### Bangladeshi shot dead by BSF in Pirganj

THAKURGAON, Oct 30: A Bangladesh national was shot dead by Indian Border Security Force (BSF) on Singhor border in Pirganj thana Friday morn-

ing, reports UNB. The killing took place a day after Directors-General of Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and BSF signed an accord at the conference in Dhaka on Thursday for resolving border

disputes. The dead was identified as Bimon Chandra, 27, son of Rohoni Kanta Roy of village Singhor in Pirganj thana.

Local sources said BSF personnel crossed barbed wire fences on Buirchuna border of India and fired two shots on Bimon who went to nearby Pachakanta beel to collect his ducks at about 6 pm. He died on the spot.

Several thousand people thronged Pirganj police station when Bimon's body was brought there this (Saturday) morning. BDR sources here said they

sent today a letter to their BSF counterparts strongly protesting the killing. BDR also proposed a flag meeting, but BSF did not reply till this evening," sources added.

The Indian border guards killed two other Bangladesh civilians - Pashiruddin, 54. and Saidur Rahman, 27- on September 16 on the border in the same thana.

## JCD, police clash near BNP office in city

A large posse of riot police backed by water cannons and riot car sealed off the entrance of the BNP headquarters at Naya Paltan since 3 p.m. in an attempt to thwart a scheduled procession of the JCD.

# Ground breaking of KEPZ held

# Invest more in pvt sector: PM

CHITTAGONG, Oct 30: The ground breaking ceremony of Korean Export Processing Zone (KEPZ) was held today with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina calling for more foreign and lo-

KEPZ is being set up over 2500 acres of "waste land" at Anwara on the left bank of the Karnaphuli river. It is expected to draw an investment of over one billion US dollars.

cal investments in the private

The KEPZ is scheduled to be operational by next year and fully implemented by 2009

In the first phase 400 acres of land will be developed for industrial plots and a golf course will be set up on 280 acres, officials said.

A full-fledged container park, a jetty for anchoring more than one ship, a sciencepark, research centre, five-star hotel, and modern shopping complex will be accommodated in the EPZ, apart from indus-


Speaking as the chief guest at today's ceremony, the Prime Minister said that the groundbreaking of KEPZ would be a milestone in the development of private sector in the country. "Establishment of KEPZ will make a positive contribution to our economy. It will also facilitate transfer of technology.

upgradation of skills and improvement of management and encourage backward linkages." "We are encouraged by the response from foreign investors to our investment package,"

said Hasina. She pointed out that foreign direct investment in the country now stands at nearly 6.7 billion dollars with employment opportunities for 400,000

In the industrial policy of 1999, the government decided to offer special incentives and facilities to 16 types of industries identified as thrust sector. These include agro-based indus-

The BNP-led opposition has called for a dawn-to-dusk hartal across the country tomorrow to protest what it called the Election Commission's unilateral declaration of the polls schedule for three city corporations, reports UNB.

They demanded resignation of the government and parliamentary election before other elections. The opposition came up with

# Kidnappers gouge out eyes of businessman

By Staff Correspondent A gang of kidnappers gouged a businessman's eyes out with a knife and stabbed him in his 'abdomen with a broken bottle at Dhoopkhola Math in the city yesterday.

Businessman Khokon, 25, was abducted from near his Gandaria residence at Gumtihar in Gandaria.

The kidnappers also snatched away gold chains and cash money from Khokon, hospital sources said.

Relatives of the victim talking to The Daily Star alleged that the kidnappers were identified gangsters of the locality.

Police said they launched a manhunt to arrest the culprits. No case was lodged till filing of this report last night. A gang of about seven picked

up Khokon near his residence at about 11.30 am yesterday, witnesses said. They took him to the Dhoopkhola Math and later left him on a nearby road in a critical state. Local people rescued

The victim, identified as Saifuddin alias Tutul, 23, came under attack while he was going to Bahaddarhat by a rickshaw at around 2-30 am. The gang intercepted Tutul's rickshaw and shot in his head. He died on the spot.
