DUTA expresses concern

The leaders of Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) expressed grave concern over increasing political and economic crisis in the country.

"The terrorism unleashed by the state and ruling party against on going democratic movement has taken a serious turn recently," said a joint statement by DUTA president and General Secretary AFM Yusuf Haider and Perdur Hosain respectively.

Referring to the recent police attack on political leaders and innocent people, they said in the statement that "We are very much disturbed and annoyed at the death of a housewife by police firing and their attack on renowned freedom fighter and political leader Sadek Hossain Khoka."

They also expressed concern over price hike of essential goods and deteriorating law and order situation in the country.

"We think that the government should show utmost patience and behaviour of the police should be restrained for maintaining stability and democratic norms," the statement said.

Govt redressing flood damage, JS told

State Minister for Disaster Management and Relief Talukder Abdul Khaleque yesterday said the government was redressing damage caused by century's worst flood last year through various programmes being implemented throughout the country, reports BSS.

He said the government has enforced plans and programmes during and soon after the floods through post-flood rehabilitation scheme, vulnerable group feeding (VGF) and other means so that none would die of hunger and country's economy did not suffer.

The state minister was replying to a question raised by the Jatiya Sangsad. The question was raised by Advocate Fazley Rabbil of Jatiya Party in place of Shamsul Alam Khan of BNP. The supplementary were raised by Segupta Yasmeen of Awami League and Zulfikar Ali Bhutto of Jatiya Party.

Women Reserve Seat Bill

Meanwhile Tahura Ali (Jamalpur-Sherpur) criticised the leader of the opposition for resorting to negative politics by boycotting the Jatiya Sangsad for which the Bill for amending the "Women Reserve Seat" provision can not be brought.

Tahura told the Sangsad that it would affect the consolidation of democratic process and seriously curtail the struggle for ensuring women's right. Due to non-participation by the opposition, required quorum for amending the Constitution according to the constitutional provision caused great concern amongst the womenfolk in the country, Tahura belonging to the treasury bench said.

Panchanan Biswas of the treasury bench urged the government to seriously enforce laws dealing with noise pollution because of the fact that none cared for fighting out this menace.

Processions protesting hartals in city

A huge peace procession was brought out in the city yesterday protesting the third-day hartal enforced by BNP-led opposition alliance along with anti-liberation forces across the country, reports BSS.

Use of nat'l expertise in remote sensing tech stressed

Water Resources Minister Abdur Razzaq has stressed the need for use of national expertise in remote sensing technology to operate and maintain the ground station like RAPIDS in Bangladesh on permanent basis, reports UNB.

The minister was speaking as chief guest at the inaugural function of a workshop on "Experience of the portable ERS ground receiving station RAPIDS in Bangladesh" jointly organized by EGIS and SPARRSO at its auditorium yesterday.

Presided over by AM Chowdhury, chairman, SPARRSO, the function was also addressed by M Idris Ali, secretary, Ministry of Defence and Rob Koudstaal, team leader of Environmental Geographical Information System (EGIS).

Razzaq congratulated the scientists of EGIS and SPARRSO for carrying out project successfully without support from abroad.

He also urged them to work towards having a permanent microwave satellite station in Bangladesh.

Netherlands Embassy, BFES sign agreement

An agreement has been signed between the Royal Netherlands Embassy, Dhaka and Bangladesh Friends Education Society (BFES) to work on 'familization of natural resources and its conservation development through child-to-child approach', says a press release.

Under this agreement the Royal Netherlands government will provide to BFES an amount of Tk 10,00,000 (46,153 Dutch Guilders) to implement the project. J A Mas, Counsellor of the Royal Netherlands Embassy, Dhaka and Reza Salim, Associate Director of Bangladesh Friendship Education Society has signed the contract.

DU Disciplinary Board meets today

Dhaka University authorities will sit for a Disciplinary Board meeting today to decide what action to take against some university students found responsible in various violent activities on the campus.

DU authorities have called for the meeting following the submission of the reports of probe committees formed to investigate three untoward incidents at Surya Sen, Mohsin and AF Rahman halls of the university.

In their recently submitted reports the probe bodies recommended stern punishment against a total of eleven students who were found responsible "directly and indirectly" for the separate incidents at the residential halls, sources said.

DU authorities had earlier formed these bodies to investigate a beating incident at Surya Sen Hall, a kidnapping incident of Mohsin Hall and a firing incident at AF Rahman Hall.

Seven students of Surya Sen Hall were temporarily expelled from the university after their involvement in the beating incident was found. Two other students of Mohsin Hall have also been suspended for two months for their involvement in the kidnapping of two young boys at the hall a couple of months back.

A top DU official told The Daily Star last night that out of the 11, nine students will be expelled from the university for their "direct" involvement in the said activities.

"The other two are likely to face two or three years suspension for their indirect involvement in another incident," he added.

The meeting will be held at the vice-chancellor's office at 11 am with VC Prof AK Azad Chowdhury in the chair.
