PM tells Rotary confce

Democracy, peace a must for development: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said democ racy, peace and stability are essential for development and reaffirmed her commitment to continue democratic process for ensuring human welfare, reports UNB.

"Without continuation of democratic process, economic development will not be possible," she said while addressing the Millennium Rotary District Conference at Hotel Sonargaon vesterday morning.

Calling upon the Rotarians to involve themselves more in the humanitarian activities, the Prime Minister said: "We are committed to ensure a better life for the people by ensuring a democratic process.

She said the main problem of the country is poverty and the present government has concentrated its efforts in removing poverty and illiteracy. "We have won the struggle against our enemies, now we will have to achieve victory against poverty.

She said "Our targets include alleviation of poverty, generation of employment, eradication of illiteracy, increasing food production and ensuring peace and security of the peo-

With this end in view, the government has set up Employment Bank and started the Asrayan project for providing house to the homeless, model village project, old age al-lowance and allowance for widows and women abandoned by

their husbands, she said. Hasina announced that a piece of land will be given to Rotary Club by Red Crescent Society to construct a hospital for treatment of heart diseases with modern facilities.

The PM thanked the Rotarians for continuing their humanitarian service and also thanked the Rotary International for awarding Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman the Paul Harris Fellowship (Posthumously) in 1991 and honouring her with Paul Harris Fellowship in 1996.

Smoking, alcohol increase risk of blood clot

WASHINGTON, Jan 15: A healthy lifestyle diminishes the risk of the blood clots which cause heart attacks and strokes, a study published Friday confirmed, reports AFP.

Individuals who smoke, consume alcohol and don't exercise increase their risk of blood clots, according to the study by researchers from Queen's University of Belfast in Northern Ireland.

"Not only can individuals improve their cholesterol and blood pressure levels by exercising, keeping their weight at healthy limits, and not smoking, they can also reduce the tendency of their blood to form clots and help the blood to flow better." wrote John Yarnell. a leading author of the study.

KHULNA. Jan Chargesheet in Akimul Murder Case will be submitted to the court here tomorrow accusing eight people, including Ershad Shikdar and his first wife Khodeja.

Akimul, a telephone opera-tor of Lockpur Fish Processing Company was murdered by Ershad Shikdar and six of his armed cadres on the night of February 25, 1998 at the Ice Factory at Skid Ghat (River Jetty). But the case was filed on September 29, 1999 with Khulna thana following confessional statement of Noor-e-Alam who was one of the witnesses of the murder

Shikdar killed Akimul for having illicit affairs with Khodeja, the chargesheet stated. adding that the case was not recorded then by police because

Admission tests on 7000 vying for 850 seats in 7 Ctg schools

From CU Correspondent CHITTAGONG, Jan 15: About 7000 students are vying for 850 seats in different classes as admission tests in seven main schools in Chittagong began to-

Over 900 candidates are vying for 45 seats in Class Six and Class Eight at Ispahani Public School and College. Seven hundred and twelve admission seekers are contesting for 40 seats is Class Six while 200 are contesting for 35 seats in Class Eight.

At Nasirabad Govt Boys' High School at least 1356 students are vying for 205 seats. Of them, 564 are vying for 105 seats in Class Five and 792 for 100 seats in Class Six. For 120 seats in Class Four

at Dr Khastagir Girls' High School, 1562 students took part in the admission test.

A total of 2082 students are vying for 230 seats at Chittagong Collegiate High School. Among them, 1474 are vying for 200 seats in Class Six and 608 for 30 seats in Class Nine. At the Nasirabad Girls' High

School, about 600 students are contesting for 120 seats in Class Six and at Chittagong Govt High School 712 students are vying for 100 seats in Class Five. Meanwhile, 703 students are
