Ctg complete Khulna-rout

Chittagong quite predictably consolidated their lead in the National Cricket League with an innings and 57 run drubbing of hosts Khulna at the Jessore Stadium yesterday, the final day of the three-dayers.

The second innings of Khulna, needing 201 runs to avoid an innings defeat, caved in for only 144, thanks to a painstaking half-century from Jamaluddin.

Khulna scored 159 in the first innings while the visitors, aided by a superb ton from former Bangladesh skipper Akram Khan, hit back with 360 for six declared.

Chittagong, with their fifth win in a row, tallied 22 points from seven matches and extended their lead over chasers Sylhet by eight points. Chittagong are also the only side in the six-team League who do not taste a defeat yet.

On the other hand, it was the first defeat for Khulna in seven outings that kept them glued to their previous collection of 6 points.

Back to the day's proceedings, Khulna, resuming the day at 18 for 2 in 10 overs, could last for another 57.5 overs to score 126 runs further.

Chittagong's left-arm pacer Anisur Rahman made a major hole on the Khulna line-up by picking up three wickets. Sensational Pakistani Shahed Mahmud then stepped in to mop up the Khulna tail with his enticing leg-spinners.

Anis, with his overnight haul of one wicket, finished the day with four for 23. His partner-in-crime Mahmud meanwhile captured three second-innings wickets for 64 runs.

The leading wicket taker in the League also took four wickets in the first innings. The Lahore-based wrist-spinner has

kept on tormenting all the Divisions to raise his astonishing haul to 39 scalps in only four matches.

For Khulna, middle-order Jamaluddin scored highest 56 off 103 balls with the help of seven boundaries. Jamaluddin apart, Asadullah Khan chipped in with 32 off 45 balls.

Khulna would not have crossed the three-figure mark had not Jamaluddin combined with Asadullah to put on 64 runs for the 6th wicket.

For his unbeaten 118 Akram Khan was adjudged man-of-the-match.

The eighth round will start from December 25.

Dhaka drub Sylhet

Dhaka cruised to their second consecutive victory in the National Cricket League when they thumped down a humiliating innings and 138-run defeat on the crestfallen Sylhet at the Faridpur Stadium yesterday.

The predictable win for the star-studded Dhaka was ensured only two hours in the morning after Sylhet, resuming their second innings on the final day at 41 for three, were bundled out for paltry 99 in 42.1 overs.

Sylhet were left with a monumental task of scoring 223 runs to save the match, but wickets tumbled like nine pins before the lunch break in the face of some accurate bowling from Khaled Mahmud and Saiful Islam, who evenly shared eight wickets.

Mahmud, who with his military medium pace took four first-innings wickets to shoot Sylhet out for 121, was equally impressive in the second innings, where he finished with four for 31 runs.

Veteran right-arm seamer Saiful, who returned to the form with four for 13 in his nine overs, ably supported the national all-rounder on rampage.

The defeat served yet another blow in Sylhet's chase for the title. Although Sylhet started the National League on an impressive note, they lost their way as the championship progressed.

Still holding a distant second position with 14 points, eight points behind leaders Chittagong, the cricketers from Surma Valley face a tough challenge from Dhaka to keep their current status in the race. A resurgent Dhaka are poised to push them down after collecting 10 points on completion of the seventh round matches yesterday.

Although Mahmud and Saiful stole the limelight on the final day, it was Javed Omar with a magnificent 187 set the stage for Dhaka's impressive victory. The imposing ton by the diminutive Bangladesh opener helped Dhaka to score a massive 358 for eight before skipper Aminul declared the innings on the second day.

Javed was adjudged man-of-the-match for his highest individual knock in the League so far.
