RAWALPINDI, Pakistan, Feb 22: Sri Lanka made 162-5 as bad weather marred the first day of the three-day tour match against a Pakistan Cricket Board President's XI at Rawalpindi on Monday, reports AFP.

The visitors are using the match as preparation for their Test series against Pakistan, which starts February 26.

Overnight rain and later bad light restricted play to just 41 overs. Only captain Sanath Jayasuriya put on a solid performance with a gritty 60.

Batting by choice Sri Lanka lost opener Russel Arnold (11). Tillekeratne Dilshan (5) and Aravinda de Silva (1) at a total of just 48.

But, for the local cricketers the rule is very strict and precise-- they must complete the registration during the inter-club players' transfer.
