A six-member medical board has been formed with State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Dr M Amanullah as its chairman.



Metropolitan Mass Upsurge Day observed

The Mass Upsurge Day was observed yesterday across the country to commemorate the popular uprising against the Pakistani dictatorship in 1969 which helped pave the way for the country's independence, reports BSS.

Dhaka Urban Transport Project to ease traffic congestion

Heavy traffic jam and air pollution in the capital will ease significantly on implementation of the donor-financed Dhaka Urban Transport Project (DUTP), parliament was told yesterday, reports UNB.

Replies to a question, Environment Minister Begum Sajeda Chowdhury said the government was implementing the 237 million US dollar scheme funded by the World Bank to solve the nagging problem of traffic congestion and to control air pollution.
