

Maradona has heart muscle ailment

BUENOS AIRES, Jan 13: Carlos Benjamin Alvarez, personal cardiologist to Diego Maradona, said on Wednesday the controversial former Argentine footballer was suffering from a severe muscular heart ailment brought on by cocaine abuse, reports AFP.

Alvarez said that cocaine abuse would cause circulation problems in the heart. "That can engender all sorts of problems from a heart attack to ischaemia (a reduction of blood supply)," said Alvarez, who runs the Sacred Heart clinic in Buenos Aires, where Maradona is undergoing treatment after his latest drugs problems.

Alvarez told Argentine radio that Maradona would have to undergo a range of extensive tests before he could judge the seriousness of the problem.

Alfredo Cabre, Maradona's neurologist, meanwhile told the local media that Maradona appeared to have resigned himself to a long battle and had over the past year "suffered from deep depression... because of stimulants."

"Until last year he was doing positive things such as training, trying to lose weight and wanting to play. But last year he seemed to me to be more apathetic and had a resigned air about him. That's how he has been these last few days," Cabre said.

Maradona last week spent five days in a Uruguayan clinic following an alleged cocaine overdose.

Anelka out for two months

MADRID, Jan 13: Real Madrid's French international striker Nicolas Anelka will be out of action for two months the club revealed Wednesday after he underwent an operation to remove the inner meniscus in his right knee, reports AFP.

The 20-year-old, who became the costliest signing in Spanish football when he joined last summer from English Premier-ship outfit Arsenal for 38 million dollars, suffered the injury during Monday's World-Cup Championship match with Raja Casablanca.

The club's surgeon Alfonso del Corral said that there had been no damage to the rest of the knee.

The injury to Anelka, who will return to training in six weeks and should be fit to play a fortnight later, could not have come at a worse time as he had scored three times in the first two matches after injury and poor form had kept him out of the side prior to their arrival in Brazil.

Baggio may be in for more

ROME, Jan 13: The Italian Football Federation, stung by criticism of imposing just a one-match ban on Italian international Dino Baggio, said Wednesday they were opening an enquiry into his behaviour after being sent off in last Sunday's Serie A match with Juventus, reports AFP.

The Federation took the decision after it was amazed that the 28-year-old Parma midfielder, who played in the 1994 and 1998 World Cup finals, had not been banned for longer as he had spat in disgust at the decision to send him off.

Monaco too good for Troyes



PARIS, Jan 13: A stunning three goal opening burst by Monaco eased them to a 4-1 thrashing of Troyes on Wednesday, including a superb double by Argentinean Marcelo Gallardo, and extended their lead in the title race to seven points, reports AFP.

Monaco, who were 3-0 up within 11 minutes against a side unbeaten in their previous six matches, lead Lyon by seven points and Paris Saint Germain by eight after the latter two fought out a 2-2 draw on Tuesday.

Also on Tuesday champions Bordeaux hopes of retaining their title suffered another blow with a 2-1 defeat at Metz leaving them 15 points adrift of Monaco. Monaco, with only one defeat in their last 10 matches destroyed Troyes hopes of causing an upset with their stunning opening blitz.

Ludovic Giuly completed the amazing opening salvo by the leaders chipping the keeper beautifully from 20 metres to give them a 3-0 lead.

Gallardo had doubled the score sliding in at the far post after Simone's low cross had evaded a static Troyes defence and added the fourth with an instinctive shot after good work by Trezeguet.

Simone had opened the scoring with a superb curling effort from 25 metres out in the fifth minute for his 14th of the season after the lay-off from striker partner David Trezeguet, who created the third for Giuly as well.

The battle between Troyes' fellow First Division newcomers went to Sedan, who fought off a fierce fightback by St Etienne to leap into fifth place with a 3-2 win.

St Etienne didn't help themselves as they went 1-0 down when keeper Jerome Alonzo spilled the ball from a Sedan freekick and Geir Frigard pounced to prod the ball home.

Sedan doubled their advan-

tage before the break as Pierre Deblock scored from long range and then captain Olivier Quent added a third before Les Verts mounted a stirring comeback. They reduced the lead within a minute of Sedan's third and within minutes Julien Sabie's fierce shot from just outside the area had left Sedan with just a goal advantage.

African Nations Cup Nigeria leave Amakochi out

LAGOS, Jan 13: Nigeria's coach Jo Bonfrere has dropped injury-hit captain Daniel Amokachi and mixed youth and experience in his final squad for the African Nations Cup which kicks off in Accra on January 22, reports AFP.

Amokachi, who until recently played for Turkish side Besiktas, was dropped after doctors told Bonfrere the player had not been able to overcome a nagging knee injury.

Arsenal striker Nwankwo Kanu, whose delayed release for the country's build-up for the championship caused uproar here, is a key member of the squad and one of the nine players who won Olympic Gold for Nigeria in 1996.

Picked alongside him are Paris St Germain defender Augustin Jay Jay Okocha and AC Milan's defender Taribo West.

Nigeria's final 22-man squad parades several new caps including Benedict Akwuegbu of Australian club Graz AK, defender Efe-toboro Sodie from English side Luton Town and Tunisia-based Julius Aghahowa, one of the few successes at the FIFA World Youth Championship last April.

Amokachi, a 24-year-old forward, has impressed during the team's training stint in Spain and he is widely expected to win his first full cap when the Super Eagles begin their campaign against Tunisia on January 23 in Lagos.

Biggies eyes on Olympic gold

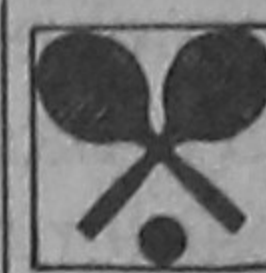
MELBOURNE, Jan 13: Six of the world's top 10 men's tennis players are slugging it out at an exhibition in Melbourne this week, happily ignoring the opening Tour event at the brand-new Sydney Olympic Tennis Centre, reports Reuters.

But even though big names such as Andre Agassi and Pete Sampras prefer to focus on next week's Australian Open, they're still looking forward to the Sydney Games with a golden glint in their eyes.

The 2000 Olympics in September have been one of the main topics of conversation during the Kooyong Classic, a traditional warm-up event for the year's first grand slam tournament starting on Monday.

World number two Yevgeny Kafelnikov, the defending Australian Open champion, said on Thursday a gold medal in Sydney was about the most valuable trophy he could earn this year.

Seedless men's semifinals Lindsay pulls through



SYDNEY, Jan 13: Defending champion Lindsay Davenport survived a tough test against perennial battler Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario while powerhouse Americo Mauresmo conquered fellow big-hitter Mary Pierce in the quarterfinals of the Sydney International here Thursday, reports AFP.

Anna Kournikova also made it to the semis after showing new-found backbone in a 4-6, 6-2, 6-2 success against Alexandra Stevenson.

The Russian glamour girl traded five breaks of serve in losing the first set, but breezed through the second. Stevenson then fell apart, barely winning a point as the number eight seed.

She said the near two-hour clash was ideal preparation for her Australian Open campaign. "I think it's a really good match for me to play before Melbourne, to hit a lot of balls, to have a long match, to have longer points," she said.

"Everything, win or lose, is going to help me for next week. I am really happy that physically I feel fine after a pretty long match."

In her sixth consecutive year at the Sydney International, Davenport will play Kournikova in the next round. In an all-French muscle match Mauresmo, who had to qualify last year, made short work of third seed Pierce, playing in her first Sydney tournament, whose poor serve proved her downfall.

Roost. "We played only one set but I felt pretty good out there," she said, dismissing suggestions that her lack of court time would affect her game going into the first Grand Slam of the season.

"I am happy with the way it goes, not too much too soon," she said.

In the men's draw, the field is wide open after the shock loss late Wednesday of defending champion Todd Martin to world number 77 Ivan Ljubicic, who continued his impressive form Thursday, ousting number five seed Karol Kucera 6-3, 3-6, 7-5.

There are now no seeds left among the four semifinalists. Australian teenager Lleyton Hewitt, who won in Adelaide last week, looks a hot bet after comfortably dispatching Romania's Adrian Panait 6-3, 6-4, despite swirling winds on the new centre court here which made playing conditions tough.

"My legs, body, arms feel fantastic," he said, after his eighth consecutive victory. "Feels like I've just started Adelaide to tell you the truth. I think I'm a much fitter player now."

He will play last year's finalist Alex Corretja of Spain who came back from a set down to dump Czech Slava Dosedel 3-6, 7-5.

Ljubicic, who fled Banja Luka in Bosnia as a 12-year-old in 1992, will play Jason Stoltenberg in the other semi-final.

The Aussie recovered from a set down to score a hard-earned 4-6, 7-5, 6-1 win against second seed Nicolas Pietrangeli who eked out in the third as a fiercely partisan crowd cheered the local hero home.

Agassi reaches final



MELBOURNE, Jan 13: Top-ranked Andre Agassi displayed the form he hopes will win the Australian Open, frustrating Thomas Enqvist with precision pounding in a semifinal of the Colonial Classic Thursday, reports AFP.

As an added bonus, he earned a long ovation for chasing down a sharply angled crosscourt volley and hitting a backhand passing shot down the line on a dead run that forced him to dive over a court-side barrier and roll on the grass around the margins late in the final set.

A brief lapse late in the second set, however, cost Agassi an extra 40 minutes in the heat before he won 6-2, 5-7, 6-4 in 1-42 against the fourth-ranked Enqvist, runner-up at last year's Australian Open.

"That's what this event is all about," Agassi said of the eight-player invitational. "You've got the top guys out there working hard trying to get challenged like that. It was a good day for both of us, great tennis."

In Saturday's final, he will play the winner of Friday's semifinal between Pete Sampras and Mark Philippoussis. "It was a great opportunity to take a step forward in my preparation" for the Jan 17-30 Australian Open, Agassi added.

"The tennis felt really good. I don't have a lot of complaints. I feel strong, I feel like I was moving well. I feel like I'm working my serve well, picking up the serve pretty well."
