MONACO, Nov 22: American Carl Lewis and Holland's Fanny Blankers-Koen were named respectively best male and female athlete of the century at the International Amateur Athletics Federation gala here Sunday, reports AFP.

America's Michael Johnson and Romania's Gabriela Szabo, meanwhile, won the awards for the best athletes of 1999.

Lewis and Blankers-Koen. were honoured by the world governing body at a glittering occasion attended by top current champions Maurice Greene and Wilson Kipketer as well as leading names from the past such as Sebastian Coe, Edwin Moses and Jackie Joyner-Lewis said: "It's an enormous

honour but I cannot say I am better than Jesse Owens." That was a reference to his legendary compatriot, the Afro-American who cocked a snook at the racist ideology of Adolf Hitler by winning four gold medals at the 1936 Olympics in Berlin. Lewis added: "Perhaps I

would never have achieved in Los Angeles (in 1984 when Lewis emulated Owens' achievement) what I achieved if Jesse Owens had not done what he did."

Other leading contenders for the mens' award were Finn Paavo Nurmi and Ethiopian Abebe Butila.

Blankers-Koen, now 82, was clearly delighted with her award. Apparently unaware she had won the award she leaped out of her chair when told she was the winner and said to Lewis, who had already spoken at length: "Did you know about

The Dutchwoman's legendary achievement was winning four gold medals in the 1948 Olympics, staged at Wembley in London. She prevailed in the 100m, 200m, 4 x 100m and 80m hurdles.

Reflecting on her London performance she said: "I remember every race, every second of the London games... of my tears when I wanted to stop after my first two medals when my husband was insisting I continue. And he was right."

Johnson succeeded Ethiopia's Haile Gebreselassie while Szabo replaced American Marion Jones as winners of the annual award. Johnson said 1999 had been

his first truly injury-free year. It was the second time he had won the award - his previous triumph was in 1996. This year he had won two gold medals in Seville World Championships in the 400m and 4x400m. The Texan has said he will

retire after the Sydney Olympics and said ominously: "I am looking forward to next season with impatience." Szabo, who beat Marion

Jones and Kenya's Kenyane Tegla to the annual award, also hopes for a successful Olympics -- an Olympic gold is the one honour to elude her in an otherwise glittering career. She said: "I do not want to talk about the future if it is not of Sydney.'


