BCSIR-BRAC sign MOU

Bangladesh Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR) and BRAC signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) yesterday in the city for extension and training of renewable environment friendly biogas technology in the country, says a press release.

Kamaluddin Ahmed, secretary of BCSIR and Md Aminul Alam, deputy executive director of BRAC, signed on behalf of their respective organisations. Lt Gen M Nuruddin Khan (Retd) Minister for Science and Technology and Faez Hasan Abed, founder executive director of BRAC were present.

Under the MOU, BRAC will use its countrywide network to expand biogas technology through its microcredit programme participants and other households. BCSIR will provide Tk 5000 to each household as grant to help them purchase materials and install the plants.

It will also ensure maintenance and supervision for proper functioning of the plants during the first three months of installation free of charge. The BCSIR will also provide training to fifty BRAC personnel on Biogas Technology at its Fuel Research and Development Institute.

3 maunds of vetch seized in Khulna

The banned lentil was recovered during raids in markets at Sheikhpura, Boira, Banagati, Daulatpur, Khalishpur and Barabazar.

The raids were conducted by three teams comprising Additional DC (General and LA), magistrate, district marketing officer and his representatives. The government recently banned import or marketing of vetch, an Australian species of lentil, after finding its harmful effect on human body.

Jail Killing Day observed

The nation yesterday observed the Jail Killing Day, one of the black chapters of the country's history, with befitting manner and vowed to encounter any unholy political game again, reports BSS.

Different organisations demanded speedy trial of the designers and executors of the brutal killing of national leaders inside the jail, on November 3, 1975.

The four national leaders — Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmed, Captain M Mansur Ali and Kamruzzaman — who led the war of independence were thrown into Dhaka Central Jail after the assassination of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman on August 15, 1975.

Awami League and its front organisations observed the day through countrywide programme including the remembrance public meeting at Paltan Maidan at 3 pm.

National and party flags were at half-mast atop all party offices across the country and party activists wore black badges.

In the city, the day's programme began with placing wreaths at the portrait of Bangabandhu at the Bangladesh Museum and at the graves of the leaders at Banani 8.30 am.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina reached Bangabandhu Bhaban at 8 o'clock in the morning and placed wreaths at the portrait of father of the nation.

Sheikh Hasina, who is also the president of Bangladesh Awami League, later went to Banani graveyard where the three among four national leaders and the victims of August 15 massacre were buried.

The Prime Minister placed wreaths at the graves of Shaheed Syed Nazrul Islam, Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed and Shaheed Capt M Mansur Ali. The body of another jail killing victim Shaheed AHM Kamruzzaman was buried at his Rajshahi village home.

She also placed wreaths at the graves of Shaheed Mati Begum Fazilatunnesa Mujib and other members of her family who were assassinated by the killers on the fateful night of August 15, 1975.

The Prime Minister along with senior Awami League leaders also offered fataha and special prayer seeking the blessings of the Allah for the peace of the departed souls.

A large number of political and socio-cultural organisations also placed wreaths at the portrait of Bangabandhu as well as graves of the national leaders and others at Banani graveyard.

A milad mahfil was also held at the central party office. Leaders of Jatiya Char Neta Parishad visited the cell where the four national leaders were held and paid their deep homage to the victims in the morning.
