he said, was aimed at tarnishing the image of the Congress party.

DESA asked to cut system loss from 24 pc to 20 by Jan

The Power Development Board (PDB) has finally taken some serious measures to cut system loss from 24 per cent now to 20 per cent by January next, sources said.

At the same time, PDB authorities have given verbal instructions to Dhaka Electric Supply Authority (DESA) to reduce the system loss significantly and increase bill collection by 120 per cent so that it can pay its dues to PDB by July next.

DESA authorities were also told by the Finance Minister in recent meetings that "drastic solutions" will be considered if financial matters can not be improved satisfactorily by July next.

System loss in the power sector eats up nearly Tk 350 crore of revenue. Earlier, most of this system loss was attributed to organised theft by PDB-DESA meter readers and ledger writers.

PDB authorities have identified that power theft is actually done in connivance with a sec-

tion of officers. So, clear cut instructions have been given to the officials concerned to reduce system loss by 4 per cent by January next or to face "administrative action", the sources said.

At the same time, PDB authorities have given verbal instructions to Dhaka Electric Supply Authority (DESA) to reduce the system loss significantly and increase bill collection by 120 per cent so that it can pay its dues to PDB by July next.

DESA authorities were also told by the Finance Minister in recent meetings that "drastic solutions" will be considered if financial matters can not be improved satisfactorily by July next.

Meanwhile, the Finance Minister has expressed his dissatisfaction at the serious financial mismanagement in PDB and DESA. The PDB has over Tk 2500 crore dues with clients. Of these, DESA is the biggest defaulter with over Tk 1700 crore dues to PDB. Other

BCL leader murder Hartal at Kashba disrupts train communications for 12 hours

COMILLA, Oct 26: A dawn-to-dusk hartal was observed at Kashba thana headquarters in Brahmanbaria district today protesting killing of BCL leader Umran Khan alias Omar.

Omar, president of BCL Kashba thana unit was stabbed allegedly by JCD activists at 4 pm yesterday. He died on way to hospital.

Train communications between Dhaka-Chittagong and Chittagong-Sylhet were disrupted for 12 hours from 8 am to 5 pm due to a barricade put up at Kashba station. The pickets ransacked one Noahballi bound train coming from Dhaka and beat up its driver.

A protest rally was held on Brahmanbaria Govt College campus at 7 pm today.

Later a procession carrying the body of Omar Ali was brought out in the town.

Dacoits loot gold, pistol from a flat in Mirpur

Dacoits took away about Tk 2.74 lakh in cash and gold ornaments and a licenced pistol with ammunition from a flat of a textile mill owner on Mazar Road in the city's Mirpur area in the early hours of yesterday.

According to police, a gang of about eight armed men entered the ground floor, flat of Azizur Rahman, the textile mill owner, after breaking open an iron grill of a window at about 4 am yesterday.

Brandishing arms, the gang tied up the inmates of the house in two rooms of the flat and looted gold ornaments weighing about 40 tolas, Tk 15 thousand in cash and Azizur Rahman's licensed .22 bore pistol with 50 bullets, police added.

They left the flat after an hour. None, however, was arrested in connection with the dacoity till filing of this report last night.

A case was filed with Mirpur thana in this regard yesterday.
