

**Border-Gavaskar Trophy updated**

ADELAIDE, Dec 10: An updated Border-Gavaskar Trophy will be presented to the winner of the three-Test Australia-India series which began at Adelaide Oval here today, reports AFP.

The Trophy, the original of which was first played for in 1996-97, is named after former Australian captain Allan Border and India's highly celebrated ex-skipper Sunil Gavaskar.

The Australian Cricket Board said the award will be presented to the winning side after each series.

India are the current holders after beating Australia 2-1 in India in 1997-98.

The updated trophy weighs six kilograms (13 pound) and is made from chrome-plated aluminium on a timber base.

Much of the money for the design and production of the modernised trophy has been provided by the Australia-India Council (AIC), a body formed in 1992 to help foster ties between the countries.

**Leaders up against defensive Bastia**

UNDATED, Dec 10: Monaco travel to Corsica for a difficult fixture with defence-minded Bastia on Sunday that could see them strengthen their grip on the French First Division, reports AFP.

PSG, meanwhile, know that they will have to be at the top of their game if they are to bring three points back from Metz and keep up the pressure on Monaco.

Sunday's other match sees two of France's best-supported clubs - St Etienne and Marseille - clash.

Marseille will be happy to be back on the pitch after a week that has again seen off-field problems take centre stage.

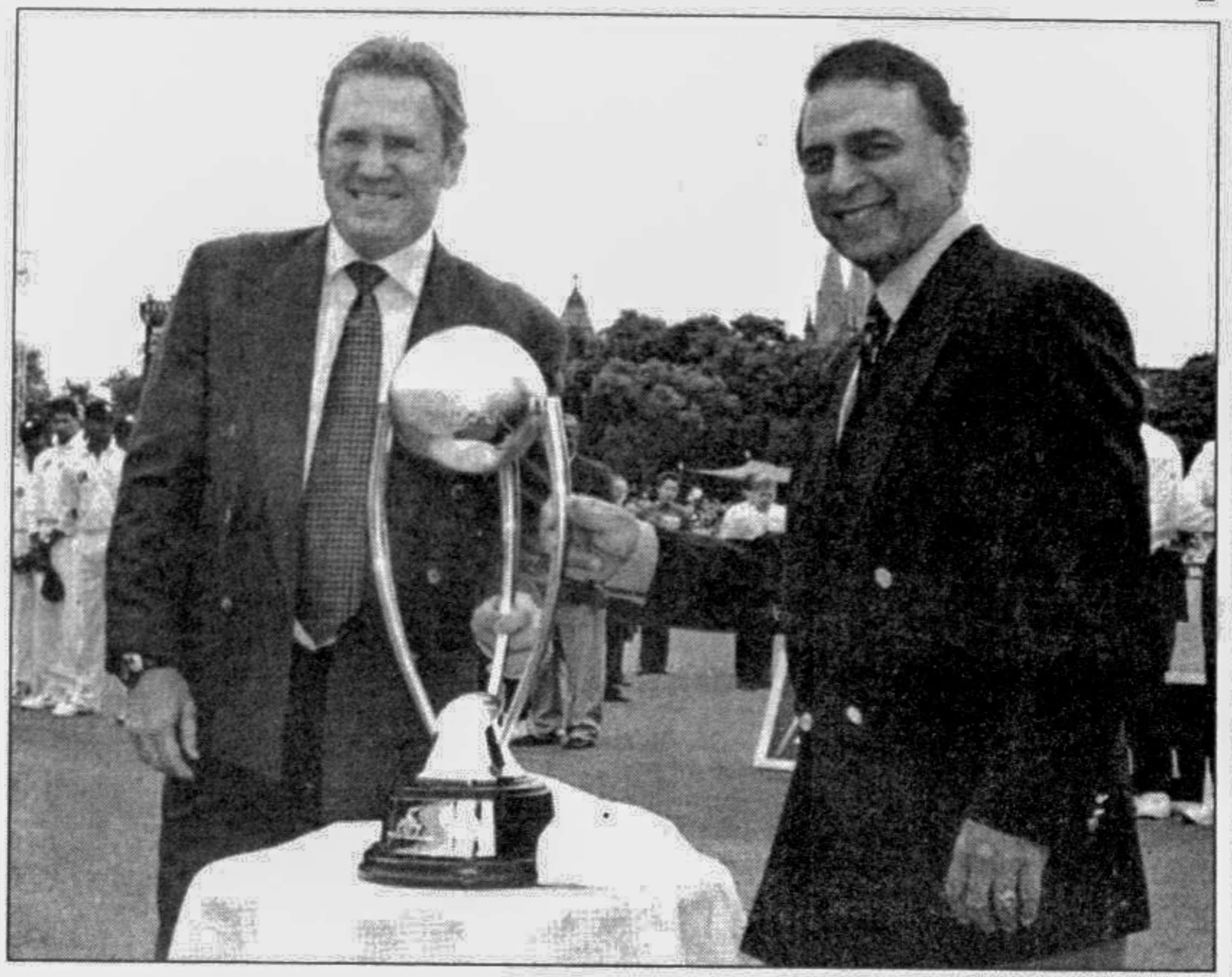

**Hereford dreaming big**

LONDON, Dec 10: Hereford United striker Rob Elmes will be gunning for more FA Cup glory against Leicester City on Saturday with the aim of becoming the club's 'new Ronnie Radford', reports AFP.

Radford will forever be a part of Hereford folklore for his stunning equaliser for non-league Hereford before Ricky George's winner dumped Newcastle United out of the competition at Edgar Street in 1972.

Radford's goal was even once voted by BBC viewers as the second greatest ever in football history behind the second goal scored by Diego Maradona in Argentina's 1986 World Cup quarter-final victory over England.

Elmes admitted: 'I've lost count of the times I've seen Ronnie Radford's goal against Newcastle on television.'

'It's about time we put the Ronnie Radford goal to bed and came up with another effort that will stick in the memory.'

It is a surefire guarantee that Radford's 30-yard rocket shot will be shown on television every time third-round day comes around.

Now, Birmingham schoolteacher Elmes is aiming to carve out his own slice of history for the non-league against Martin O'Neill's Premiership side.

The 29-year-old, who until 12 months ago had never played up front, has already enjoyed a taste of glory with his winner against Hartlepool in the second round.

That enabled Hereford to claim their second football league scalp of the campaign after they dumped York City out of the competition in the first round.

Victory over Leicester would catapult Hereford into the spotlight and he insisted: 'They are not unbeatable.'

'We have a dream game coming up with Leicester, a Premier League side packed

with internationals who have been to Wembley twice in the last three years.

'It's a great game for Hereford and the club's finances - but then you start dreaming what if...?'

Leicester are a good consistent side, a hard-working, honest team who haven't got any prima donnas who may not fancy playing at Hereford.

'But they are not unbeatable like a Manchester United or Arsenal. If we have a very, very good day and they have a very bad day, we just might sneak a result. We could produce an upset.'

Liverpool fan Jamie Robinson said: 'We could produce an upset.'

Former Arsenal favourite Bob McNab is set to take charge of Portsmouth following the sacking of manager Alan Ball ahead of the club's away trip to Premiership high-fliers Sunderland.

Portsmouth sacked England 1966 World Cup winner Ball after picking up only two points from their last eight league

games.

Despite spending more than 4 million pounds (6.4 million dollars) on players this season, Portsmouth are fourth from bottom in the First Division and only a point above the relegation zone.

John Aldridge gave Tranmere Rovers a boost ahead of their home tie against West Ham United by signing a new two-and-a-half-year contract with the club.

The Division One side have won six of their last eight league games under the former Liverpool striker and are also in the quarter-finals of the league cup.

Darlington's larger-than-life chairman George Reynolds claimed to have the ear of an even higher authority after his club were handed an FA Cup reprieve.

**Juve-Inter clash of the week**

MILAN, Dec 10: Coach Marcello Lippi makes a haunting return to the scene of his greatest triumphs as Juventus face Inter Milan on Sunday night when the latter built into world champions, reports AFP.

Lippi won three Italian league titles, one European Cup and one Intercontinental Cup before he quit dramatically last February after a poor run of results and a painful bout of locker-room turmoil.

Once the darling of the Delle Alpi stadium crowd, he will return for many as a sworn enemy on Sunday night when Inter take on Italy's joint league leaders in their Turin stronghold.

Lippi, who joined Juventus from Napoli in 1994 as just an up-and-coming coach, admitted: 'Sunday is going to be something special.'

The four years and more that I spent at Juventus are a reference point for my whole career.

'It's going to be a difficult game. And it could be decided by just one piece of skill from any of the extraordinary players on both sides.'

Juventus vice-president Roberto Betegga highlighted the mixed feelings about facing Lippi, saying: 'We've been through some great times, some really great times, both for us and for him.'

'That report doesn't change just because he's at Inter now. You can't erase the past... he's a friend who's coming back as an opponent.'

But Juve v Inter is also a part of Italian football history and from the kick-off to the final whistle he will be just another opponent.'

As for the home crowd, he said: 'I think it will be divided between those who recognise what Lippi has done for Juventus and those who feel the rivalry with the club he's at now. But as I say, once the match starts, he'll be the coach of the team we want to beat.'

'There'll be no room for

memories,' he reflected. 'That's the beauty and the cruelty of football.'

Lippi will be alone in having a few goose pimples before kick-off.

The coach brought goalkeeper Angelo Peruzzi with him over the summer and also hired two other members of his Juventus sides - midfielder Vladimir Jugovic, whose spotkick won the 1996 European Cup final with Ajax on penalties, and centre-forward Christian Vieri.

With Ronaldo out of action for at least four months after knee surgery, Vieri will be even more crucial to Inter's title chances this season.

However, the 50-million-dollar man can expect to come in for some special attention from Juventus' defence - the tightest in Italy after conceding just six goals in 12 games.

Chilean striker Ivan Zamorano is back from injury but with Alvaro Recoba scoring in each of his last three league matches, the 23-year-old Uruguayan is almost certain to get the nod as Vieri's partner.

Carlo Ancelotti, Lippi's replacement, will be fielding the usual attacking trident of Alessandro Del Piero, Filippo Inzaghi and Zinedine Zidane - all of whom are more or less returning to form.

The top of the Serie A table which Juventus share with AS Roma and Lazio on 25 points should be re-shuffled this weekend - potentially leaving Roma two points clear.

With many expecting a draw in Turin and another in Rome when Lazio host Fiorentina on Sunday afternoon, Roma can make the breakthrough if they continue their excellent away form in Bologna.

Roma have won four and drawn two of their six away games so far and Fabio Capello's men should be more than a match for a Bologna side who have recently had another bout of the wobbles.

Lazio and Fiorentina both looked flat as they settled for midweek 0-0 draws in the

Champions League against Chelsea and Bordeaux, although the Florence club were without suspended skipper Gabriel Batistuta.

Champions AC Milan are at home to Torino on Saturday night while Parma, who were third from bottom in late September and are now fifth from top, should continue their fine run of form away to Venezia.

**Petit calls officials stupid!**

LONDON, Dec 10: Arsenal's French midfielder Emmanuel Petit set himself up Friday for a confrontation with the Football Association after blasting 'stupid' officials, reports AFP.

Petit hit out in an interview with French media at the treatment of compatriot and clubmate Patrick Vieira, who has been hit with a six-match ban and a 45,000 pound (70,000 dollar) fine from the FA for spitting at West Ham's Neil Ruddock.

Petit slammed the punishment as over the top.

'I am amazed how stupid officials can be and I am outraged about the punishment on Patrick.'

'It is simple-minded, anti-French bias. After all, it was Ruddock who provoked Patrick yet all he got was a reprimand.'

'Football nowadays seems to be all about giving a good kicking to Vieira, myself or any other well-known French player in order to win us up.'
