Tunnel to be built under Karnaphuli

CHITTAGONG, Dec 13: The government has sanctioned Taka 3,76,10,000 for conducting preliminary feasibility study on a tunnel under the river Karnaphuli here, according to a press release of Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) today, reports BSS.

The Ministry of Communications has given permission to construct the proposed tunnel under the Karnaphuli to connect southern and northern banks of the river in the Sadarghat area. A bridge over the Karnaphuli or a tunnel under the river is badly needed in Sadarghat area for easy communications between northern and southern sides of the Karnaphuli.

Two economic zone and Korean EPZ are under development process on 2,700 acres of land on the southern bank of the Karnaphuli.

Japan International Cooperation Association (JICA) in its survey report has also suggested construction of a tunnel or a bridge near Sadarghat.

Anti-hartal processions in city

People from all walks of life yesterday joined peace processions and paraded main city streets to demonstrate their total rejection to hartal which disrupts normal life across the country, reports BSS.

The peace marchers along with leaders and workers of different units of Bangladesh Awami League and its front organisation chanted slogans describing the opposition-backed hartal as anti-people, destructive and enforced on flimsy grounds.

While parading city streets, they said the hartal was designed only to serve the ill motives of vested quarters now out to destabilise the pro-people government headed by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, said press releases issued by different units of Awami League.

The longest anti-hartal procession organised by Dhaka City Unit of Awami League was led by State Minister for Shipping and General Secretary of the party's city unit Mofazzal Hussain Chowdhury Maya, Bir Bikram. It started from Bangabandhu Avenue and paraded across Noor Hossain Square, Purana Paltan, Topkhana Road and National Press Club areas.

Addressing a large rally after the procession, Maya said the nation would teach BNP and its allies a good lesson for, what he said, deliberately disrupting people's peaceful life through their destructive hartal programmes. "BNP will never gain politically by resorting to armed terrorism and violence in the name of hartal," he told the rally.
