Abandoned property to be sold to raise funds

The government has decided to sell out some abandoned properly for funding construction of apartment houses to accommodate 5,000 guests during the Non-Aligned Movement Summit in Dhaka.

In preparation for hosting the biggest-ever summit meeting in the capital, tender for auctioning the abandoned property to raise funds will be floated soon, Civil Aviation and Tourism Secretary CM Mohsin told UNB yesterday.





The Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers' Association (FBUTA) yesterday expressed grave concern at the death threats to the Vicechancellor. Proctor and a teacher of Shahjalal Univer-sity, given allegedly by some activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student front Islami Chhatra Shibir in Sylhet.

In a statement, the FBUTA also condemned the attack on 15 journalists by 'Jamat-Shibir activists' during a public meeting of the four-party opposition alliance at Laldighi Maidan in Chittagong on Sunday.
