'Men need to change their attitude towards women'

Men have to change their attitude towards women as both of them have equal contribution towards building up of the society, observed speakers at a publishing ceremony of a book, *Sangrami Nari Juge Juge* (struggling women for decades), in the city yesterday.

The publishing ceremony of two parts of the book, published by Bangladesh Nari Pragati Sangstha (BNPS), was organised at Vaskar Novera auditorium yesterday afternoon.

Rokeya Kabir, the executive director of the organisation, presided over the programme while National Professor Kabir Chowdhury was present as chief guest. Among others, prominent journalist Santosh Gupta, sociologist Professor Rangalal Sen, historian Professor Salahuddin Ahmed took part in discussion about the book.

The book will inspire the women of the next generation and help the men to increase their respect towards women, speakers said during the discussion.

Kabir Chowdhury unveiled the jacket of the book before the discussion meeting. Flowers and copies of the book were distributed among the women, focused in the book who were present at the ceremony.

Santosh Gupta said that women have occupied a position of their own in the society with their contribution and they have to be more organised to go forward.

Referring to the incident at TSC on the thirty first night he expressed his anger saying "Some people questioned why the victim was there or what was she doing there at 2 am but no one questions when that why joint secretary Nukuja Bihari was travelling alone at 6 am when he was murdered."

Professor Sen said that the book contains a chronological history of a struggle of women of West Bengal and Bangladesh over the last seventy years or more. He also suggested that publishers of the book be more careful while collecting information and editing a book.

Professor Salahuddin said the book is about those two hundred women who have moved against exploitation and torture at the hands of the male dominated society, participated in various movements and had contributed in the Liberation War.

He thanked the publishers saying that they have produced a historical document by bringing out the book.

Fundamental and communal forces always oppose progress of women and they first target women of minorities, Professor Kabir Chowdhury said.

"We want equal laws for men and women in this civilised society and we have to work for this," Professor Chowdhury added.

President lauded for not granting audience to Jamaat chief

Leaders of different political parties, forums, professional bodies and eminent intellectuals yesterday lauded President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed for not giving audience to Jamaat chief Golam Azam.

In separate interviews with BSS, they said the nation would remain grateful to the president as he has honoured the demand of the people who have been asking for the trial of Golam Azam and other war criminals of 1971 for a long time.

The leaders and intellectuals said this is for the first time that the highest dignified office of the country has taken a move to discard the Jamaat chief and his associates accused of widespread genocide, rape, loot and arson.

Greeting the presidential denial of Golam Azam and five others of the Jamaat-e-Islami party, the leaders and intellectuals observed that the president should not also see the remaining leaders of the Jamaat.

The Bangladesh Nari Pragati Sangstha, in a note blasting the misleading statement of Jamaat leader Muhammad Quamruzzaman to the press on Friday, said five Jamaat leaders were given approval to meet the president dropping six from an original list of 11 Jamaat leaders which included Golam Azam.

Prof Sayeed says Opposition parties don't believe in people's power

PABNA, Feb 5: State Minister for Information Prof. Abu Sayeed has said that the opposition parties believed in the power of terrorism not in people's power as they were formed after seizing power through terrorism, reports BSS.

"As they do not believe in the people's verdict but rely on anarchy they are killing police, rickshawpullers, truck and bus drivers and innocent people by hurling bombs to create political instability isolating themselves from the people," the state minister said at the foundation laying ceremony of Shaheed Abdul Khaleque Stadium at Bera thana of the district yesterday.

The State Minister for Youth, Sports and Cultural Affairs Obaidul Kader and State Minister for Information Prof. Abu Sayeed jointly laid the foundation stone of the stadium.

Prof Sayeed said terrorism activities were being conducted from the party offices including main office of BNP instead of promoting political activities. The bombs made in the party offices are being hurled on the people even the party terrorists becoming victims of these suicidal bomb explosions, Prof. Sayeed said.
