Army launches anti-drug drive in CHT

CHITTAGONG, Dec 29: Bangladesh Army as part of its anti-drug drive today destroyed standing ganja plants on around five acres at Guimara and Lakhichhara thanas of Khagrachari hill district, respectively, they said.

In line with the anti-drug drive, about 650 kgs of ganja, 30 grams of opium, two kgs of poppy, four kgs of poppy seeds and 400 grams of opium seeds were recovered in a series of drives conducted in various places of Khagrachari, Rangamati and Bandarban hill districts since March of this year.

Besides, standing ganja plants on three acres of land and poppy plants on one acre were also destroyed during the drives. The traders of ganja plant saplings near canals or fountains for easy irrigation immediately after the rainy season and they start selling of ganja leaves in February.

Members of the army in a separate drive also recovered 210 kgs of ganja which was subsequently destroyed, Lt Col Quadir told journalists who were flown in by a helicopter of the Bangladesh Air Force to witness the destruction of ganja plantation.

Major Nasir and Major Sharif, who supervised the destruction of the plantation, also briefed the journalists on the increased trend of commercial cultivation of various drugs like opium, hashish and poppy.

They said some unscrupulous drug traders of Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) have been encouraging the poverty-stricken hill people to cultivate various drug plants for quite some time by alluring them with big money.

They have preferred the remote and inaccessible areas in CHT for the plantation of opium, hashish and poppy crops as movement of the members of the security forces are restricted. On the basis of the secret information, army and civil administrations of CHT took the decision to combat the drug plantation and their abuse under the directive of the govt.

The speakers also expressed their opinions on taking necessary steps to preserve the memory of the Shilpacharya.

Presided over by Prof Mahmudul Haq, the programme was addressed, among others, by Prof Hashem Khan, Abdus Satter, Matlub Ali and Sheikh Sadi Bhulai. Prof Abdul Matin Sarker conducted the discussion while a number of teachers and students of IFA were also present.

The envoy, while referring to the excellent bilateral relations between Qatar and Bangladesh, hoped it would be further consolidated in the coming days.

Al-Mana emphasised on expanding economic and trade relations between the two countries and said his country may import vegetables in big quantity from Bangladesh.

Welcoming the new ambassador, Prime Minister said her government has given priority to agro-based industries and hoped Bangladeshi farm products would be able to capture the potential market in Qatar.

JCD submits memo to JU VC

By JU Correspondent Jatiyatabdhi Chhatra Dal (JCD), the student wing of BNP, submitted a memorandum to the Vice Chancellor of Jahangirnagar University yesterday demanding immediate arrest of the alleged rapists and killers who are seen roaming around the campus.

Expressing 'deep concern over the killers' and rapists' free entry into the campus and their stay in some student dormitories, JCD condemned the authorities' role for not arresting the students, who were ousted from the university earlier this year for the alleged involvement in killing and rape incidents.

JCD submitted copies of the memorandum to the Treasurer, Proctor and hall provosts. It said that it would form a greater movement if the authorities failed to bring the culprits to book.

Meanwhile, Gonotantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO), a conglomeration of left leaning students organisations, also staged demonstration on the campus protesting the return of the rapists and killers on the campus.

GCO brought out a procession Tuesday evening and held a rally at 'Prantik' gate. Addressing the rally, its leaders alleged that a vested group of teachers were conspiring to establish the rapists and killers on the campus again to fulfil their own political interests.

Campus sources confirmed that, some of the students who were involved in the killing and rape incidents at JU have frequently been seen roaming on the campus during the last two months. It has been learnt that they sometimes even stay in student dormitories during the right.

Warm clothes from PM's relief fund for CHT region

KHAGRACHARI, Dec 29: A total of two thousand five hundred blankets and ten thousand metres of warm clothes have been allotted for the cold stricken people of the three hill districts, reports BSS.

The blankets and warm clothes for poor people of Khagrachari and Bandarban districts have been allotted from Prime Minister's Relief Fund, the sources said.
