Myanmar's foreign trade drops

YANGON, Jan 2: Myanmar's foreign trade, including the border trade, totaled 2.429 billion US dollars in the first eight months of 1999, a 6.14 per cent drop over the same period of the previous year, according to the Central Statistical Organisation, says Xinhua.

Of the total trade, imports were 1.604 billion dollars while exports stood at 825 million dollars, producing a trade deficit of 779 million dollars, the organisation said in its latest data.

During the eight-month period, the import value of capital goods, consumers items and intermediate goods accounted for 48.81 per cent, 39.26 per cent and 11.93 per cent of the total imports, respectively, the statistics show. The figures also indicate that during the period. the import value of the private sector amounted to 1.144 billion dollars, making up 71.32 per cent of the total import while its export value was 613.0 million dollars, or 74.4 per cent

of the total exports. The import and export value of the government sector during the period accounted for only 28.68 per cent and 25.6 per cent, respectively.

Foreign investment declines

Meanwhile, another report says: Myanmar received a total of 13.143 million US dollars of foreign investment in six projects in the first seven months of 1999, a drop of 94.36 per cent over the same period of the previous year when 233.359 million dollars came in.

The investment came from Thailand, India, Japan, In-

Myanmar experienced a sharp drop of foreign invest-

ment year by year. According to the official figures, the country received 2.3 billion dollars of the investment in 1996, 1.256 billion dollars in 1997 and 248 million dollars in 1998.

The sharp drop of foreign investment is attributed mainly to the impact of the Asian financial crisis which has brought about a reduction of 70 per cent of investment from member countries of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

According to official statistics, since Myanmar opened to foreign investment in late 1988. the country had drawn from 24 countries and regions a total of 7.101 billion dollars of the investment in 317 projects as of the end of July 1999.

IATA hails smooth millennium transition

MONTREAL, Jan 2: Aviation industry officials expressed satisfaction yesterday for a successful transition to the year 2000, with planes flying without incident, says AFP.

Pierre Jeannlot, president of the International Air Transport Association (IATA), an association of airlines, said that the regional surveillance centers established with the International Civil Aviation Organ-Isation (ICAO), a United Nations organization, report no year 2000 associated problems.

"There has been no impact on airline ability to offer normal services," he said.
