

WELLINGTON, Feb 9: Experienced swing bowler Simon Doull has been recalled by New Zealand after a lengthy absence through injury, reports Reuters.

He was included today in a 12-man squad for the first two one-day matches of a six-match series against Australia start-

ing in Wellington next week. Doull injured his right knee during the tour of England last July and subsequently under-

The century stand between the duo however upstaged yet another impressive performance by Rafique, who followed up his first innings haul of five wickets with three more in the second. The versatile leftarm spinner, in his marathon spell of 24 overs, gave away only 40 runs.

Pakistan coach Intikhab Alam said he had no clue whatsoever who is going to be the captain or the team. "I have neither been consulted nor did I attend the chairman's briefing to the advisory panel," he said from Lahore. As things stand at present.
