

D'mondi, Khelaghbar win

On the opening day of the six-team second round, Dhamondi Club recorded a comprehensive 51-run win over Young Pegasus at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

Opener Shetu scored a brilliant 93 after Dhamondi electing to bat on a batsman-friendly track, piled up a huge 231 for four in 50 overs.

After a slow 77-run opening partnership with Anis (33), Shetu shared a 91-run second wicket stand with one down Imran (36).

Shetu was within sight of a well deserved century when Mustakim bowled him off the last ball of the 45th over.

During his nearly three-hour vigil, Shetu faced 137 balls and hammered nine boundaries.
