Primera Liga short on cash?



Spain's cashstrapped top flight clubs this season were highlighted further this week following the close of the transfer window period at midnight Monday, reports AFP.

In comparison to previous years when bidding wars were common amongst the elite clubs, this year was unusually quiet, with more players sold then purchased by the Primera Liga's top sides.

The days when Ronaldo,

Suker, Romario and Mijatovic graced the grounds of the top clubs are over, and it now seems Spain has become the poor relation of European football.

The more extravagant Italian clubs made two raids on the Spanish league this season with those transfers exceeding the entire expenditure of the 20 teams that make up the Spanish First Division.

Dutchman Clarence Seedorf joined Inter Milan from Real Madrid for 24 million dollars. while Jose Mari Romero and Jose Antonio Chamot left Atletico Madrid for AC Milan at a cost to the Italian giants of 20m and 4.2m dollars respec-

tively. The signing of 20-year-old French international striker Nicolas Anelka by Real Madrid last summer for a Spanish record of 33m dollars from English side Arsenal was the only high point of the season.

However, Real are still awaiting a return on their investment and Anelka is currently injured and reportedly out for two months. On top of that, the Spanish media estimate Real's debt to be an astronomical 180m dollars.

One of the only notable transfers this season was the arrival of the first Japanese player. Shoji Jo, known for his speed and excellent technical skills, joined Real Valladolid from the Yokohama Marinos in January.

Last year, the Spanish media celebrated the arrival of Franck and Ronald de Boer at Barcelona from Ajax for an average of 19m dollars, while arguably the golden year of trans-fers during this annual shopping period was in 1997.

The Brazillian Bebeto signed with Seville, the Argentine Ariel Burrito Ortega joined Valencia and Christian Panucci of Italy teamed up with Real Madrid.

At the time with the ridiculous amounts of money being paid for television rights, most clubs were spending like there was no tomorrow. The introduction of the Bosman ruling gave the top clubs no bound-

Teams have started borrow-

ing players on loan to keep costs down and also have a look at their potential future pur-

chases. Shoji Jo has gone to Valladolid, young Frenchman Djamel Belmadi has gone to Celta Vigo from Marseille and the Aston Villa player Mark Draper is currently playing at Rayo Vallecano.

Only one team has been the exception to the rule. Real Sociedad, lingering near the foot of the table have spent 9m dollars in an attempt to save their place in the top flight. Coming in are the Russian Din tri

African Nations Cup

Group A promises fireworks



19 :(AFP): Cameroon rank among the most unpredictable of the 16 African Nations Cup qualifiers, a squad capable of lifting the trophy or going home after the first round.

Although seeded third behind co-hosts Ghana and Cote d'Ivoire in Group A, tradition favours the Indomitable Lions as they have not lost to either team nor outsiders Togo in the finals.

CAMEROON

Optimism stems from the availability of such wellknown players as defender Rigobert Song from Liverpool, midfielder Marc-Vivien Foe from West Ham United and strikers Joseph-Desire Job from Lens and Patrick Mboma from Cagliari.

But it would not be the first time the Central African country that placed the continent on the international map by reaching the 1990 World Cup quarter-finals in Italy, failed to match expectations.

Since reaching three consecutive finals in the 1980s - winning two - the Lions have fared badly by their standards, twice being eliminated after the opening round.

There will be no time to settle in Ghana with an opening match against the highly-rated co-hosts followed by a clash with second seeds Cote d'Ivoire that could decide who advances to the knockout stages. French coach Pierre Le

Chantre, 49, is confident despite the Lions being placed in the second toughest of the four pools, saying he can choose an excellent player in each posi-

He did have to omit veteran goalkeeper Jacques Songo'o because Spanish club Deportivo la Coruna refused to release him and Turkish-based Boukar Alioum is the probable replacement.

Preparations consisted largely of visits to French clubs with two wins and two draws. The goals came from Mboma and Job, a strike force that must click if Cameroon are to conquer Africa again.

The Lions qualified by finishing ahead of surprise packets Eritrea and Mozambique in Group 1 after Ghana withdrew when they and Nigeria replaced Zimbabwe as hosts.

GHANA

No Abedi Pele and no Tony Yeboah does not mean no hope for Ghana when they seek a record fifth Nations Cup title. Many observers here believe the absence of the best-known Black Stars will actually en-

hance the chances of success in

the group. Midfielder and three-time African Footballer of the Year Pele and striker Yeboah constantly clashed as two gigantic egos tried to squeeze into one dressing room.
