Gangrape victim's body exhumed in Cox's Bazar

COX'S BAZAR, Mar 8: Police today exhumed the body of a 13-year-old girl who died nine days ago. She was gangraped by seven ruffians at Moheshkhali island here, reports UNB.

A group of terrorists picked up the orphan girl from her stepmother's house at Horiachara village on February 27 night and took her to a local hill where they raped her until she died, police said.

The culprits reportedly buried the girl at a local graveyard on the following day, bribed local influential and threatened others to hush up the matter. However, the news of the death of the minor girl spread in the area.

Police exhumed her body in presence of a magistrate and sent it to hospital morgue for autopsy.

Police earlier detained the girl's stepmother for not informing them about the kidnapping of the girl. She filed a case against seven terrorists, including one Jahangir, a notorious criminal of the area.

There was no more arrest till today. Police said the rapists were absconding.

C'nawabganj AL leader dead

Prof Jainal Abedin, an Awami League leader and former chairman of Nachol upazila of Chapainawabganj died of cardiac arrest at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital on Tuesday. He was 53, reports BSS.

He was buried at his village home at Mirzapur of Nachol on Tuesday.

Prof Abedin left behind his wife, four children and a host of relatives and admirers to mourn his death.

Japan hails Dhaka for CTBT ratification

The government of Japan yesterday hailed Bangladesh for ratifying the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty (CTBT). A Japanese Foreign Office statement said yesterday.

"Japanese government wholeheartedly welcome the decision made by Bangladesh to deposit the instrument of ratification of the CTBT with the UN Secretariat," the statement said.

It said: "The decision is very encouraging as a positive, far-reaching signal for global nuclear disarmament and nuclear non-proliferation."

The statement said to facilitate the early entry-into-force of the treaty, Japan has so far made approaches by dispatching high-level missions to the countries whose ratification are required but yet to ratify it.

Bangladesh on Tuesday ratified the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty and joined the global campaign for nuclear non-proliferation.

Expansion of industries stressed

State Minister for Information Professor Abu Sayeed yesterday laid emphasis on industrialisation and investment saying those were imperative for building a nation on a solid foundation and attain self-sufficiency, reports BSS.

"The industrial sector will face hard competition in the free-market economy. So it is necessary to expand industries and trade to sustain in a competitive market," he said while addressing a function to mark the publication of Bangladesh Investment and Trade Directory 1999-2000.

He said the government under the leadership of Sheikh Hasina has achieved great success for enhancing both local and foreign investment. But, the previous government was reluctant to increase investment, he regretted.

Death condoled

State Minister for Textiles AKM Zahangir Hossain condoled the death of Advocate Gazi Azhar Uddin, a social worker and former central member of Bangladesh Awami League, reports BSS.

Advocate Azhar died at his Patuakhali residence this morning due to old age complications.

In a message of condolence, Zahangir said with the death of Advocate Azhar, the nation has lost a committed politician and an experienced lawyer.

He conveyed sympathy to the members of the bereaved family and prayed for the eternal peace of the departed soul.

Terrorism can't be stamped out overnight: Nasim

Reaffirming the government's efforts to improve the country's law and order situation, Home Minister Mohammad Nasim said it's not possible to stamp out terrorism overnight, reports UNB.

"The government is relentlessly working to eliminate terrorism, but it cannot be done overnight," he said while addressing a conference of jail officials at his ministry's conference room yesterday.

The prison management of a country is deeply linked with its control over law and order, Nasim said adding that discipline could not yet be restored in many sectors, including jails, due to long absence of democratic practice in the country.

But, he said, the practice of democracy has started in the country and the condition in prisons will improve if the march forward of democracy can be continued.

Stressing the need for training for the jail officials, he assured them of increasing their facilities.

Home Secretary MM Reza and Inspector General (prison) Brigadier M Wallur Rahman were also present.

Japan to provide Tk 1.2 cr for NGO projects

The government of Japan will give grants amounting to US\$242.891 equivalent to about Taka 1.2 crore for the projects of three non-government organisations (NGOs), says a press release of Embassy of Japan yesterday.

"Japanese Ambassador in Dhaka Kazuyoshi Urabe yesterday signed grant contracts with representatives of the NGOs in a simple ceremony," the statement said.

Under the grants agreement three projects including Family Planning Association of Bangladesh (EPAB) will utilise US \$79,700 for constructing a family planning and maternal child health clinic. Association of Medical Doctors of Asia, Bangladesh (AMDA,B) will utilise grants amounting US \$81,981 for constructing an AMDA vocational training centre cum-flood shelter at Hosainid of Gazaria thana in Mounshiganj district and Comilla Atmanivedita Mahila Sangstha (CAMS) will have US \$81,210 for constructing a comprehensive community health care clinic in Comilla Sadar.

The government of Japan has been giving grant assistance to the grass roots projects through NGOs since 1989 and a total of 65 NGOs have already received financial assistance under this scheme, the release added.

The rally, held at TSC square, was presided over by Jote President Ramendu Majumder. Syed Hasan Imam, president of Dhaka University Teachers Association, Rim Aminur Rashid, Sharif Kabir, Nasiruddin Yusuf, Motiul Haq, Dewan Gaus Sultan, Sara Zaker, Afzal Hossain and Jote secretary Golam Qudus.

They demanded of the authority to cancel its decision of suspending the naming of the halls and bhabs of Shahajalal University. They also called upon the people to be united against all sorts of conspiracies by the vested quarters. Later they brought out a torch procession and paraded upto Jatiya Press Club.
