## Countrywide hartal today

By Staff Correspondent The BNP-led opposition al-liance has called for a countrywide dawn-to-dusk hartal today to press home its onepoint demand and early na-

tional election. The hartal was called on November 16. Sources said the alliance may announce fresh anti-government programmes from today's hartal.

Today's hartal is the sixth in 25 days of this month. Earlier, hartals were observed on November 1, 7, 8, 9 and 16.

In support of today's shut down, the BNP, Jatiya Party, Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Oikya Jote held separate rallies and brought out processions in the capital vesterday evening.

Some other political parties i.e. Jagpa. Democratic League. Progressive Nationalist Party and Nationalist Democratic Alliance, who extended their support to the hartal call, also held rallies and brought out

processions in the evening.

Main opposition BNP brought out torch processions from 11 places — New Market, Khilgaon Chowrashta, Mohakhali, Badda, Farmgate, Mohammadpur, Kafrul Bus Stand Mirpur Town Hall, Pallabi, Shyampur. Uttara and Ram-

# A stately burial for Sufia Kamal

Poet Begum Sufia Kamal, the country's most celebrated woman of the age, was laid to eternal rest at Azimpur graveyard with state honour at about 5 p.m. yesterday.

Buglers from the army's East Bengal Regiment played the last post when the body, draped in national colours, was laid in the grave. Thousands of people stood in solemn silence praying and paying their last respects to one of Bangladesh's most beloved and revered women.

A resplendent army jeep carried the flower-bedecked body in a ceremonial motorcade to the site of her eternal rest at Azimpur graveyard where she was laid beside the grave of Language Movement martyr Shaheed Abul Barkat.

Poet Sufia Kamal is the first Bengali woman buried with state honour.

She died at the Intensive Care Unit of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Hospital (BSMMUH) Saturday morning at the age of 88. Hospitalised on Thursday for renal failure, she had been suffering from old age complica-

The body was taken to the Azimpur graveyard after her last namaj-e-janaza at the Na-tional Eidgah Maidan after Asr prayers, which were attended by

thousands of people. A military carriage took the coffin to the Bangla Academy from her residence Shanjer Maya at Dhanmondi by officers of the East Bengal Regiment.

The body was also taken to Mahila Parishad office at Baily Road and kept there for some time. She had served as the organisation's president since

The military motorcade then took the body to the central Shaheed Minar. People from all walks of life and of different age thronged the Minar to pay their last respects. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was there and placed wreath on the coffin. The Prime Minister stood in solemn silence for sometime. She then offered munajat for the peace of the departed soul.

Military secretaries placed wreaths on behalf of President

Shahabuddin Ahmed and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the grave immediately after the burial.

Politicians, ministers, academics, eminent citizens, cultural activists, journalists, of-ficials and hundreds of admirers joined the namaj-e-janaza.

Those who attended the janaza and rituals at the graveyard included Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad, Mayor of Dhaka Mohammad Hanif, BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan, Prime Minister's Political Advisor Dr. S.A. Malek, Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal President and Livestock Minister ASM Abdur Rab. Works Minister Mosharraf Hossain, State Minister for Information Abu Sayeed, State Minister for Shipping Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya and State Minister for Cultural Affairs Obaidul Quader.

A 1001-member National Committee headed by Prof Kabir Choudhury will hold a condolence meeting at Central Shaheed Minar in the city tomorrow at 3 p.m.

# Property dispute claims three of a family

Three members of a family, including two women, were stabbed to death inside a flat at Azimpur Road under Lalbagh thana in the city in the early hours of Monday.

The dead were identified as Sajedunnisa, 57, wife of late Adul Hasem, her daughter Sabiha Begum, 27, and her son Swapon, 20, all residents of 1/1/C Azimpur Road.

Lalbagh police recovered the partially decomposed bodies with marks of stab injuries at about 10 pm . Tuesday, after breaking open the entrance that was locked from outside since Monday morning.

Relatives and neighbours of the dead informed police when they smelt a strong odour being emitted from the ground floor flat Tuesday evening.

Police were suspecting that the three were murdered in the early hours of Monday, following a dispute with their relatives over landed property.

Lalbagh police were interrogating four persons, including a woman, in connection with the

triple murder. They were identified as -- Obaidul Akbar Ahmed Hossain, Shafiqul Islam and Sufia -- nephews and

Lalbagh police did not officially arrest the four till the filing of this report. The investigating officer of the case, along with the four, was out hunting for the alleged killers till the filing of this report late last

the niece of Sajedunnisa.

Iqbal Bahar, the ADC of DMP, Southern Zone, told The Daily Star that police were interrogating them as suspects. If necessary we will arrest

them", said Igbal Bahar. Another senior police official said that their investigation so far had revealed that there were as many as ten murders. The three victims were gagged with pillows and mattresses and were eventually stabbed indiscriminately, he

According to sources, Sajedunnisa, mother of five daughters and three sons, had been residing with Sabiha and

Swapon at the ground floor flat of her three -storied building on 1/1/C Azimpur Road.

Her four other daughters were married, one of who resided at a neighbouring house of her mother's. Two sons of Sajedunnisa are away in a middle-eastern country.

Sajedunnisa's two sisters and their families also reside at a nearby plot attached to her building. Sajedunnisa and her family's relationship with her nephews and niece had deteriorated ever since the construction work on the first and the second floor of her building started about two years ago.

At that time her relatives accused Sajedunnisa of cutting off their supply of light and air by constructing the first and second floor of the building.

The dispute revived after two months, when Ahmed Hossain, a nephew of Sajedunnisa, returned home from Saudi Arabia. Ahmed Hossain and other relatives often indulged in altercation with members of See Page 12 Col 8

#### Babu's petition dismissed

By Staff Correspondent The High Court on Tuesday dismissed a petition by Akhtheruzzaman Chowdhury Babu seeking revision of an order by the District Judge's Court, Dhaka, staying an ad-interim injunction by The Fourth Assistant Judge's Court on September 16.

The injunction was given after Babu and four others prayed for restraining Zafar Chowdhury and four others from continuing to hold office as chairman and directors of United Commercial Bank Ltd (UCBL).

The District Judge's Court stayed the injunction following prayer from Zaffar Ahmed Chowdhury and others.

Babu later went to the High Court seeking revision of the District Court's order.After hearing both the sides, the HC fixed October 3 for next hearing and stayed the order. It also directed the parties to maintain status quo.

The hearing date was refixed as the HC was on vacation. The hearing started early this week and a Division Bench of the HC comprising Justice Mozzammel Huq and Justice Abdur Rashid dismissed Babu's petition on Tuesday. On August 26 this year, some

50 armed men allegedly backed by police stormed into the board room of UCBL during a meeting and forced some bank directors to resign. The ousted directors later al-

leged that Awami League leader Babu led the armed men and declared himself chairman of the bank.

## Tayebi murder: 8 chargesheeted From Staff Correspondent

Relatives wail as three of a family were murdered at Lalbagh yesterday.

CHITTAGONG, Nov 24: CID submitted a chargesheet in the sensational Jibran Tayebi murder case to the Chief

Metropolitan Magistrate's (CMM) Court here yesterday. The chargesheet was submitted after a five-month investigation.

Eight accused, including 'the mastermind' Yasin Rahman Titu, son of garments industrialist Khalilur Rahman, have been charged with the murder under Sections 302,109,120-Kha and 34, the investigation officer of CID ASP Abdul Kader Khan told this correspondent today.

Khan said that another supplementary charge sheet would be submitted after arrest of four others allegedly involved in the murder.

He said in the charge sheet filed yesterday. 60 people including seven women were shown as witnesses. Of the eight accused, six were arrested while the alleged mastermind Yasin Rahman Titu and one Md Alamgir who informed the killers over a mobile phone af-ter Jibran came out of his office in Agrabad commercial area, are still at large, Khan said. ### Oil distributors, tank lorry owners continue strike in 16 dists

From Our Correspondent RAJSHAHI, Nov 24: Rajshahi Division Oil Distributor and Tank Lorry Owners' Association (RDODTLOA) observed strike for the fifth consecutive day in 16 northern districts to-

The distributors and the tank lorry owners are not lifting fuel oil from the Baghabari oil depot since Saturday hist to press their three-point demand.

The demands include fixing same oil price rate for all depots, deployment of army and BDR personnel at the Baghabari depot and stoppage of 'illegal' activities of the Baghabaribased tank lorry workers' associations.

Meanwhile, sufferings of the people in the northern region have mounted because of scarcity of fuel oils due to the strike.

Sources said, 165 petrol pumps in the region have no fuel oils. They have hung signboards inscribed with "no oil". But some unscrupulous traders See Page 11 Col 3
