Introduction of the muchawaited mobile and cellular phones under the Telephone and Telegraph Board (T&T) is only a matter of time, reports

Home. Post and Telecommunications Minister Mohammad Nasim disclosed this at the fourth national conference of Bangladesh Telecommunication Sramik Karmachari Parishad (BTSKP) at the Telephone Bhaban yesterday.

"We are looking for the fund. Inshallah, the mobile facilities in T&T will be introduced in Bangladesh." he said without elaborating while speaking at the conference.

Nasim said that T&T is still a profitable concern of the government. So there is no reason for its privatisation.

Teachers should give emphasis on qualitative education'






