China keep Olympic hopes alive

YAMAGA, Japan, Jan 28: China staged a come-from-behind victory in the last three minutes to beat Japan 24-23 in the Asian handball championships today and kept their hopes of making and Olympic berth alive, reports AFP.

The Chinese women, who ended at fourth in the Asian Games behind bronze medallists Japan, slipped away a 4-0 lead in the beginning and they were 22-23 down with less than three minutes to go.

But Li Jianfang tied it with her seventh goal of the day and then Chen Ji struck home the decider with 1:03 minutes to go. while goal keeper Yu Geli showed excellent savings at crucial moments.

It was China's second win with one draw for five points in the five-nation round robin. The winners will be eligible for the Sydney Olympics.

Atlanta Olympic silver medallists South Korea had a rest day Friday after winning their three games for six points and they will take on China Saturday, vying for a place in the Olympics.

In the men's competition in Kumamoto, Taiwan gained their first win in the three games by beating winless Iran 27-18 with point-getter Tan Tsung-shang breaking through the tight Iranian defence to score seven goals.

MOSCOW, Jan 28: World indoor 60 metres record holder Irina Privalova finished second in her first international appearance over hurdles on Thursday, reports Reuters.

She was one-tenth of a second behind Russian champion Yulia Graudyn at an indoor meeting in Moscow. Graudyn clocked 8.06 seconds.

European champion Svetla Dimitrova of Bulgaria was a disappointing fifth in 8.27.

Privalova was in front after coming out of the blocks but was caught after the third hurdle by Graudyn.

"I'm still losing time going over the hurdles," said Privalova, who is considering a switch from sprinting to hurdling to revive an injuryplagued career. "Right now I'm taking hur-

dles as part of my training for the outdoor season but, who knows, if it really goes well I may stick to it in the future.' Graudyn was less than im-

pressed by Privalova's hurdling technique. "It's still far from perfect," she said. "I don't think we have to worry about her yet.'

Russian shot putter Larisa Peleshenko returned to competition after a two-year doping ban to set a world best mark for the season of 20.36 metres. Former Olympic champion Svetana Kriveleva was a distant second with 19.45.

Hingis faces Wimbledon

MELBOURNE, Jan 28 (Reuters/AP): Lisa Raymond and Rennae Stubbs stopped Martina Hingis from winning her fourth straight Australian Open women's doubles final today, beating the Swiss star and partner Mary Pierce 6-4, 5-7, 6-

Hingis and Pierce, seeded third, managed to fend off two match points but top seeds Raymond and Stubbs took the match and their first Grand Slam title when Hingis slapped a forehand return long.

The two pairs traded several service breaks in the final set as the match grew more intense. but Raymond and Stubbs eventually won out by consistently drilling the ball to Pierce.

Raymond, an American, and her Australian partner put an end to Hingis's bid for a record four straight wins in the doubles and singles at Melbourne Park, but Hingis is still supremely confident she will be able to win the singles title on Saturday.

The Swiss teenager first won the Australian Opens doubles championship in 1997 with Natasha Zvereva, then again with Mirjana Lucic, and last year with Anna Kournikova.

In the men's competition, Mark Woodfore and Todd Woodbridge's quest for a 55th career doubles title faltered Thursday when they were ousted in the semifinals by Ellis Ferreira and Rick Leach.

The Woodies, as they're known Down Under, seemingly had the match won until Ferreira and Leach fought back from 1-4 down in the third to clinch a 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 victory on center court at Melbourne Park. Ferreira and Leach will meet

Ottey gains support

BERLIN, Jan 28: The organisers of a German indoor athletics meet said on Thursday they were sticking to their decision to allow Jamaican sprin er Merlene Ottey, who is at the centre of a doping controversy, to race this weekend, reports

The organisers of Saturday's Karlsruhe indoor meeting said they would let Ottey race, despite appeals from the International Amateur Athletic Federation (IAAF) and the German Athletics Federation (DLV) not to invite the former 200-metres world champion.

"Ottey is innocent because she has been cleared by her national association," Karlsruhe meeting organiser Siegfried Koenig said, adding that at the moment there were no charges outstanding against her.

Another of the race organisers, Alain Blondel, said the IAAF letter had both confirmed that Ottey could take part in the race, but simultaneously advised against such a move.

Ottey tested positive for the banned steroid nandrolone at a Grand Prix meeting in Lucerne last July, but was later cleared by her national athletics federation of doping.

The IAAF is reviewing that decision, and the 39-year-old Ottey is entitled to race until an arbitration panel ruling expected at the end of February.

The Ottey case coincides with a doping scandal surrounding German middle-distance runner Dieter Baumann, who was suspended by the DLV after testing positive, also for nandrolone.

The DLV is seeking to impose a two-year ban on Baumann, but the former Olympic champion is fighting to clear his name.

A long-time anti-doping campaigner, Baumann says he was the victim of a plot to discredit him in which unknown perpetrators spiked his toothpaste with the forbic len steroid.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN NOTEBOOK

MELBOURNE, Jan 28 (AP): After edging Pete Sampras in a five-set classic at the Australian Open semifinals, Andre Agassi said he was looking forward to teaming up with his fellow American in the Davis Cup opener next week.

But his prospects of joining Sampras on the Davis Cup team against Zimbabwe were erased Friday when the No 3-ranked Sampras withdrew from the squad due to a hip injury he sustained in the semifinal.

The top-seeded Agassi has advanced to the first Grand Slam final of the millennium but is already thinking about the US vs Zimbabwe Davis Cup clash starting Feb 4 in Harare.

"I feel you have to prove you are No 1 every time you are on a tennis court ... I want to do it next week in Zimbabwe and continue it," he said.

Sampras has a muscle tear injury to his hip-flexor and is expected to be sidelined for three to four weeks. Although he said if he's fit and if the US advances, he'll make himself available for the second round of the Davis Cup in April.
