

imported from abroad from affluent countries. These affluent people tend to wear their new clothes for a comparatively short period. When these are disposed of they ultimately find their way to markets of poorer countries through exports, some of these old clothes keep their shape, colour and texture that sometimes do not lose their appeal to those having poor sartorial standards and not much squeamish about using used clothes.

These markets in old clothes, once in the past, used to be called "Nixon Market" or "Reagan Markets." The implication of snobbery implied by these expressions now seems to have largely disappeared and the erstwhile hesitation among certain sections of people in buying second-hand clothes also seems to have evaporated under economic compulsions.

In many parts of the city sidewalks, the hawkers dealing is old clothes take up much of the pavements sometimes over-flowing on to the main roads. This puts the pedestrians off the occupied parts of the pavements, thereby enhancing the risk of accidents from the passing vehicular traffic.

It is a sad aspect of city life that there are many shelterless people in the city who have to pass their nights out of doors under open spaces in public buildings and even on footpaths. For these people, the advent of winter nights brings on sufferings which increase in degree as the cold spell intensifies. In some instances in the past, we have come across examples of donations of old clothes and blankets by some charitable organisations to such shelterless people. This is undoubtedly a noble gesture for mitigating their suffering to some extent. But because of the magnitude of the problem, such isolated instances of good deeds do very little by way of relief to their suffering.

There is, however, no denying that the availability of old clothes at cheap prices go a long way in relieving the poor people's sufferings. From that angle, the proliferation of selling points of old clothes all over the city seems gratifying, even though in some areas, they make heavy encroachments on

city pavements. It is alleged that there are cases of smuggling of imported old clothes across the borders to places where such clothing items fetch better prices. This is the regrettable part of the story. because it interferes with some humanitarian aspects of the
