

Violence claimed 10 lives on CU campus in 10 yrs

CHITTAGONG, Dec 28: With the recent deaths of two Islam Chhatra Shibir leaders on the Chittagong University (CU) campus, 10 students have been killed in campus violence in as many years. All of the killings were the result of clashes between the student organisations.

The two latest Shibir victims are Abdur Rahim, a third year honours student of Bengali department and Mahmudul Hasan, a fourth year honours student of Finance department. They were killed in a gunfight between Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Chhatra Shibir on December 19 that also left at least eleven students hit by bullets.

In May this year a BCL and a Shibir leader were killed in separate incidents. Md Saiful Islam, vice-president of BCL Shah Amanat Hall unit, died from bullet wounds at Chittagong Medical College Hospital on May 24 after he shot himself accidentally in his hall room four days ago. Saiful was a masters student of Statistics department.

And the Shibir leader was killed in a clash between BCL and Shibir activists on May 15. The victim, Jubair Hossain, was a masters student of Economics department.

DU student, 4 others arrested from campus

Five people, including a student of the Dhaka University, were arrested from the campus in connection with separate incidents, reports UNB.

Campus sources said police raided Sergeant Zahurul Huq Hall at 9.30 am yesterday arrested Shaidul Islam Litu from Room No 217.

Litu is an MA student of Mass Communication and Journalism Department and a resident of Haji Mohammad Mohsin Hall.

He was a close associate of Mainuddin Ahmed Babu, president of Pro-Awami League Chhatra League of Zahurul Huq Hall.

Meanwhile, goings caught four alleged snafu from the TSC crossing when they were roaming suspiciously at 11 pm on Wednesday. They were handed over to police.

Incidents of mugging in and around the DU campus have increased ahead of the eve of Eid-ul-Fitr.

Earlier on December 23, four other alleged snafu were severely injured in mass beating while trying to rob two rickshaw passengers on the campus. They were caught red-handed with a revolver and three petrol bombs.

BNP secy gen condemns police search at Nabi Ullah's house

BNP secretary general Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan has strongly condemned and protested the police search at the residence of Demra thana BNP convenor Nabi Ullah, arrest of his elder brother Atique Ullah when they failed to get him and alleged misbehaviour with other family members.

In a statement yesterday, Mannan Bhuiyan also condemned the police raid at the house of Demra thana unit Jubo Dal president Alamgir Hossain and arrest of his younger brother in the same manner.

Termining the police action devoid of normal political culture, he said the more the government would increase its repressive measures, the more the opposition would grow.

He demanded immediate release of all the arrested leaders. In a separate statement, BNP city convenor Sadek Hossain Khoka also condemned the police search and arrest of both the BNP and Jubo Dal leaders at Demra thana on Monday night.

Khoka said that the government had resorted to repressive measures on the BNP activists assuming that they were detached from people of the country.

He warned the members of the law enforcing agencies against such illogical activities and urged them to play a neutral role while on duty.

CHITTAGONG, Dec 28:

Thirty-four ward commissioners of Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) condemned the ransacking of a charitable dispensary at Chawkbazar here today, reports BSS.

They said such inhuman acts are not desirable in a civil society, a CCC press release said tonight.

In a joint statement here, the ward commissioners demanded the identification of the culprits and punishment to those who came to the dispensary wearing masks. The miscreants drove out the doctors and other employees from the dispensary, exploded bombs and damaged its furniture.

The dispensary was kept open for rendering medical services in case of any incident or accident during the hartal.

The ward commissioners said those who ransacked the dispensary had committed an unpardonable crime and they must be brought to book.
