



# Current political instability a threat to democracy

Speakers at discussion meet say

Speakers at a discussion meeting on "Democratisation in South Asia and Bangladesh Perspectives" in the city yesterday blamed politicians and bureaucrats for the current political instability in the country.

The democratic process will be endangered if it continues, they said and stressed the need for a consensus among political parties to solve the political problems in a peaceful manner.

The discussion was organised on the occasion of the 8th National Convention of Bangladesh Political Science Association, held at a city hotel. Former vice-chancellor of Dhaka University Prof. Emajuddin Ahmed was in the chair. Former vice-chancellor of

Chittagong University Prof. I R Chowdhury was the chief guest while Moudud Ahmed a central leader of opposition BNP was the special guest. Prof. Ataur Rahman pre-

sented the keynote paper on the topic. Abu Hena MP, Prof. Shamsur Rahman, Prof. Saifullah Bhuiyan, Prof. Dil Ara/ said. Chowdhury, Shah Abdul Hannan, Prof. Mahbub Ullah, Prof. Tajul Islam Hashemi Dr Jaglul Haider and Dr Hassan Mohammad took part in the discussion

Dr Ataur Rahman said that the country got two chances one in 1990 and the other 1996 - to give democracy a chance to flourish. But the chances were due to the narrow interests and intolerance of politicians.

The main reason is the mistrust and animosity among the political forces. Ineffective parliament and lack of consensus are the other reasons, he added.

The ruling party is "less tolerant and less accommodative" while opposition BNP is resorting to "illogical" hartals, he The Awami League govern-

ment is politicising the army. police and bureaucrats for stay-Violence and mussel power in politics should be eliminated

for the sake of the country and its economy," Dr Ataur added. It is the responsibility of political parties to ensure an effective parliament. "But our politicians have failed to abide by democratic norms.
