

tions there. The signatories belonging to "Shata Nagorik Committee" said that the country's election system was becoming farcical as the Awami League government has resorted to violence and vote dacoity.

They also said that the democratic system in the country was being destroyed by the ruling party's misdeeds and the voters' voices were also being suppressed.

The statement said that the nature of all by-polls held in the last three and a half years under this government was similar. The Tangail by-polls once again proved that no elec-tion under this government could be held in a free and fair atmosphere. It also proved the Election Commission's failure in maintaining neutrality, it added.

"The Tangail by-polls will remain a black spot in our nation's history," the statement observed.




