### Local engineers to run Raozan Power Plant

CHITTAGONG, Dec 3: The two units of Raozan Thermal Power Plant will be run by local engineers and technicians from the end of the current month as Chinese engineers and technicians will leave the plant on expiry of their contract with the government, PDB sources said, reports BSS.

Forty-eight Chinese engineers and operators out of fifty-nine will go back to China and their positions will be replaced by local engineers and technicians, who have been trained for the purpose.

Eleven Chinese experts will stay at the plant for assisting local engineers and technicians. The two units of the plant have been built by China National Machinery and Equipment Import and Export Corporation (CMEC) under a contract between the governments of China and Bangladesh.

### The turbulent days of 71

## The story of Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra

BRAHMANBARIA, Dec 3: The 'Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra' played an invaluable role in the Liberation War of the nation and this will remain embedded in golden letters in the annals of the history of independence of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

The provisional Mujibnagar government set up the 'Betar Kendra' when the Liberation War was being organised.

The Chittagong radio station was earlier turned into the 'Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra' which energised the people of the country at a very crucial stage of the movement for self-rule. But the transmitter of this centre was destroyed by the bombing of Pakistani troops.

Earlier, the law minister handed over crests of the 31 disabled students who won medals in the International Olympic '99 held at North Carolina, USA, in July this year.

A colourful procession was also brought out on the city streets to mark the day. A large number of disabled people participated in the procession that began from the Russel Square in the city.

At a function Labour and Employment Minister MA Mannan called upon the affluent people to extend their help for rehabilitation of the disabled.

He said, the government efforts should be supplemented by contribution of the affluent people in rehabilitating the blind, mentally retarded, and deaf and dumb persons.

He was speaking as the chief guest at a function held at Mirzapur Deaf and Dumb Centre. The minister also said that the government had undertaken welfare oriented programmes for the disabled.

Presided over by ADC (Gen) Muhammad Harisuddin, the function was addressed by social worker Sheikh Mohammad Jahangir, Ward Commissioner Syed Gulam Haider Mintu and others.

Earlier, Mannan took part in a procession organised on the occasion.

There was already a radio transmitter at the Titas gas field in the north of the Brahmanbaria and local leaders sent it to Colonel Salahuddin Reza in Telapara for the purpose of using it to contact freedom fighters. Major Khaled held talks with SDO Rakibuddin Ahmed about whether a radio station could be set up in this area and later requested the superintendent of the Brahmanbaria Industrial School Shamsuddin Ahmed to try to establish such a radio station.

Shamsuddin Ahmed used a limited power capacity radio transmitter manufactured at the electronics department of the industrial school and set it up at the free area of Titas gas field by adding additional equipment to increase its capacity. As a result, this radio transmitter was capable in covering Brahmanbaria and its adjoining areas.

That was the small 'Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra' came into being in Brahmanbaria. Those who contributed to this difficult task included member of the then National Assembly Ali Azam, member of the Provincial Assembly Lutful Hye Chhachhu and professor of physics of the Brahmanbaria Government College Iqbal Hossein, SDO Rakibuddin Ahmed appointed. Professor AKM Harun-ur-Rashid of the government college as its director. Local student leaders Jehangir

Osman and Md. Shahidullah were appointed associates. Shamsuddin Ahmed remained in overall charge of the station.

The radio station was inaugurated on March 26 and its programmes were broadcast between 10 am and 2 pm everyday. On the opening day student leader Yusuf went round the town with a mike and urged all to listen to its transmission. The programmes were transmitted on the shortwave band. Professor Harun and Jahangir used to read the news bulletin.

The news bulletins were punctuated by revolutionary, patriotic songs and two particular songs 'Amar Sonar Bangla' and 'Joy Bangla Bangla Joy' were played over and over again.

Prof Harun later recalled that their main assets were a record player and a few records. The microphone was placed before the record player during the transmission as they had no other equipment.

The Pakistani forces were met with stiff resistance when they tried to enter the town on March 28 as freedom fighters and people mounted obstruction. After exchange of firing near the Kudulia canal, the Pak troops were forced to retreat towards Comilla. Then came April 1. The day was largely incident-free but bombing was carried out by a combat aircraft in the late afternoon. Two Pakistani airforce planes flew over the town. They targeted the Titas gas field knowing about the existence of the radio station. The bombings caused huge inferno in the oil deposits and at the same time the assiduously built five-day-old radio station was destroyed. Osman and his associates had just gone out for tea when the bombing took place and were thus saved by a miracle.

The Pakistani troops did not stop there. With the help of local collaborators, they burned down the industrial school. Those associated with the radio station were put up on the 'killing list' of the Pakistani army and their lackeys. Their lives were in real stake.

The radio station represents a glorious chapter in the Liberation War which is not known to many people. The audio station played a critical role as it helped to keep up the spirits of the freedom fighters. He also provided the little stretches of real information about the war to the local people who were starved for news about the actual situation in the country.

The 'Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra' was on the lips of everybody during those turbulent days of the Liberation War. It not only encouraged the freedom fighters but injected an indomitable spirit in their valour and commitment. The short-lived radio station in Brahmanbaria is an integral part of our history.
