New trade round still far off

Good feeling at Bangkok may die at negotiating table

BANGKOK, Feb 20: Developed and developing countries agreed this weekend that inter- . movement towards fresh free national trade and global economic integration could play a vital part in building a better and safer world for rich and poor, reports Reuters.

But although hailed as a "healing process" after months of North-South scrapping, an eight-day, conference of the United Nations trade and development agency UNCTAD seemed to have done little to bring agreement closer on launching a new trade round.

The atmosphere has certainly been much improved here in Bangkok," said Morocco's ambassador to the World Trade Organisation (WTO), Nacer Ben Jalloun, who has emerged as a key figure in North-South discussions at the Geneva-based

A senior WTO official said Director-General Mike Moore who held one-on-one talks with many trade ministers from poorer countries in Bangkok appeared to have succeeded in poverty. convincing them that he was sincere in his declared commitment to help them:

"It's been an uphill struggle, but it's coming through," the official told the agency.

A bruising nine-month battle leading to Moore's appointment for a three-year term from last September had left a legacy of anger among many developing countries and suspicion that the former New Zealand prime minister was a US placeman.

But when the UN Conference on Trade and Development ended Saturday, rich countries showed reluctance to break any specific new ground to push the world trading system forward as a whole, much less find a new role for developing countries

Rubens Ricupero, the secre-tary-general of UNCTAD, billed the meeting as part of the "healing process" following the collapse of the World Trade Organization's summit in Seattle into street protests and acribeen conspicuous by their absence in Bangkok.

In fact, the chief trade regotiators for the United States. Japan and the European Union met Friday in Washington about the need for a new WTO round, a symbolic statement about where the real power in trade

The European Union says it is a friend of the poor. It went to Seattle claiming it was looking for a "Development Round" of trade talks.

Yet the EU came into conflict with developing countries over. its agricultural subsidy programme and its insistence that issues such as labour rights and the environment should be considered. Developing nations view this as a deliberate move to make their goods more ex-

> est countries. UNCTAD, which promotes trade as a tool to enrich poor countries, may have restored a degree of hope to developing nations that their concerns are being taken seriously.

But in the end, the conference can do nothing directly to influence the World Trade Organisation or to put pressure on individual countries.

The WTO certainly isn't making great progress on its own. It agreed this month to start negotiations on freeing the markets for agriculture and services, but members agreed to do that when the organisation was founded in 1994.

The negotiations themselves won't really get going for years, and the method of negotiating is still to be decided.

China, EU start crucial WTO talks today

BEIJING, Feb 20: With time ticking away to get China into the World Trade Organisation this year, EU officials were due in Beijing today for what they hope will be the final push to reach a market-opening deal. reports Reuters.

The EU is the most important WTO member yet to conclude a trade accord with China after Beijing reached agreement with the United States last

November Both sides have raised hopes of a breakthrough in the Beijing talks that start on Monday.

Premier Zhu Rongji told visiting WTO chief Mike Moore last week he hoped a deal would emerge from the Beijing talks. and EU Trade Commissioner Passcal Lamy has said that if all goes well in the first two or three days he would be ready to jump on a plane to Beijing.

China must reach agreements with all WTO members before it can join the body that sets rules for global trade.



Malaysia may stick to original budget plan

KUALA LUMPUR, Feb 20: Malaysia will present a fresh budget for 2000 this week but most analysts expect Finance Minister Daim Zainuddin to stick to his promise of springing no surprises and presenting a carbon copy of the old one, reports Reuter.

Lim Kit Siang, leader of the opposition Democratic Action Party (DAP), urged Daim not to parrot the old 2000 budget on February 25.

The original budget unveiled in parliament in October fell in abeyance as it could not be approved by parliament which was dissolved to pave way for snap polls in November.

"I think Daim will stick to what he has said," said an economist with a local investment firm. "He has to fulfil the promises made in the budget before the elections.

Earlier this month, Daim said the new budget would contain no changes or surprises. Daim had proposed, in the

old budget, to cut personal income tax by one percentage point across the board and unveiled plans to pour five billion ringgit into infrastructure sec-

In the pre-election budget the government also doled out a generous hike in salaries and Bonus to government employ-

"The finance ministry must not been seen as slothful and intellectually irresponsible in refusing to present an updated version of budget 2000 in parliament on February 25 which takes into account of developments in the past four months, Lim said.

He said the nation was entitled to know about the new expenditure committed by the government in the last four months, especially after the new cabinet was formed in De-

In December the nation's parliament approved a stop-gap budget of 30.7 billion ringgit to run the country until the full 2000 budget is presented.

Most analysts backed Daim's view and said there was no radical change in the economic climate which warranted any significant policy shift.

"There has not been much of a change in the situation on the ground. So, I think he can keep the same budget," said Nizam Idris, an analyst at IDEAglobal.

But some analysts said the budget must reflect government's long-term economic policy framework, including its updated views on controversial capital controls and reform programme.

Malaysia fixed the exchange rate as part of a package of currency controls to steam the outflow of capital and stabilise the economy in the midst of Asia's financial crisis. Analysts say ligher infla-

tion and an increased inflow of portfolio funds this year could put upward pressure on the ringgit and force authorities to adjust the peg.

SIDA to provide Tk 15m to local NGO

Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA) will provide 2.5 million SEK, equivalent to Tk 15 million, to a local NGO for its poverty alleviation programme, reports UNB.
