Hasina tells Hathazari rally

Resist vote thieves by joining city corpn polls

HATHAZARI, Oct 30: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina today urged people to resist opposition's anti-election moves and protect their voting rights by joining the forthcoming city corporation elections, reports

"Remain alert against the vote thieves. They (BNP-JP) have come down to street to snatch your right to vote. Resist the vote thieves by joining elec-tions," she told a huge public meeting at Parbati High School here this afternoon.

The prime minister's call came hot on heels of the opposition decision of resisting the December 6 City Corporation elections in Chittagong, Khulna

and Rajshahi. It is not clear to me why the opposition is planning to boycott the elections," Hasina said. If establishment of voting right is their demand, then how that will be possible without joining the vote, she questioned.


