Diego Canada bound?

BUENOS AIRES, Jan 16: Argentine soccer great Diego Maradona is expected to travel to Toronto, Canada to continue rehabilitation from a drug habit that left him in the hospital with serious heart damage 11 days ago, his doctor said on Saturday, reports Reuters.

Surely between next Monday or Tuesday he will travel to Canada to continue with treatment," said Alfredo Cahe, the soccer idol's personal physician.

Maradona fell ill last week in Uruguay, suffering from hypertension and an irregular heartbeat that doctors later confirmed was directly linked to cocaine abuse dating back to 1983.


The former star, considered one of soccer's all-time giants, has since been fed a steady diet of sedatives to strengthen his heart tissue and relax his nerves.

A Canadian government official indicated last week that Maradona, who was given a two year and 10-month suspended jail sentence in 1998 for shooting reporters with an air rifle, could be barred from entry if he were deemed "criminally inadmissible".

However, Canada's department of foreign affairs had no comment on Saturday and officials from citizenship and immigration did not immediately return calls.

Tame draw in Rajshahi

The three-day match, between the visiting Marylebone Cricket Club and Bangladesh Cricket Board President's Eleven, petered out as a draw at the Rajshahi Stadium yesterday.

On the final day, the visitors scored 222 for seven in their second innings before they declared an hour before the scheduled close of play. On Friday, they also declared on the same score in their first innings.

That left the hosts a stiff target to chase--199 in the overs remaining. They finished on 17 without loss in 12 overs.

Azam Iqbal and Sajid Hasan were unbeaten on seven and eight respectively.

Earlier, the tourists resuming on 41 for one in 25 overs, added another 181 runs off 73 overs.

Middle-order Paul Nixon with 68 and a patient half-century by one down Ben Smith provided substance to the MCC total.

The Kent wicketkeeper before retiring, battled for nearly three hours. Nine times he sweetly-stroked the leather across the rope. Smith, who plays for Leicestershire in the English county championship, faced 100 balls for his fifty hitting one six and five boundaries.
