Fleming out of first Test

HAMILTON, New Zealand, Mar 7 (AP) - Australia's Dan Fleming was ruled out of the first Test against New Zealand in Auckland with a knee problem here Tuesday.

The paceman said rest was the best medicine for the chronic tendonitis in his left knee which forced him to hobble off during Australia's tour match against Northern Districts.

His departure cleared the only selection cloud before Saturday's Test, with Glenn McGrath and Brett Lee now certain to share the new ball before spinners Shane Warne and Colin Miller are let loose on the turning Eden Park wicket.

Fleming first noticed the problem in Zimbabwe last October but he still managed to take 30 wickets in six home Test wins before he was able to nurse the knee through the less-demanding one-day circuit.

The problem flared again last week and continued through the Northern Districts match which picked up when Adam Gilchrist and Michael Slater were dismissed in the final hour of the third day.

New Zealand selectors have stuck with a tried combination for the first Test, giving out-of-form opener Craig Spearman another chance.

Wicketkeeper Adam Parore survived calls for his sacking while Doull was included, despite limited cricket this season.

Miller, McGrath slice thru N Dists

HAMILTON, New Zealand, Mar 7: Tight bowling from Colin Miller and Glenn McGrath helped Australia dismiss New Zealand's Northern Districts for 280 in the second innings on Day Three of their four-day match in Hamilton today, reports Reuters.

But chasing 198 for victory, Australia lost the two early wickets of Michael Slater for nine and Adam Gilchrist for 17 to be 55 for two at stumps, needing another 143 runs with eight wickets in hand.

Earlier, Miller took three for 68 off 26 overs with his ability to turn the ball and McGrath picked up three for 37 off 12 with his trademark consistency and accuracy to restrict Northern Districts in good batting conditions. Brett Lee and Matthew Hayden took two wickets apiece.

Zim-Board XI match drawn

ST GEORGE'S, Grenada, Mar 7 (Reuters/AP) - Zimbabwe ended a satisfying tour opener yesterday after dominating their drawn three-day game against a West Indies Board XI at the Queen's Park Stadium.

After securing a commanding 230-run first innings advantage, Zimbabwe reached 24 without loss in their second innings when the game was called off at the start of the mandatory 15 overs.

With a result out of the question after rain hit the second day, Zimbabwe dismissed the Board XI for 198 with occasional left-arm spinner Grant Flower returning the best figures of three for 15 from 11 overs.

Revenge on Real's mind

PARIS, March 7: The omens may not be encouraging but seven-time holders Real Madrid are hoping to exact sweet revenge on Bayern Munich when they meet in the Champions League Wednesday, reports AFP.

This is the return leg in the two sides' Group C second phase games, the first leg last Tuesday having fallen to Bayern 4-2 at Real's Santiago-Bernabeu stronghold.

In Wednesday's other Group C clash Norwegian side Rosenborg host Dynamo Kyiv, bidding to overturn a 2-1 defeat in the Ukraine.

In Group D Italian giants Lazio travel to Feyenoord in defeat mood despite their shock 2-1 defeat by the Dutch side, while Chelsea host Marseille, the French club running out 1-0 winners in round one.

Given their appalling record against German sides Real Madrid must take heart from Henry Ford's assertion that "history is bunk".

But it ain't going to be easy for the rejuvenated Spanish capital outfit.

Real, now flying high in the Spanish league after a faltering start, have never won an away fixture against a German side, and until last Tuesday at any rate, had never lost to one at home.

Rested Saturday keeper Oliver Kahn is back in goal but Bayern are still without midfielder Thomas Strunz, Jens Jeremies and defender Markus Babel, victim of a left thigh injury.

Real coach Vicente Del Bosque for his part must inject strength into his midfield which is lacking French World Cup winner Christian Karembeu, leaving him with no option but to pull back one of his three strikers, perhaps Nicolas Anelka.

Anelka now appears to be more at ease with the Spanish capital side, telling fans who clicked on to his personal internet site: "I feel more and more at ease here - for me it's the greatest club in the world."

Dynamo Kyiv's coach Valery Lobanovsky meanwhile is expecting a rocky reception at Rosenborg.

"Rosenborg played very well in the second half in Kiev. I expect they'll be much stronger at home and will be looking to win," he forecasts.

Lobanovsky sees defence as being a key area for both sides. "I think we have similar styles, we both prefer to play on the counter attack so we've got to be extremely careful in defence."

Dynamo are still without Vladislav Vashchuk, Artym Yashkin and Vitaly Kosovsky but on the plus side international midfielders Sergei Konovalov and Yuri Dmitriyev are expected to play.

With one point from three games and anchored at the bottom of the group Rosenborg can hardly be bubbling with optimism.

Queen honours England's heroes of 1966

LONDON, March 7: The forgotten heroes of the 1966 World Cup winning team spoke on Tuesday of their delight at receiving MBE medals from Queen Elizabeth, reports AFP.

More than 30 years after helping England beat West Germany 4-2 in the final at Wembley, Alan Ball, George Cohen, Roger Hunt, Nobby Stiles and Ray Wilson were honoured at an investiture at Buckingham Palace.

Until the New Year's Honours List they were the only players in the team not to have received recognition for English football's finest hour, with hat-trick star Geoff Hurst and Bobby Charlton both knighted and captain Bobby Moore, Martin Peters, Jack Charlton and Gordon Banks also honoured.

Cohen, who is now a property developer, said it was a very special day for all five of them.

"It has been a long time coming but it is here now and we are all very happy," he said before walking to the Palace for the ceremony.

"It is nice to see each other - we haven't seen each other for a while. Our families are very excited. It means that we are the most honoured squad in British sporting history."

Alan Ball added: "It is a very proud day for us all. The day has finally arrived, which is nice, but this is something which is most important for our families."

They were being joined by their former team-mates for the investiture in the Palace ballroom.

World champs to meet SA in October

JOHANNESBURG, Mar 7: South Africa will host World Cup holders France in a friendly on October 7 or 8 at an undisclosed venue, the national football association said in a statement, reports AFP.

It will be the third meeting between the countries with France winning a friendly 2-1 in Lens three years ago and a 1998 World Cup group match 3-0 in Marseille.

Mental strength, key for Juve

TURIN, Italy, March 7: Coach Carlo Ancelotti reckons that Juventus' mental strength - rather than their footballing skills - will be the key to winning the Italian league this season, reports AFP.

Juventus may be four points ahead of Lazio at the top of the Serie A but their football hasn't exactly set Italy alight.

Their leadership has a lot to do with seven 1-0 wins, a defence that has conceded just 11 goals in 24 matches and a large dollop of determination.

Juventus have unwavering self-belief and the crucial ability to raise their game in big matches. In five games so far against title rivals (Lazio, AC Milan, Roma and Inter), Juve have won four and drawn one.

After watching their workmanlike 2-0 win over Bari at the weekend, Ancelotti admitted: "We do perhaps have less quality than other teams."

"But in terms of character, solidity and concentration, we lack nothing... and one of our best assets is our ability to turn a match around."

Sunday was Juventus' 41st match this season after starting out last summer in the Intertoto tournament and some wonder whether Juventus could now start to run out of steam.

But Ancelotti said: "I wouldn't say it's a question of tiredness, although at this stage the number of matches is beginning to weigh on all of us."

"At this level, what counts is the mental aspect of things - the ability to concentrate and the determination when you walk out onto the pitch."

Skipper Antonio Conte, who opened the scoring on Sunday, was on the same wavelength as the coach.

"We suffered in the second half," he said. "But with this mentality, we'll be able to win matches that are tougher than this one."

Not quite Beckenbauer but close

MUNICH, Mar 7 (Reuters) - By starting a new adventure in the United States, Lothar Matthaeus emulates the man he has always revered but never could quite match, Franz Beckenbauer.

No matter how hard he tries, Matthaeus can be regarded only as the greatest German player since the legendary libero, who also tried his luck in the United States by joining Cosmos in 1977.

While Beckenbauer moved to New York to play alongside fellow all-time greats Pele and Carlos Alberto, his confessed admirer will find himself in less glamorous company.

New York-New Jersey MetroStars, where the 38-year-old veteran will play after sporting the Bayern Munich shirt one last time on Wednesday, are not even front-runners in the US Major League and boast no top players.

After initially saying that he might stay a few years in America, Matthaeus, who has signed a one-year contract, sounded less certain about his long-term plans.

Perhaps afraid he might feel homesick, he said he could return to the Bundesliga after one season with MetroStars. He then said he was considering a lucrative offer from Dubai.

"Maybe I will stay longer in the United States, maybe I will do something totally different," he said. "Maybe Dubai. I have received a very interesting offer and former TSV 1860 Munich player Abedi Pele plays there."

Matthaeus was still a teenager when he made his German First Division debut for Borussia Moenchengladbach in 1979.

Five years later he moved to

Bayern. He left them in 1988 and headed for Italy but after a four-year spell with Inter Milan, he came back to the only German club tailored to his measurements.

First as a playmaker, then as a libero, but always in his cherished number 10 shirt, he helped the mighty Bavarian club to six league titles, two German Cups and the 1996 UEFA Cup.

"An important party of my life is coming to an end," he said ahead of his final appearance at Munich's Olympic stadium in Wednesday's Champions League match against Real Madrid.

"Perhaps there will be a few tears."

His finest hour came in 1990 when, wearing the captain's armband, he led Germany to victory at the World Cup in Italy.

Last month in Amsterdam he became the world's most capped player with his 144th outing for Germany in a 2-1 defeat by the Netherlands.

Then why was he never a German idol?

A fine player and a true fighter, he never captured the imagination like Beckenbauer, who invented the libero role, elegantly rapping the pitch with the ball seemingly glued to his feet.

While Beckenbauer lifted the European Cup three years in succession, from 1974 to 1976, Matthaeus was on the losing side in two finals, in 1987 and 1999.

"Kaiser Franz" was always an automatic choice for the Germany squad but Matthaeus was dropped from the 1996 European championship side and had to sit and watch while the Germans won the title in England.

Berti Vogts, then the head

coach, had decided to give the libero job to the younger libero Matthias Sammer and entrust the captaincy to a man Matthaeus could never get on with, that other German star of the past decade, Jurgen Klinsmann.

"If I regret anything, then it's the problems I had with Vogts and Klinsmann which made me miss Euro 1996," said Matthaeus, who eventually patched up his differences with Vogts and earned a recall for the 1998 World Cup finals in France.

Often perceived as somewhat arrogant, Matthaeus is few fans' favourite, even in Germany.

"I think that has changed a bit over the last few years," he said.

Indeed, he has mellowed, adopting a more relaxed attitude while showing that his unique footballing skills remained intact.

He still finds it difficult to be treated seriously off the pitch and lacks the charisma of Beckenbauer, who has won only a few more trophies but a lot more hearts.

"I deserve more respect," Matthaeus said recently, letting out his frustration.

The man they call "Der Ewige Lothar" (everlasting Lothar) has a lot to prove still but he can again turn to Beckenbauer for inspiration.

After a frustrating experience with Cosmos, Beckenbauer received a hero's welcome when he returned to Germany, signing with Hamburg SV in 1986.

He then took on coaching, helping Germany to their World Cup triumph in 1990, and remains the most respected personality in German soccer to this day.

There is hope for Matthaeus but he has a long way to go.

World Cup 2006

Fact-finders head for South Africa

JOHANNESBURG, Mar 7: A six-strong team from football governing body FIFA arrives here Thursday on the final inspection tour of nations bidding to host the 2006 World Cup, reports AFP.

American lawyer Alan Rothenberg heads a delegation including Zhang Jilong from China, Urs Kneubuhler from Switzerland, Richard Read from Australia, Yousef al-Serkal from the United Arab Emirates and Walter Sieber from Canada.

The FIFA team will visit stadiums in Bloemfontein, Cape Town, Durban, Johannes-

burg, Pretoria and Rustenberg and check infrastructure, transport, security and telecommunication facilities during a six-day tour.

"This visit is crucial to our chances," bid committee chief executive Danny Jordaan told national television Tuesday.

"This is an opportunity to prove what we have repeatedly said is correct."

Jordaan has claimed South Africa could stage the quadrennial, 32-nation tournament before 2006 given the vast number of international-class stadia available.

South Africa are competing against Brazil, England, Germany and Morocco for the right to host an event first held 70

years ago in Uruguay, but never staged in Africa.

Rothenberg, mastermind behind the highly successful 1994 World Cup in the United States, has labelled the German bid "outstanding", the English bid "excellent" and the Moroccan bid "professional and complete".

His team was less enthusiastic about Brazil, citing the poor condition of most stadiums, and the South Americans appear outsiders in an otherwise tight contest.

"I am quite at ease about the visit," Jordaan told a television discussion on the bid. "I believe we will receive an A-plus. The time has come for Africa to host the World Cup."
