Uplift works progressing

PIROJPUR, Nov 24: The District Council will implement 34 projects in six thanas at a cost of Tk 55.84 lakh in the current fiscal year (1999-2000), reports UNB.

Of them, 24 projects costing Tk 45.94 lakh will be completed under the Annual Development Programme (ADP) and 10 others costing Tk 9.90 lakh from own resources. Thana-wise breakup of projects: Sadar-11, Mathbaria-9, Bhandaria-3, Kaukhali-1, Nesarabab-6 and Nazipur-4. The projects include construction and reconstruction of bridges, culverts and roads, construction of passenger sheds, and repair of Dakbanglows in different thanas. Works on the projects have already started and are expected to be completed by June 2000, officials said.

Allocation for road construction

SHARIJTPUR, Nov 24: Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) has allocated Tk 23 lakh for construction of roads and culverts in Narla thana, reports UNB.

Officials said construction works of eight culverts and four roads have already started. Upon completion of the works, which are progressing fast, rural road communication as well as irrigation and drainage facilities would improve in the thana, they said. Meanwhile, LGED has constructed three non-government primary school buildings in Narla thana at a cost of Tk 17.86 lakh.

Driver killed in truck mishap

MANIKGANJ, Nov 24: Two trucks collided head-on at Batholi on Dhaka-Aricha highway, on Monday killing a truck driver and injuring three others, reports UNB.

Police said truck driver Joynal Ali, 45, and three unidentified people were injured in the accident that took place at about 2 pm. Joynal died after he was brought to Manikganj Sadar Hospital. One of the injured was admitted to the hospital while two others were released after first aid. A case was filed with Dhamrai thana.

Young man hacked to death

MANIKGANJ, Nov 24: Armed men hacked a young man to death and left three others wounded in front of a cinema hall here on Monday, police said, reports UNB.

They said terrorists numbering 8/10 attacked Salam, 18, Senu, 20, Sakkat 19, and Mongol, 19, at about 11:30 am in front of Nabin cinema hall and hit them with sharp weapons. Previous enmity might be the cause of attack, police said. Salam died on way to hospital. Others were admitted to Manikganj Sadar Hospital and later on shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Police have been deployed in the area as tension was mounting.

Sugarcane farming in Chuadanga

CHUADANGA, Nov 24: The Darsana Sugar Mills authority has taken up a programme to bring 15,000 acres under sugarcane cultivation in the mills zone area in the current season, reports BSS.

According to official sources, almost 5,000 acres have been brought under sugarcane cultivation in the mills zone area here. The sugar mills authority has also been distributing seed, fertiliser and insecticides as loan among the sugarcane cultivators to make the sugarcane cultivation a success.

Man faces unnatural death

NAOGAON, Nov 24: One person named Mosleuddin was killed and three others were seriously injured when a power-tiller rammed into a tea stall at Dhamirhat thana in day light recently, reports BSS.

Mosleuddin died on his way to hospital. A case has been filed with Dhamirhat thana in this connection.

Foodgrains distributed

CHUADANGA, Nov 24: A total of 81 metric tons of foodgrains were distributed among the 2,700 VGF card holders under the special VGF programme in Alamdanga, Darsana and Jibon Nagar pourasabha here during the last three months, reports BSS.

According to official sources, 27 metric tons of foodgrains were distributed among the 900 card holders in each pourasabha. Each card holder got 10 kg of foodgrains under the special VGF programme, official sources added.

Auditorium after Syed Nazrul Islam

MYMENSINGH, Nov 24: Bangladesh Agricultural University has named its new auditorium building after late Syed Nazrul Islam, an organiser of the Liberation War, an eminent son of Mymensingh and the Acting President of the Government of Bangladesh in exile, reports BSS.

The decision was taken at a Syndicate meeting presided over by Prof Dr Muhammad Hossain, vice chancellor of the university. Syed Nazrul Islam was killed in Dhaka Central Jail with three other national leaders in November 3, 1975.

Cameraman commits suicide

MANIKGANJ, Nov 24: A commercial cameraman allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself in his studio at Shaheed Rafiq Sarak here on Saturday night, reports UNB.

The deceased was identified as Farhad, 47. Police recovered his body on the next morning and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy. A case was filed.

'No logic of hartals'

MADARIPUR, Nov 24: Home Minister Mohammad Nasim on Tuesday said the present government would discharge the duties given by the people as it has come to power with their mandate for five years; not through martial-law nor by any coup, reports UNB.

"It's not possible to topple the government by hartal, movement and anarchy. People will determine after five years whether Awami League has done good or bad," he told a public meeting here on Tuesday. The minister said it's not clear on what logic the opposition wants the resignation of this democratically elected government. "We have no way to betray with the people," Chaired by Madaripur district Chhatra League President Khalid Hossain, the rally was also addressed by Ajay Kor Khokon, Bahaudin Nasim, SM Kamal Hossain, Mahbubul Haq Shakil and Ilias Hossain.

Dacoity bid foiled

BARGUNA, Nov 24: Local people foiled a dacoity bid in the residence of Patharghata Thana Engineer on Sunday, reports UNB.

Family source said a group of masked men entered into the residence of engineer Bidhan Chandra Samaddar at about 11 am and tried to loot valuables terrorising the house inmates. But the muggers fled the scene when local people rushed to the house hearing the of the teenage girls of Samaddar. However, they took away two golden rings from the girls at gunpoint.

Seed crisis to hamper potato cultivation

JAMALPUR, Nov 24: The target of potato cultivation in seven police stations may not be achieved in the current season due to crisis of seeds.

According to Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation, over 25,000 acres of land have been brought out under potato cultivation during this current season. The police stations are Jamalpur Sadar, Sarisbari, Maledhara, Madengonj, Islampur, Dewangonj and Bakshigong.

High prices of seeds, chemical fertilisers and intermittent rains due to depression in the Bay have affected potato cultivation. Farmers now fear a poor yield despite its high production cost in Jamalpur Sadar and Bakshigong thana this year. In the neighbouring thana also the prospect of potato output is bleak.

Delayed cultivation of T Aman due to flood and severe river erosion and untimely rains aggravated the situation. Jamalpur Sadar and Bakshigong thana is famous for potato. Farmers said that the period from the last two weeks of the month of Kartik upto the first week of Agrahanay of the Bangla Calendar is the best time for sowing potato seeds. Some farmers in the Sadar thana said to this correspondent they have to pay usually Tk 750/- to 1200 for a bag of 80kg of seeds which had been sold at Tk 550 to 700 in the early season.

They said that the prices of fertilisers are also higher than that of the last year.

The government has kept a watch on sale of fertilisers, but there is no system for monitoring the sale of potato seeds, said farmer Alhaj Idris Ali of village Narayanpur under Tippalpur Union and Mahabur Rahman of village Kutamoni of Kendua union under sadar thana.

Agriculture officers said late cultivation will bring a poor yield of potatoes.

The martyrs are: Momin, Kader, Sahid, Soleman, Razzaque; Wahed, Riyad, Ali Hossain, Alamgir, Motaleb, Sariful, Alimuzzaman, Anisur, Tajul, Maniruzzaman, Masim, Razzaque, Kawser, Salek, Aziz.

Local people also said, Ranganga, 42, a housewife who went to the river Kumar to bring water with a jar for the heroes received bullet injuries and died on the spot. Pakistani soldiers also killed her.

She was buried at her family graveyard.

The news of their killing reached at the freedom fighters' camps at Abujpur, Alipur and other places. Thousands of freedom fighters arrived at Kamanna, but to the Pakistani forces had left the spot earlier. They collected all the bodies of

27 martyrs. They were laid to rest in five mass graves.

After the independence the local people constructed a 'sheared minar' to pay homage to the martyrs at Kamanna.

Earlier, ministers and other leaders visited the place and assured the local people of building a mausoleum there, but their commitments did not come true.
