

## Speaker urged to resume question-answer session

To end evident sloth of the MPs in coming to the House, Opposition Whip Advocate Fazle Rabbi of Jatiya Party (Manju) yesterday urged the Speaker to resume the question-answer session to increase timely presence of the members, reports UNB.

Rising on point-of-order, the J Party leader thought that not only the opposition party members but also the government party members felt reluctant to come to parliament on time because question-answer time has not been allocated for the current session.

However, Deputy Speaker Advocate Abdul Hamid, who was in the chair, told Rabbi that the Business Advisory Committee would have to sit again to change the decision.

## 7000 arsenicosis patients identified across country

State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Prof M Amanullah has said about 7,000 arsenicosis patients have so far been identified in the country while 63 per cent tube wells contain unacceptable level of arsenic, reports BSS.

The state minister was addressing as chief guest a seminar on arsenic yesterday.

He said the government has launched a survey to identify arsenic contaminated tubewells and so far 80,000 have already been checked across the country. "Of the total tubewells, 63 per cent have been found arsenic contaminated."

## JICA chief lauds social sector reforms

Kimio Fujita, President of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), yesterday lauded the development programmes of the present government in various sectors including the social field, reports BSS.

Fujita particularly appreciated the social sector activities including the empowerment of women when he called on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her office at Bangladesh Jatiya Sangsad.

The JICA chief was very happy to note that Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is interested in the development process in the country.

Fujita described the economic cooperation between Japan and Bangladesh as "very productive". He also appreciated that Bangladesh has always responded very quickly to information needed for Japan-aided projects.

The JICA chief congratulated the Prime Minister for winning the UNESCO Peace Award and the CERES Award from the FAO and also for recognition of the 21st February as the International Mother Language Day.

Fujita, who visited the Meghna-Gumti project, said he came to know that five bridges on the Dhaka-Chittagong highway would be completed in next two months.

The Prime Minister welcomed the JICA chief in Bangladesh and said she would appreciate the construction of the Rupsha Bridge soon. She also mentioned Japan's support for construction of the Padma bridge.

## SAARC countries urged to take collective ventures in energy sector

MALE, Jan 16: Experts and business leaders of the SAARC countries suggested taking collective ventures for best exploitation of potential energy resources, reports UNB.

In this regard, they mentioned huge gas reserves in Bangladesh, coal and petroleum

in India's east and hydro-potentialities of Nepal and Bhutan.

Their opinions came in a technical session on energy in the 4th SAARC Economic Cooperation Conference in this resort city today where suggestion for the much-talked-about regional energy grid also came up.

S M Inam of Pakistan chaired the special session on "Regional Cooperation and Joint Strategies in Energy."

Among the discussants were Abdul Awal Minto of Bangladesh, Prof MP Lama of Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi and Nakechung Tsering of Bhutan.

Terminology was a prerequisite for national development, FBCCI president Minto cited poor consumption rates in the region that include 57 k/h in Bangladesh and 39 each in India and Nepal.

"Geopolitics should be separated from Geo-economics. Politics should not destroy our geographical advantages," he said mentioning the potential of trade in the SAARC region, especially in energy sector.

In this respect, Minto mentioned massive hydropower generation in Bhutan 95 per cent of which is exported to India.

"Why investment is taking place in Bhutan that uses only five per cent of its production? It is because they (foreign investors) know there is a huge market in the region."

MP Lama of JN University in New Delhi told the business leaders that only Bangladesh could generate 22,000-megawatt electricity by using its natural gas resources.

"India, Pakistan and Bangladesh can be a big umbrella of electricity by making a regional grid," he said.

"A strong block comprising all the SAARC countries will

bring more and more foreign investors, especially in the energy sector," he said mentioning the companies coming to Bangladesh.

Prof Lama, however, emphasised a massive reform in the energy sector as public-sector monopoly across the region is causing a huge system loss, non-realisation of tariffs and dissatisfaction among the consumers.

"In efficient management in public sector in the energy field has created a mismatch. It should be overcome immediately," he told the session.

Lama emphasised a concentrated and comprehensive effort across the region.

The conference had also discussions on SAPTA, competitiveness, Regional Arbitration Council, Telecom and IT, infrastructure and joint marketing of tourism.

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## Nikunja murder JCD demands punishment of killers

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), the student wing of opposition BNP, brought out a procession and held a rally on the Dhaka University campus yesterday demanding exemplary punishment to the killers of Nikunja Bihari Debnath.

Debnath, a Joint Secretary of Local Government and Rural Development (LGRD) Ministry, was stabbed to death by a gang of muggers near the Jagannath Hall of DU on January 11.

Addressing the rally at Aparajeyo Bangla, the JCD leader held the ruling party-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League's (BCL) cadre responsible for the killing.

They said the university campus is now a safe haven of criminals and accused the university authorities of failing to make it free from criminal activities.

JCD leaders expressed grave concern over the increasing trend of criminal activities on the campus lately.

Among others, acting president of JCD Monjur Elahi, Mufsi Bazul Basit Anju, Forhad Hossain Azad and Manir Hossain addressed the rally.
