Baggio not leaving Inter for now

MILAN, Jan 4: Former Italy captain Roberto Baggio, who has been at odds with coach Marcello Lippi, said on Monday he would stay at Inter Milan at least until the end of the season, reports Reuters.

"I'm flattered that a lot of clubs have expressed an interest in me but I'll finish the season here at Inter," Baggio told reporters as the Italian soccer winter transfer window opened.

"I hope I'll have the opportunity to play soon and then at the end of the season we'll see."

Baggio accused Lippi last month of going back on his word by leaving him on the bench for most of this season.

The 1993 world-player-ofthe-year has made only six appearances for Inter since the summer and has played less than three hours of first team football.

Lippi responded angrily to the accusation and said Baggio was free to leave if he wished.

Bassio, who has been linked with several clubs in Italy and France, was widely expected to take Lippi at his word this month when the transfer market reopened.

Tournament organisers played down security fears for the 18-year-old who was signing autographs after a walkover not be prosecuted.



"But Balcells is a rare species, serving, volleying both balls (on serve and return). Henman has been preparing


hard in a bid to resurrect his career. He was world number five last year but slumped after Wimbledon where he was eliminated in the semifinals by Pete Sampras.

Singapore braces for TV feast

SINGAPORE, Jan 4: Singapore sports fans are in for a television feast as the city state's top two broadcasters jostle for screening rights to world class events ahead of planned expansions this month, reports

The Television Corp. of Singapore (TCS) will launch a new channel, Sportscity, on January 30 while cable TV provider, Singapore Cable Vision (SCV), unveils its fourth sports channel on January 15.

TCS, whose channels are free, has captured exclusive rights to the European soccer championships to be hosted jointly by Belgium and Holland in June, much to the chagrin of SCV whose football channel cannot screen a singic same live, the Straits Times reported

Tuesday. An industry source said TCS "paid a bomb" for Euro 2000 "to show that it wants to be a big player in the market and ensure that Sportscity becomes a regional competitor to SCV's four sports channels," according to the daily.

But SCV's vice-president Sandie Lee was quoted as saying the cable channel, whose programmes are for subscribers only, was negotiating with TCS to show some live games.

SCV has meanwhile won exclusive rights to the English FA Cup and Worthington Cup soccer and also the FIFA World Club championships which kicks off in Brazil on Wednesday as well as the European Professional Golf Association (PGA) Tour.

TCS has secured exclusive rights for September's Olympic Games in Sydney

"At the end of the day, the Singapore sports fan wins simply because there will be more live sport on TV," said Sportsci ty's manager for sports programming Riduwan Matni.

Wenger's advice for rookie striker

PARIS, Jan 4: Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger warned Arsenal's young centre forward Jeremie Aliadiere not to allow early success to scupper his career, according to Tuesday's edition of France Football magazine, reports AFP.

The Frenchman, who signed Aliadiere on his first professional contract in March, has watched him score about 15 goals in the under-17 side but warned there was still a long way to go.

"The danger is that young players have the feeling of success without actually having succeeded," said Wenger. "They are headhunted and

can think they are exceptional

although they haven't proved anything.' Wenger's warning to Aladiere comes after his bitter experience with French striker

Nicolas Anelka. Wenger lured the then teenager to Arsenal from Paris Saint Germain in the 1996-97 season and turned him into a French international before their relationship soured and the striker left for Real Madrid last summer in a marathon 37.6million dollars deal.

Wenger, however, had no doubts about Aliadiere's talent, indeed describing it as exceptional, meaning the player's ambitions himself are hardly far-fetched.

"My dream for the year 2000 is to playe for the Arsenal first team on a permanent basis," said Aliadiere, formerly of FC Rambouillet Yvelines and Paris club Racing.

Wenger added that both parties had taken a risk. "Jeremie took a risk coming

to Arsenal at such a young age. We also took one too, financially (...) Our common aim is that he becomes an Arsenal

PCB seeks Lillee's help

Akhtar returns home today



UNDATED. Jan 4 (AP/Reuters/Internet): Shoaib Akhtar is set to return to Pakistan on Wednesday to await the outcome of an appeal against his International Cricket Council-imposed ban.

Akhtar was last week banned temporarily after a nine-member ICC committee ruled that his bowling action could contravene the rules of

cricket. Pakistan team manager Brigadier Khawaja Mohammad Nasir said in Adelaide today that he had decided to send Akhtar home because the affair was affecting the team's prepa ration for the upcoming one-day

"It's not good for the team, Nasir said. "If you have uncertainty in your mind then it creates pressure and it's certainly a problem in concentration if you're mentally troubled.'

Nasir said Akhtar had remained with the squad despite being informed of the ICC's ruling a week ago in the hope that the decision might be overturned.

The Pakistan Cricket Board on Monday lodged an appeal against the ban and decided to keep the fast bowler with the squad as it prepared for Tuesday's match against Australia A at Adelaide.

Nasir, however, said he didn't know when the ICC would reply to the PCB about the appeal but added that he hoped Akhtar would be cleared to take some part in the one-day series between India, Australia and Pakistan starting January 9.

Meanwhile, reports from Karachi suggest PCB has sought the help of Australian fast bowling legend Dennis Lillee to help overcome the problems being faced by Akhtar.

The young fast bowler has been asked to report to a University in Perth, Western Australia, where he would be attending a four-day course in which efforts would be made by experts to correct the problems spotted by the ICC advisory

General Tauqir Zia, chairman of PCB told reporters in Karachi on Monday that the team management in Australia had spoken to Lillee to help Shoaib correct his action, but the fast bowling legend is on holiday till January 16. "But we did get in touch with Liliee and he advised us to send Akhtar to the university where they have the best available technical machinery and manpower to help him overcome his delivery

problems. Taugir also added that Lillee had promised that once Akhtar underwent the course at the university he would study his fresh video footage of his action and then give his opinion. "How-ever Lillee did tell us that we had nothing to fret about as
