Asrayan project opens

RAJBARI, Dec 22: To provide shelter to the destitute and homeless people, an "Asrayan" project has been inaugurated at Tenapocha in Goalundo thana, reports UNB.

Kazi Keramat Ali MP inaugurated the project on Sunday and handed over the keys of the houses to the recipients. Six bar-rack-type houses for the homeless people were constructed on about seven acres of land at Tenapocha under the supervision of Army personnel. The authorities allocated 138 metric tones of wheat and spent about Tk 10 lakh for the implementation of the Tenapocha Asrayan project, where 60 families, who were rendered homeless by river erosion, found shelter.

33 uplift schemes undertaken

HABIGANJ, Dec 22: In a bid to improving rural road communication, the District Council here has undertaken 33 schemes under its annual development project for the current fiscal year, reports UNB.

District administration sources said the schemes will cost over Tk 64.60 lakh. The works include bitumen coating of 14 roads, construction of one passenger shed, four culverts and three foot bridges, renovation of two temples, repairing of one Union Parishad office, one dak bungalow and one community centre.

7 bridges under construction

GAZIPUR, Dec 22: In a step to develop the communication network of the district, Local Government Engineering Department is constructing seven bridges in sadar thana, reports UNB.

Construction works on the bridges at Mirzapur and Gacha unions are expected to be completed soon at a cost of Tk 5 crore. Another report from Manikganj adds: Dhaka Divisional Sports Association has sanctioned Tk 2.5 lakh for the development of five school playgrounds in sadar thana. The institutions are Garpara High School, Garpara Arzu Banu High School, Nabagram High School, Kuserchar High School and Muljan High School.

Iftar party ends in clash

MYMENSINGH, Dec 22: An Iftar party, organised by Nasirabad College Students' Union, ended in a fierce clash between two student groups leaving two people injured on Sunday, reports UNB.

Witnesses said the two students' groups fought a pitched battle over sitting arrangement in the Iftar party at a place near Naomahal Kazi office. Two first year students — Uzzal and Iqbal — suffered bullet wounds in the fight. They were admitted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital in critical condition.

BSCIC takes up credit programme

BAGERHAT, Dec 22: Bangladesh Small and Cottage Industries Corporation (BSCIC) has taken up a Tk 45 lakh credit programme in the district for the current fiscal, reports UNB.

It has already provided loans of Tk 8.83 lakh till November this year under its three projects, including self-employment and poverty alleviation, creating employment opportunities for 170 people, officials said.

Coriander farming on 1,000 hectares

MADARIPUR, Dec 22: Some 1,000 hectares of land has been brought under coriander cultivation in the district, fixing the production target at 2,220 tons, reports UNB.

Agriculture officials said coriander will be cultivated on 200 hectares of land in sadar thana while 100 hectares in Kalkini, 200 hectares in Rajoir and 500 hectares in Shibhalaya thanas.

Official sources said the board will construct 17 sluice gates, 11.4 kilometre cross dam and 3.91 kilometre riverbank protection work in sadar, Morelganj, Chitalmari and Mollarhat thanas. The work is expected to begin in January next. Of the total cost, World Bank will provide Tk 2.31 crore as grant for the implementation of the project.

Road construction project

KHULNA, Dec 22: The Roads and Highway Department has taken up a programme to construct and repair fourteen roads in Khulna district in the current financial year, official sources said, reports BSS.

Over Taka fourteen crore twenty lakh have been sanctioned for the purpose. Work of the project will start soon and is expected to be completed by June next. Communication system in the rural areas will be further developed after the completion of the projects.

Spurious liquor kills man

KHULNA, Dec 22: An unidentified man died allegedly after taking spurious liquor from a bar in the New Market area here Saturday night, reports UNB.

Locals said after the death of the man by taking the liquor, the employees of the bar left the body in an abandoned condition at a nearby place. Police recovered the body but later handed over to an unknown person without conducting post-mortem. Police said the bar don't have legal license to run the restricted business. It was learnt that the bar was once a den of notorious criminal of the area, Ershad Shikder, who is now in prison.

Problems grip Rajshahi goat, poultry farms

RAJSHAH, Dec 22: Rajshahi Poultry Farm and Goat Development Farm have been facing manifold problems for many years.

As a result, the two farms cannot fulfil the expected target. Rajshahi Poultry Farm, the only government-owned kind in Rajshahi Division, was established in December, 1981 on 15 acres of land. Out of the total lands, five acres are used for poultry farming, five acres for cultivation of foodgrains, 1.50 acres for pisciculture and 3.50 acres for forestry.

Since 1982 it has produced about 34 lakhs of chickens in 17 years at an average rate of two lakhs a year. Each chick sells at Taka 8. Private poultry farms, Non-government Organisations (NGO) like BRAC, PROSIKA and individual poultry rearers buy chicken from the farm.

At the same time, Rajshahi Poultry Farm has been working for extension of poultry in private sector through providing expertise to both the individual and group entrepreneurs.

"It has proved its efficacy in meeting demands of animal protein, poverty alleviation and social development, but the government has not shown keen interest for its expansion and development", said an official on condition of anonymity. There are 20 sanctioned posts of officials and workers for the farm. Of the total, four posts of officials have remained vacant for a long time and two others are working at another place on deputation. Lack of necessary manpower has been disturbing normal functioning. It has been suggested for creation of at least 10 more posts in addition to the existing ones and immediate filling up of the vacant posts for ensuring its effective functioning.

The main problem, however, according to the concerned sources, is frequent and long-durable loadshedding. "We do not have electricity for at least eight hours everyday which seriously hampers hatching and nursing of chicken", said an official. Loadshedding and fluctuation of voltage waste five per cent eggs, 10 per cent eggs hatch with defects and growth of 15 per cent chicken is retarded. Atack of various diseases also hampers its production. Meanwhile, the farm has no independent hatchery. The rest house of the farm built for accommodating guests has been used as hatchery-room.

The office-buildings and quarters have never been renovated since its inception. Rainwaters ooze through some roofs of the buildings. Plasters are coming off from the walls. Herbs and shrubs have already covered some walls and roofs. Most of the buildings have become damp.

The boundary walls have no barbed-wire fencing. Thieves easily enter into the farm premises anytime at day or night and steal goods. Official sources said, they have written to the higher authorities for solving their problems, but no positive result are in sight.

Eye operations in CSS hospital suspended

KHULNA, Dec 22: Eye operations in the Christian Services Society (CSS)-run Abdul Wadud Memorial Hospital here have been suspended amid concerns over the use of 'spurious' BSS (Balanced Salt Solution) saline, which allegedly damaged eyesight of eight patients.

There were only 13 out of 60 patients in the hospital on Monday who asked doctors to suspend eye operations.

Patients, whose eyesight was damaged, were under intensive care and were not allowed to leave the hospital until Monday.

Denying the charge of carelessness of the hospital doctors and nurses, the hospital authorities said the saline bags were full of bacteria.

The manufacturing company, whose area manager also visited the hospital on Saturday, has neither denied the charge of the hospital authorities nor taken the responsibility for the tragic incident. We are awaiting the report of the laboratory test, said an official of Opso Saline Company.

Report of the saline bags sent for test in Dhaka is yet to be received for which legal action against the manufacturer, Opso Saline Company, is being delayed, said hospital sources.

All sorts of eye operations have been suspended for ten days with effect from December 20, the source said. A medical team headed by civil surgeon of Khulna Dr Shukuruddin Mridha visited the eye hospital. Members of the team collected some evidence of law in the process of eye operations.

Sources said CSS runs another eye hospital in Natun Bazar area in the city where six patients also lost their eyesight in 1984. The authorities of the CSS, however, managed to hush up the incident, the sources added.

Shoals in Jamuna threaten river communication

SIRAJGANJ, Dec 22: With the advent of dry season and lack of dredging innumerable shoals have emerged in the River Jamuna, threatening the river communication.

As the water level continues to fall movements of boats launches are being hampered seriously.

The river communication between Tarakandi Sirghat of Jagannathganj and Sirajganj has been facing closure threat. Boats and barges cannot take full load as the river route is losing navigability at different points, increasing transport cost.

A huge quantity of fertilisers is transported through the route. If the boat service is disrupted, cultivation in the current Rabi season will suffer serious setback, local people said.

At present, each bag of fertiliser containing 50 kg is being sold at Tk 300 in local markets against Tk 270 last week, market sources said.
