Cricket goes indoors!

SINGAPORE, Feb 10: World cricket chiefs approved a request by the Australian Cricket Board for official one-day internationals to be played indoors, reports Reuters.

The decision, taken at the International Cricket Council (ICC) two-day meeting that ended on Thursday, was prompted by Australia's planned three-match series against South Africa at Melbourne's new Colonial Stadium in mid-August.

ICC chief executive David Richards said: "The only doubt raised (in the meeting) was what happens if the ball hits the roof.

We then decided to recommend to the Australian board that the ball be declared a dead ball and bowled again in case the 38-metre ceiling is indeed

The ICC has also approved an application by New Zealand to organise indoor cricket in their next season.

A cricket week from April 2-9 organised by the ICC to promote global interest in the game is to feature events in Zimbabwe as well as Bangladesh.

ICC president Jagmohan Dalmiya said a tournament for emerging cricketing nations would be held in Harare during the week. Denmark, the Netherlands, Scotland, Ireland and Zimbabwe would be among the teams taking part.

The highlight of the week in Dhaka is a match between Asia and the Rest of World on April




