

Maldini not going anywhere

MILAN, Feb 5: Italian international captain Paolo Maldini laughed off a newspaper report on Friday that he would move to Chelsea after the Euro 2000 Championship, reports Reuters.

Maldini was quoted in Britain's The Mirror newspaper as saying: "I would love to move to England and, in particular, Chelsea."

But on AC Milan's official website, the defender, who will turn 32 during Euro 2000, denied the report.

"I'll say now as I have on previous occasions that it gave me a good laugh," Maldini said. "I want to finish my career at Milan. I have a long contract and I intend to respect it, as does the club. One thing is certain, there has been no contact between me and Chelsea."

If Maldini were to join the Londoners he would link up with Italians Gianfranco Zola, Roberto di Matteo, Luca Peracchi, Gabriele Ambrosini, Carlo Cudicini and coach Gianluca Vialli.

He would also renew links with former Milan players Marcel Desailly and Ray Wilkins, now Chelsea's first team coach.

Maldini made his debut for Milan, his only club, as a 16-year-old in January 1985 — becoming the youngest player in Milan's history. He has since gone on to play 419 league matches, scoring 22 league goals.

With 103 appearances for Italy he is the country's uncapped outfield player, second only to goalkeeper Dino Zoff (112 caps) in the all-time list.

Di Stefano, Kubala honoured

MADRID, Feb 5: Alfredo Di Stefano and Ladislao Kubala, two of the greatest players in the history of Spanish soccer, have both been awarded the Gran Cruz of the Royal Order of Merit, the government announced on Friday, reports Reuters.

Di Stefano, born in Argentina, and Kubala, from Hungary, both became naturalised Spaniards, debuting for their adopted country in the 1950s.

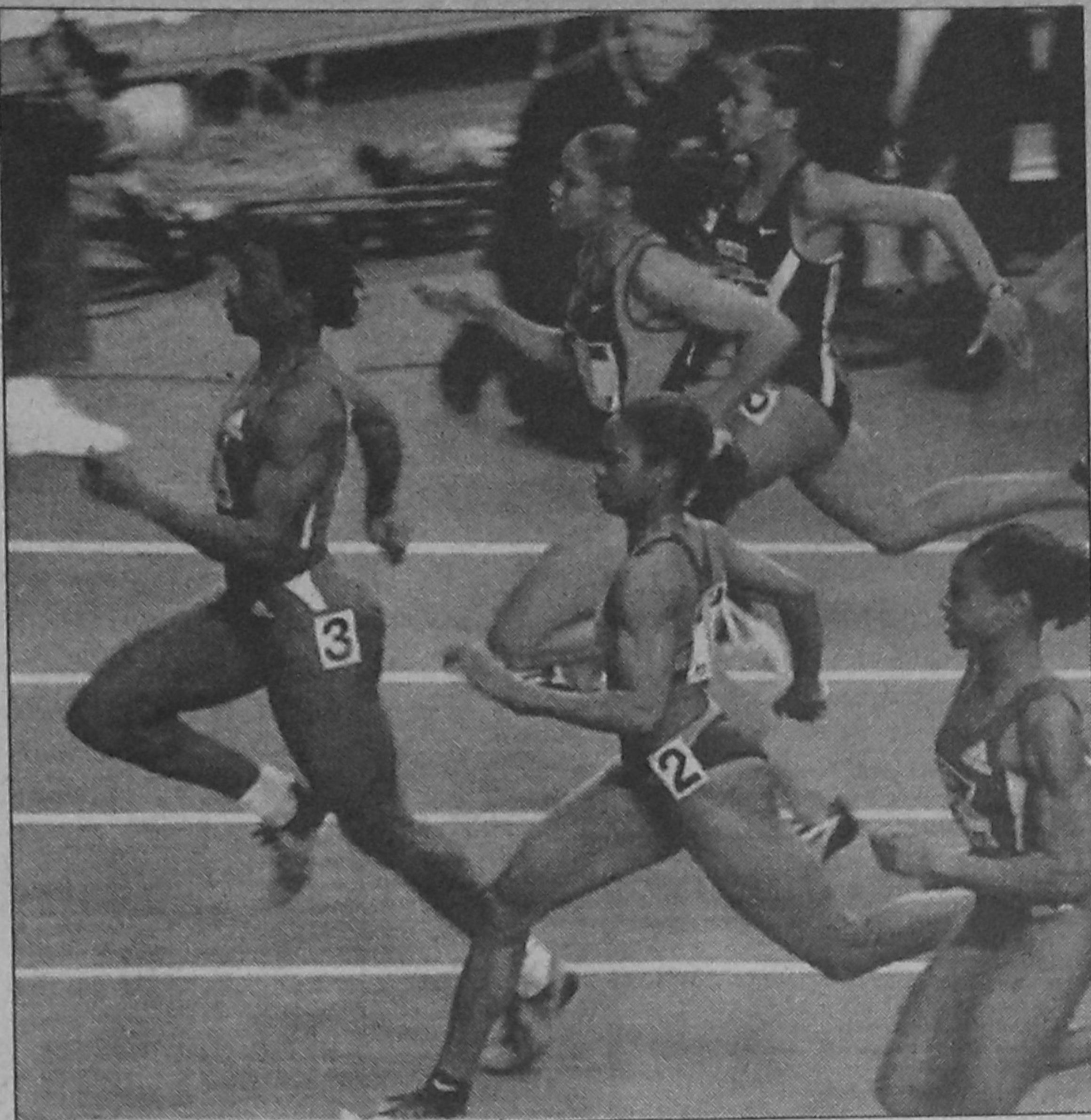
Di Stefano, signed by Real Madrid in 1954 after a tug-of-war with Barcelona, helped the Spanish club to five European Cup triumphs.

He also played 31 times for Spain, scoring 23 goals, making him the second highest scorer in the history of the Spanish national team.

Real Madrid also tried to sign Kubala following his arrival in Spain with a Hungarian selection in 1950. But they were beaten in the race to his signature by Barcelona, where he became a folk hero to the Catalans.

Kubala helped Barcelona to four league titles, scored 11 goals in 19 internationals matches for Spain and was recently voted by Barca fans as the greatest player in the club's 100-year history.

Former tennis star Manuel Santana, winner of the men's singles at Wimbledon in 1966, and basketball coach Antonio Diaz Miguel have also been nominated for the awards — the highest in the gift of the Spanish government — which will be presented on February 9.

Davis Cup roundup



LONDON, Feb 5: Andre Agassi gave the Americans the lead but Zimbabwe hit back to tie the match at 1-1 on the opening day of their Davis Cup match on Friday and has a great chance of an achieving an upset victory over John McEnroe's team, reports AP.

In other World Group matches, Spain moved smoothly to a 2-0 lead over Italy. Russia was 2-0 ahead against Belgium. Slovakia led Austria 2-0 and Germany and the Netherlands were tied at 1-1. In matches continuing later Friday, Switzerland and Australia ended the day with a 1-1 tie, the Czech Republic and Britain tied 1-1, and Brazil took a 2-0 lead over France.

USA-ZIMBABWE
After Agassi, the world's top ranked player and newly crowned Australian Open finalist, had downed Wayne Black 7-5, 6-3, 7-5, Black's brother Byron squared the match by scoring a 7-6, 6-3, 6-1, over Chris Woodruff on an indoor hard court in Harare.

Woodruff wouldn't have been on the team if either six-time Wimbledon champion Pete Sampras or Todd Martin had been available. Both pulled out a week ago, citing injury or illness.

If the Zimbabwean doubles pairing of Wayne Black and Kevin Ullyett can beat an untied US doubles pairing of Rick Leach and Alex O'Brien on Saturday, the host will be in a strong position to clinch a victory even before Agassi faces Byron Black in the final match on Sunday.

Playing at near 5,000 feet (1,500-metre) altitude and in McEnroe's first match as captain, Agassi admitted he was not totally used to playing in such conditions.

But he had few problems against Black to give the Americans a 1-0 lead and was even helped by an incorrect line call that gave him a break for 6-5 in the third.

If Sampras or Martin had been on the US team, Byron Black would have found it far tougher. But Davis Cup rookie Woodruff was no match for the Zimbabwean No. 1 once he has lost the first set tiebreak.

AUSTRALIA-SWITZERLAND
In Zurich, underdogs Switzerland staged a spirited performance against defending Davis Cup champions Australia, ending the day with a 1-1 tie.

Australia's Lleyton Hewitt overcame a slow start to defeat a tenacious but scrappy Georg Basel 4-6, 6-3, 6-2, 6-4.

But Switzerland's Roger Federer pulled off one of his best career victories with an unexpected 6-7, 6-4, 6-3, 6-1, 7-5, 6-3 in more than four hours to give Britain an early lead on an indoor clay court in Ostrava.

CZECH REPUBLIC-BRITAIN
In Ostrava, Czech Republic, Britain Tim Henman defeated Slava Dosedel 6-7, 5-7, 6-1, 7-5, 6-3 in more than four hours to give Britain an early lead on an indoor clay court in Ostrava.

But Jiri Novak outplayed Jamie Delgado 6-4, 7-5, 6-3 in a later match Friday giving the Czech Republic a 1-1 split of the opening singles against Britain.

BRAZIL-FRANCE
In Florianopolis, Fernando Meligeni beat Cedric Pioline 7-

5, 5-7, 4-6, 6-1, 6-4 and Gustavo Kuerten easily defeated Jerome Golmard 6-3, 3-6, 6-3, 6-2 to give Brazil a 2-0 lead against France.

SPAIN-ITALY
In Murcia, Spain ended the day with a 2-0 lead over Italy. Albert Costa routed Davide Sanguinetti 6-4, 6-4, 6-2, and then Alex Corretja dropped the first set before yielding only three more games to score a 1-6, 6-1, 6-1, 6-1 victory over Andrea Gaudenzi.

On Saturday, Corretja and Joan Balcells can clinch a place in the quarter final with a doubles victory over Gaudenzi and Diego Nargis.

GERMANY-NETHERLANDS
After Tommy Haas had given Germany the lead in Leipzig by coming from behind to beat John van Lottum 4-6, 7-6, 6-3, 6-2, the Germans appeared well set to go 2-0 ahead when Rainer Schuettler led Sjeng Schalken by a set and 6-5.

But the Dutchman saved eight set points to turn the match around, he won the second set tiebreak and surrendered only two more games to win 3-6, 7-6 (2), 6-1, 6-0.

RUSSIA-BELGIUM
In Moscow, Yevgeny Kafelnikov stumbled in the first set before overpowering Filip Dewulf 6-7, 6-4, 7-5, 6-2, when Marat Safin made it 2-0 by beating Christophe Rochus 7-5, 3-6, 6-2, 6-4.

SLOVAKIA-AUSTRIA
At Bratislava, the experienced Slovak pair of Karol Kucera and Dominik Hrbaty didn't drop a set between them.

After Kucera had beaten Markus Hippel 6-2, 6-3, 6-3, Hrbaty overpowered Stefan Koubek 6-4, 6-4, 6-4.

Veterans shine at Millrose

NEW YORK, Feb 5: Maturity triumphed over youth at New York's Madison Square Garden on Friday as Johnny Gray, Joetta Clark Diggs and Regina Jacobs, all on the far side of 35, won their track events at the 93rd Millrose Games, reports Reuters.

Gray, age 39, opened a 10-metre lead in the first half of the men's 800 and won for the fourth time at Millrose, in 1 minute 49.88 seconds, well ahead of Jeff Kuzma's 1:51.10.

Gray's first Millrose victory was in 1986. He insisted: "My only symptom of old age is that I'm reminded of it constantly. I feel as good as I did at 19 or 29. Only thing is, now I have the experience."

Thirty-seven-year-old Joetta Clark Diggs, who first won at Millrose at 14, won her seventh women's 800 in 2:04.79, leading most of the way to barely hold off New Zealand's Toni Hodgkinson (2:04.84) and her 22-year-old sister Hazel Clark (2:04.92).

Jacobs, 36, trounced the field in the women's mile by half a lap with a 4:24.04, 14 seconds ahead of Cheri Kenah's 4:38.15. Jacobs declared: "From the mid 30s to 40, a runner in the middle distance races is in her prime." The key, she said, is to stay interested and emotionally up.

Ireland's Mark Carroll blazed past his Wanamaker Mile competitors with two laps left to triumph in 3:58.19. Countryman James Nolan was second in 4:00.06.

Mark Everett won the men's 500 in 1:02.59, his tenth Millrose victory at various distances.

In an excruciatingly close 3,000 metres duel, US champion Adam Goucher ran a stride ahead of Paul Biotok until the Kenyan slipped by in the last 20 metres to win in 7:48.89. Goucher was .14 seconds behind.

CAF chief's plea to rival 2006 bidders

DUBAI, Feb 5: African Football Confederation (CAF) president Issa Hayatou warned Saturday that Africa's chance of hosting the 2006 World Cup could be ruined if South Africa and Morocco persist in putting up rival bids, reports AFP.

In an interview in the Dubai daily emirati al-Itihad newspaper, Hayatou said: "If the two countries don't reach agreement and refuse to coordinate (their position) it will be catastrophic for the dreams of every African, and we will present the competition to Europe."

"For the first time the occasion is right for Africa to host the football World Cup (in 2006). But it might be that the chance is missed if Morocco and South Africa continue to present their separate bids," the 53-year-old CAF chief added.

It's imperative that Morocco and South Africa reach agreement, before it's too late," he insisted.

Once again Hayatou would not be drawn on siding with either country.

The 2006 decision will be taken by FIFA's 24-strong executive committee, which includes Hayatou, in Zurich next July and pits the two African countries against England, Germany and Brazil.

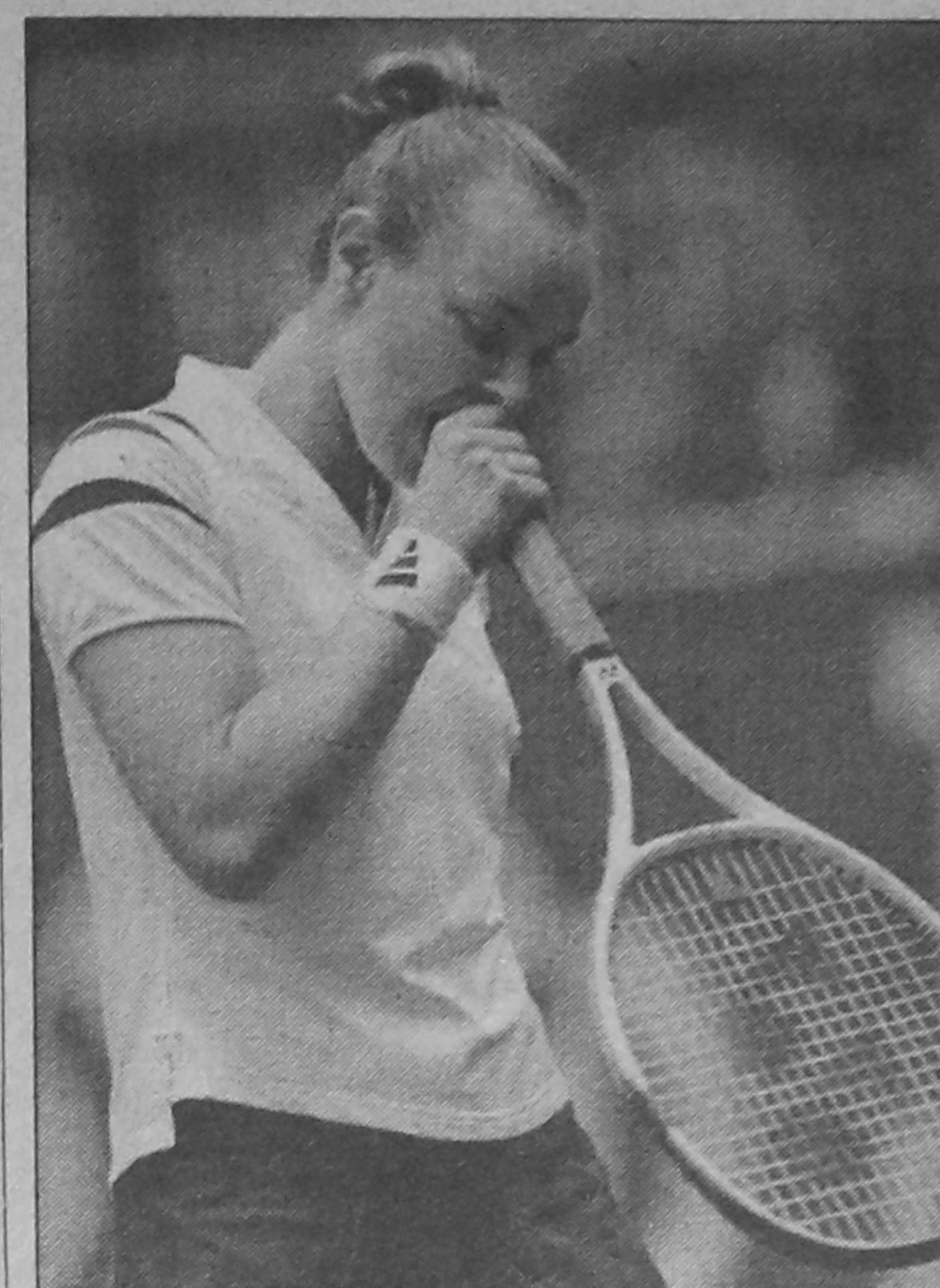

Hingis also had to save two break points in the following game, but used her accurate strokes to keep the American to the baseline before hitting an ace to win the tie-breaker 7-2.

After losing a service game for the first time to go 1-2 down in the second set, Rubin fired a couple of good winners to break back and tie it at 2-2.

But Hingis started to serve better afterwards and began charging to the net, scoring another break to go up 4-3 before serving out for the 84-minute match with a flawless love game.

"Basically I was more like trying to hold my serve in the first set. I was up 40-15 at one time and I couldn't break that, and she was up the other way 40-15 and I was able to hold the game," said Hingis.

"The past few matches (against Rubin) have been quite easy, so I was confident going into today's match."

Hingis, who lost to Rubin at Indian Wells last season, chalked up her win-loss record against the American to five wins and two defeats.

Rubin said: "Going out to the match, I wanted to be aggressive and I felt I did that very well. I was successful most of the time. It came down to a few points in some tight games I've missed, so it's disappointing."

Meanwhile, by reaching the final Testud secured a top 10 ranking for the first time.

The French sixth seed also earned her first place in the final of a 1.08-million-dollar Tier One tournament, the highest-level event outside the four Grand Slams and the year-ending championships.

"I'm very happy to be finally in the top 10," said the 27-year-old Frenchwoman, whose previous best ranking was 11th in 1998 and 1999.

"Because I had many opportunities last year and the year before and I had injuries and I couldn't make it. It was one of my goals this year to be in the top 10."

Testud has won a 163,000-dollar event at Palermo, Italy, in 1997, and a 450,000-dollar event at Filderstadt, Germany, when she defeated Lindsay Davenport in the final in October last year.
