They also organized a cultural function in their respective institutions.



# Fund shortage hampers work on Gopalganj District Jail

GOPALGANJ, Feb 20: Construction work on Gopalganj District Jail remained incomplete even after five years of the time schedule.

Work on the perimeter wall and earth filling work inside the boundary was going on till fining of this report. Inmates staying in the exist-

ing sub-jail were facing various problems for a long time. Now they live in congested rooms. Accommodation capacity of

the sub-jail was about 38, out of them 36 were male and the remaining two were female prisoners. But sometimes the number of prisoners became much higher. As a result the prisoners' woes multiplied. Jail superintendent, doctor,

pharmacist and jail subeder were suffering a lot due to shortage of space. There were no offices or any residential

quarter for them. The subjailor was performing his duties in a tinshed. Moreover, the main gate and passage were very narrow. No sufficient space was available between the main gate and the security gate. There was no prisoner van at the sub-jail.

There was no scope of extension of the sub-jail in the present place. All the available spaces around the jail were already occupied for government quarters and officers. So renovation of Goplaganj Sub-Jail into a district jail was not pos-

The sufferings of inmates of Gopalganj Sub-Jail worsened during the rainy season. After a heavy shower, water got accumulated in the jail compound and remained stagnant for a long time. Very often rain and flood water entered into the

Department (PWD) official records, the sub-jail was first constructed in 1921, on one acre of land with only two wards. Then the population of the area was negligible. Now the population of the district was over 15

Due to space problems handicrafts or other work programmes could not be introduced for the prisoners of rigorous imprisonment. On different occasions the people of Gopalganj demanded shifting of the sub-jail and its upgradation into a district jail.

While talking to the exceutive engineer of Public Works Department (PWD), Golpalganj, he told The Daily Star correspondent that Gplaganj District Jail started functioning five

years ago (1994-95). But work on the district jail was delayed due to want of fund. He further said that the work would not be completed as per the time schedule.

According to official sources, PWD took posses ion of six acres of land in 1993. A site was selected at Gosherchar in Gopalganj Municipality area for construction of Gopalganj District Jail.

They further said, out of the total amount of the project --Taka 739.91 crore, an amount of Taka 161 crore was spent. But at present there was no fund for continuation of the project work.

The Executive Engineer of PWD. Gopalgan; urged the higher authorities to take necessary steps for fund for its proper implementation.

According to an estimate, there are over 15,000 fishermen in the district. Gone are the days when the fishermen would not have to worry for their living. Now they can hardly man-

age three meals a day. Meanwhile, many of the fishermen have given up their ancestral profession in search of new life in agriculture or other professions.

Experts attribute the rapid fall in fish production in the hilly countryside to siltation of water bodies like canals and rivers, and indiscriminate catching of fish fry.

They said once the water bodies would be leased out to genuine fishermen, but now non-professionals, who are remained vacant.

BARISAL, Feb 20: At least 20 people, including a woman, were injured in a violent clash between rival factions of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) at Kalkini on Friday, reports

Residents and police said the clash erupted between the factions of BCL — one led by local unit president Sabuj Hawlader and another by vice president Masud Rana alias Dulal — at Kalkini Bazaar at about 11 am after a hot exchange of words, They exchanged 16 rounds of gun shot, series of bombs exploded. 13 shops ransacked and robbed during the 2-hour clash leaving at least 20 people injured. Of them, conditions of Kamal, 22. Belal 28, Mohammad Ali, 40, Salma, 22, Zahir, 20, Akbar, 23. Habib. 38, and Babu, 27, were stated to be critical. Kalkini police admitted the clash between rival groups of BCL. But no arrest was made till Saturday evening.

#### BCL leader arrested
