Japan resumes food aid

#### Pollution kills tons of fish in Brazil

RIO DE JANEIRO, Mar 7: leaking sewer line pumped contaminated waste from homes and businesses into a popular Rio lagoon, killing more than 30 tons of fish, officials said, reports AP.

The horrible smell arising from the rotting fish drove people away from the park around the Rodrigo de Freitas lagoon. People usually flock to the lagoon to escape the central city, strolling the waterside and stopping at cafes for snacks and refreshments.

Monday evening, it was deserted except for a few people, mostly park attendants.

The fish began dying on Sunday because of a leak in the sewer system that passes along the bottom of the lagoon on its way to the sea, said Mario Moscatelli, a biologist and the lagoon's natural resources manager.

#### US, N Korea resume talks

NEW YORK CITY, Mar 7: The United States and North Korea were to resume talks here today to finalise the details of a landmark visit to the United States by a top Pyongyang official, a State Department official said, reports AFP.

Delegations from both sides, led by US special envoy to the Korean talks Charles Kartman and his counterpart, North Korean Vice Foreign Minister Kim Gye-Gwan, first were to meet informally, the official said Monday.

"We will strive to arrive at a consensus in the interest of the people and the country," the party's national secretary Ashwani Kumar told AFP.

"This problem will be thrashed out after we sit together and discuss it ... This issue is not a threat to our ruling coalition," Kumar asserted. The BJP on its own has 182

members in the 545-seat parliament while its allies, numbering around 16, occupy 114 seats in the federal legislature. Kumar said Prime Minister Vajpayee had met the leaders of his coalition partners and set

#### Albright would be 'excellent' successor: Czech President

HODONIN, Czech Republic, Mar 7: President Vaclav Have said on Monday he thought it would be "excellent" if Czechborn US Secretary of State Madeleine Albright were to succeed him in 2003, reports

Havel revived an idea he first floated in September 1998 - and which was taken up by a US news magazine last month - during brief remarks to Czech television after the old friends toured a museum.
