Erosion takes serious turn in dists

Erasion by the rivers Padma. Jamuna, Mohananda, has taken a devastating turn in Chapai Nawabgani, Manikgani and Sariatpur districts.

Our Chapai Nawabganj correspondent reports: Erosion by the rivers Padma and Mohananda has taken a serious turn due to fall in water level of the rivers.

It has caused havoc in two thanas. Director of the river has also attributed to such erosion.

Uzirpur, Panka UP of Shipganj and Narayanpur. Sundarpur. Char Bagdanga, Anupnagar and Alatuly UP of Nawabganj Sadar are situated on the bank of the Padma and the Mohananda. Erosion is a common phenomenon in these areas, but no step has been taken so far to check the ero-

sion. During the last two years thousands of families have already become homeless by such erosion. Seriously effected areas are Uzirpur, Panka, Nabupat, Babupur, Radhakantapur, Zandipur, Narayanpur, Surja Narayanpur, Zoharpur, Anupnagar and Tiklichar villages of the two thanas.

This year erosion by the two rivers has rendered thousands of families homeless. Many mosques, schools, madrashas. college and mango gardens. bamboo gardens have gone under water.

The Padma has also been eroding the Bangladesh side, because the Indian side has been shifted by the boulder stone. The river has been shifting into Bangladesh territory. The Padma and the Mohananda have been devouring fresh areas of the two thanas.

Drug addicts up in B'baria district

BRAHMANBARIA, Jan 30: The number of drug addicts is rising alarmingly causing concern among the peace loving

Drug Control Department. Brahmanbaria circle field 45 cases and arrested 12 persons during the last 12 month in this connection.

Most of the addicts are unemployed youths, unruly young boys, rickshawpullers, sweepers and transport workers. Drug addicts mainly used the

banned Indian phensidyl syrup. rectified spirits and Chuli wine which are available in ordinary places, people alleged. In order to meet the cost of

drugs, the addicts are engaged in various anti-social activities including stealing, hijacking, mugging, snatching and smuggling, people added.

According to social rkers and leaders lack of . sper awareness, frustration, family trouble and frustration in live are the main causes for increasing the number of drug addicts in the district.

Local people alleged that frustrated boys and addicts being failed to procure money from other places or sources take shelter under some cadres of the areas who easily recruit them and train them as criminals. The whole process is continuing under the patronage of certain 'big boss' of some political parties.

When criminals are arrested the political leaders rush to the police station to ensure their re-

Local people alleged, that after sun set the addicts gather at Old Court Building, Kachary Pokur Par, Tanbazar, Public Call Office (PCO) and rail station areas of the town for taking various drugs.

The In-Charge of PCO has alleged that some addicts in the guise of telephone caller come to his office and go to the toilet

The still unidentified disease has been taking its toll on the trees for the last four or five years. At first the disease attacks the leaves of a tree and after three or five months causes its death.

According to reports, nearly 20 lakh sissoo trees have died during the period in Jessore. Jhenaidah, Chuadanga, Meherpur, Kushtia and Satkhira districts.

When contacted an official of Forest Department, Jessore said pesticides can protect the trees.

Some nursery owners in Jessore district said buyers are now reluctant to buy sissoo saplings as the grown up trees are dying. They have urged the authorities concerned to take proper steps to address the problem.

Murderer gets life term




