## People of South Asia can reshape their own destiny

Visiting US historian Stanley A Woplert yesterday expressed his firm optimism that people of South Asia can reshape destiny of the region from a conflict-ridden one to a hub of peace and prosperity in the new century, reports BSS.

A distinguished biographer and author of a number of authoritative books on South Asia. Prof Woplert said Bangladesh continues to be the 'wisest tension softener' while neighbouring India and Pakistan have gone nuclear.

Presenting the keynote speech on "South Asia: Contemporary Scenario." at Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BIIS) the long time South Asia watcher Woplert, said security of a nation lies in the hearts and minds of its people which can not be guaranteed by the military might alone.

He said it is the allegiance of the people to its leader by which a country can best ensure its se-

curity and dignity. Prof Woplert said Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was able to achieve this allegiance because people of this country could recognise that they had been suppressed and exploited by a power that was

not their own. The US professor, who has authored number of illuminating works on politics and personalities of the region, plans to write a book on Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

In reply to a question, he expressed the hope that US President Bill Clinton would take initiatives to bring India and Pakistan across the table for a lasting solution of the Kashmir

He said Pakistan has been spending almost 70 per cent of its annual budget for military affairs and debt servicing. while Indian defence spending has also gone up enormously only due to the Kashmir issue.

Woplert also expressed the hope that different national slogans will cease to be a single slogan "Joy South Asia" (Victory for South Asia) for the peace and prosperity of the region in the beginning of the new

Earlier. Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad, who chaired the talk, assured Prof Woplert of all help in his great endeavour for writing the book on the Bangabandhu.




