Army launches anti-drug drive in CHT

CHITTAGONG, Dec 29: Bangladesh Army as part of its anti-drug drive today destroyed standing ganja plants on around 100 acres in Guimara and Lakhichhari thanas of Khagrachhari hill district, reports BSS.

Acting on secret information, members of the Bangladesh Army traced four acres of ganja plantation at Dullatali of Lakhichhari thana and another one acre at the footstep of Kalapahar of Guimara thana. Zonal Commander of Chittagong Lt Col Mohammad Abdul Quadir told a group of journalists prior to the destruction of this harmful plantation.

Members of the army in a separate drive also recovered 210 kgs of ganja which was subsequently destroyed. Lt Col Quadir told journalists who were flown in by a helicopter of the Bangladesh Air Force to witness the destruction of ganja plantation.

Major Nasir and Major Sharif, who supervised the destruction of the plantation, also briefed the journalists on the increased trend of commercial cultivation of various drugs like opium, hashish and poppy. They said some unscrupulous drug traders of Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) have been encouraging the poverty-stricken hill people to cultivate various drugs for quite some time by alluring them with big money.

They have preferred the remote and inaccessible areas in CHT for the plantation of opium, hashish and poppy crops as movement of the members of the security forces are restricted. On the basis of the secret information, army and civil administration of CHT took the decision to combat the drug plantation and their abuse under the directive of the gov-

ernment, they said.

In line with the anti-drug drive, about 650 kgs of ganja, 30 grams of opium, two kgs of poppy, four kgs of poppy seeds and 400 grams of opium seeds were recovered in a series of drives conducted in various places of Khagrachhari. Rangamati and Bandarban hill districts since March of this year.

Besides, standing ganja plants on three acres of land and poppy plants on one acre were also destroyed during the drives. The traders of ganja plant, moling near canals or fountains for easy irrigation immediately after the rainy season and they start selling of ganja leaves in February-March, they said.

The envoy, while referring to the excellent bilateral relations between Qatar and Bangladesh, hoped it would be further consolidated in the coming days. Al-Mana emphasised on expanding economic and trade relation between the two countries and said his country may import vegetables in big quantity from Bangladesh.

Welcoming the new ambassador, Prime Minister said her government has given priority to agro-based industries and hoped Bangladesh farm products would be able to capture the potential market in Qatar.

BR to greet passengers by lucky draw Jan 1

Bangladesh Railway has made arrangements, including lucky draw, to greet the passengers who will travel by trains on January, 1, reports UNB.

To welcome the new century, the railway authorities will arrange lucky draws with attractive prizes on the day.

On the day, the lucky draws will be arranged on the passenger tickets of one of the inter-city trains from Eastern and Western zones.

The lucky draw will be held on the tickets of Dhaka-Chittagong-Dhaka inter-city train Subarna at the curtsy of commercial firm Micro Electronics.

Similar raffle draws will also be held on the tickets of inter-city train Padma that runs on Dhaka-Bangladesh Bridge East-Dhaka route, according to a railway press release.

JCD submits memo to JU VC

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), the student wing of BNP, submitted a memorandum to the Vice Chancellor of Jahangirnagar University yesterday demanding immediate arrest of the alleged rapists and killers who are seen roaming around the campus.

Expressing deep concern over the killers' and rapists' free entry into the campus and their stay in some student dormitories, JCD condemned the authorities' role for not arresting the students, who were ousted from the university earlier this year for the alleged involvement in killing and rape incidents.

JCD submitted copies of the memorandum to the Treasurer, Proctor and hall provosts. It said that it would form a greater movement if the authorities failed to bring the culprits to book.

Meanwhile, Gonatantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO), a conglomeration of left leaning students organisations, also staged demonstration on the campus protesting the return of the rapists and killers on the campus.

GCO brought out a procession Tuesday evening and held a rally at 'Prantik' gate. Addressing the rally, its leaders alleged that a vested group of teachers were conspiring to establish the rapists and killers on the campus again to fulfill their own political interests.

Campus sources confirmed that, some of the students who were involved in the killing and rape incidents at JU have frequently been seen roaming on the campus during the last two months. It has been learnt that they sometimes even stay in student dormitories during the night.

Warm clothes from PM's relief fund for CHT region

Khagrachhari, Dec 29: A total of two thousand five hundred blankets and ten thousand metres of warm clothes have been allotted for the cold stricken people of the three hill districts, reports BSS.

The blankets and warm clothes for poor people of Khagrachhari, Rangamati and Bandarban districts have been allotted from Prime Minister's Relief Fund, the sources said.

JCD organises discussion Jan 1
