No democratic crisis in Germany: Schroeder

FRANKFURT, Jan 25: The finance scandal which has hit Germany's opposition Christian Democratic party (CDU) does not constitute a democratic crisis in the country. German Chancellor Gerhard Schroeder said late Monday. reports AFP.

Lawmakers push US citizenship for Cuban boy

WASHINGTON, Jan 25: US lawmakers threw their weight Monday behind legislation to make shipwreck survivor Elian Gonzalez a US citizen, hoping to block efforts to reunite the motherless six-year-old with his father in Cuba, reports AFP.

Republican Senator Connie Mack of Florida introduced a citizenship bill he said would strip the dispute from the US Immigration and Naturalisation Service (INS), which has ruled that Elian should be sent back to his surviving parent's custody.

Instead, he said the matter should be decided by a state court that Elian's Miami relatives -- who have also sought to block the INS decision with a federal lawsuit -- have asked for custody rights, and made clear he thought the court should rule in their favour.

Huge waves sweep away 500 houses in S Philippines

MANILA, Jan 25: Huge waves spawned by freak weather destroyed 500 houses in the southern Philippines over the weekend, leaving more than 3,500 people homeless, officials said today, reports AFP.

Police said large waves swept away 300 houses built on stifts Saturday in the province of Tawi-Tawi, on the Philippines' southernmost tip.

"More than 3,500 people were left homeless and most of them are now temporarily staying in government buildings and health centers," said the region's police commander Senior Superintendent Damming Unga, who also appealed for re-

'Moscow still runs pervasive spy network in US'

LOS ANGELES. Jan 25: Russia still runs "a pervasive intelligence community" in the United States, a former Soviet spy told a congressional hearing here Monday, reports AFP.

"While working as an operative, one of my main directives was to find drop sites for mass destruction weapons. Stanislav Lunev told the House Committee on Government Reform, meeting here in downtown Los Angeles.

These drop sites were in or near the most densely populated areas, so that they could be retrieved or detonated at any time by ... operatives or special forces soldiers."

Lunev was a colonel with the KGB and the Red Army's intelligence wing. He defected to the United States in 1992 and is now in the federal witness protection program.

Thai police storm hospital, 9 rebels dead, hostages safe

RATCHABURI, Thailand, Jan 25 : Thai commandos launched a daring pre-dawn raid today to end a 24-1 our hospital siege, killing nine Myanmar rebels and freeing their 500 hostages unharmed,

officials said, reports AFP. "We were able to save all the hostages, we had to save them because they were patients," the commander of the raid, Lieutenant General Thaveep Suwannasingh told reporters.

"Nine of the rebels were shot to death in gunfights with Thai security forces," he said at the hospital in Ratchaburi, 120 km west of Bangkok, which was seized by the gunmen early

Security forces launched their assault before dawn Tuesday after a night of intense negotiations with rebels from God's Army, an ethnic Karen group led by 12-year-old twins, bitter enemies of Myanmar's military rulers.

Government spokesman Akapol Sorasuchart who initially said there were 16 junmen and five had escaped, later

retracted the statement. "Nine were killed and one ran away, we are looking for him and will bring him to the courts for violating Thai law,

"If we had prolonged the situation it would have got worse for the patients," Akapol said, declaring the operation a suc-

Ambulances and police vans were seen by an AFP reporter bringing out hostages, many of whom appeared badly shaken.

Thirty commandos involved in the assault marched out of the hospital in formation, to applause from nurses and onlookers.

Before the dawn raid, the gunmen released around 100 people, including an eight-yearold boy who had just undergone brain surgery.

The commando raid, which started almost 24 hours after the siege began, was heralded by a string of explosions and concentrated automatic gunfire. A helicopter hovered overhead shining a spotlight on the sprawling complex as Thai police and army vehicles sped into

the compound Police said earlier that the fighters, aged between 14 and 30, had rigged up a bomb at the entrance to the hospital and threatened to detonate it if Thai forces tried to oust them.

They were also said to have set up bombs throughout the hospital. Local television reports said

some Thai troops might have infiltrated the hospital before the raid disguised as patients. Hours before the assault, Prime Minister Chuan Leekpai

drove to Ratchaburi, near the

Myanmar border, for a briefing with military chiefs. His Interior Minister Sanan Kachornprasart had appealed to the rebels to surrender, saying they could be sure of a fair

Siddique revealed at the press conference that the United States had approved an annual budget of \$500,000 for the Fiji Military Forces' educational programme.

The programme was earlier suspended in 1987 after two military coups.

Siddique said Fiji was a great partner in the international community's peacekeeping programme. Fiji is the only country in

East Asia to have the US peacekeeping programme, the Fiji Times reported.

While writing about Osman Siddique, the Fiji times also mentioned that Osman Siddique, of McLean Virginia, has served on several presidential delegations, including the White House Conference on Travel and Tourism. He received his MBA from Indiana University in 1974 and is married with four children.

The Bangladesh born Siddique arrived in the US in the early 70s with no money and worked his way through Indiana University, doing odd jobs to finally become a travel agent and then open his own travel agency which is one of the leaders of the travel business on the Internet.

Osman Siddique is the first South Asian expatriate and the first Muslim to be appointed ambassador by the United States. His appointment by the US president was ratified by the Senate.

The Bangladeshi-American took his oath in August, 1999 in Washington, DC on both the Quran and the Bible, with the holy Quran placed on the top. Osman Siddique, son of late
